Have sold up to date, May 1st, 65,000 of the 70,000 #3 cans.

North Carolina is a canning state and the market was so glutted that it has required work to dispose of our large crop.

Cornell and Columbia Universities showed their interest by taking some of our product. The General Federation of Women's Clubs has also interested itself in our sales.
