It was when I joined the Girts
Tomato Club. For one year work
on one tenth acre on which I
put 4 one horse loads of manure
on the 10 day of April I had
the manure hauled on and the
rows broke with a one horse
team to haul it took 10 hours
and a half to haul the manure
and break the rows. I sowed
my first seed March the 26
it took me one hour to fix my
bed and sow my seed. and
on the 8 day of April I saw
my first plants up. On the
19 day of May I sowed my
last seed it took me one
half hour and in a few days
or a week my bed was just
covered with plants. the 25
day of April I transplanted
my plants of the first sowing
it took me half an hour

on the 10 day I transplanted
my plants of the last sowing
it took me one half hour
on the 17 day of May I had
my 2 rows plowed with a
cultivator and harrowed it took
one hour and 25-Minuts. on
the 28 day of May I planted
my plants in my one tenth
of an acre it took 3 hours and
a half to set them out on
the 15 day of June I had my
plants plowed and I hrowed
them it took 2 hours on the
10 day of June I saw my first
bloom. on the 27 day of June
I saw my first green tomato
on the 3 day of June I had
my plants plowed and
I hrowed them again
on the 19 day of July
I saw the first ripe
tomato.

On the 18 of June I started
my tomatoes it took me one day
to staple them and tie
them up. of my one
tenth acre I canned 100.
cans and used \$1.50 worth
my sub.
