
SCHOOL OF EDUCATION




JOHN W. SHIRLEY, *Dean*

Scholarship is encouraged at the Freshman level by selecting the two outstanding Freshmen from each department as Companions of St. Patrick.








All forestry professors, a few selected professors from allied departments, and all students registered in forestry, both graduate and undergraduate.


To strengthen the bond of friendship, Nu Chapter sponsors house parties, picnics, fellowship dinners, and the Annual Founders' Day Banquet.

BETA UPSILON CHAPTER

Five years after the Civil War, William Gregsby McCormick, former head of the McCormick-Deering Corporation, and four friends founded the first American chapter of Kappa Sigma. Kappa Sigma had its original founding at the University of Bologna in 1400 and soon spread to many of the larger universities of Continental Europe. Since its founding in America on December 10, 1869, at the University of Virginia, Kappa Sigma has expanded until now it has at least one chapter in every state in the union. There are over 100,000 living alumni of the 120 active chapters. Beta Upsilon was founded on the State College campus in 1902, and has initiated 390 men. The fraternity publishes the *Caduceus*, a magazine for its members, and the *Star and Crescent*, a secret publication. Easter of every year finds Kappa Sigma entertaining underprivileged children at an Easter egg hunt on Colonel Harrelson's lawn.



CHI CHAPTER

In 1906, four outstanding students at Miami University, Oxford, Ohio, founded the Phi Kappa Tau fraternity. The fraternity and its ideas were drawn up by Dwight I. Douglas, William H. Shideler, Taylor A. Borradaile, and Clinton D. Boyd. Phi Kappa Tau was founded to break up a monopoly on student elections which were held by fraternity unions. 
ALPHA EPSILON CHAPTER

Each year Pi Kappa Phi sponsors an annual interfraternity sing to promote cultural interest and competition among the fraternities at North Carolina State College.




BETA TAU CHAPTER


N. C. BETA CHAPTER


RHO CHAPTER

THE COACHING STAFF

Beattie Feathers assumed his duties as head football coach at State College in 1944 after serving a year as backfield mentor under Doc Newton. Beattie played his first football for Bristol, Virginia, High, where he made All-State four years and All-Southern two years. After playing for General Bob Neyland at Tennessee as an All-American tailback, he starred in professional ranks for seven years.

Walt Slater took over Babe Wood's job as backfield coach in 1948. Walt attended the University of Tennessee in 1942-43. Back from the war, he finished out his football with the Vols in 1946. One year of professional football preceded Slater's appearance on the campus of State College.

Charles Ramey, end coach, came from Ashland, Kentucky, where he was athletic director and head football coach. Coach Ramey gained national fame when his 1942 Ashland Tomcats won the state crown. That same year he was named "High School Coach of the Year."

Line Coach Al Rotella came to State straight from Tennessee. Al started his football career at Paterson, New Jersey, High. He continued it at Tennessee in 1941 and 1942 and then went to the Army. After the war, Coach Rotella returned to Tennessee and finished his schooling. He remained with the Vols in 1947 as assistant line coach and then came to State the following year.

THRILLER AT CHAPEL HILL


In the 1949 football season's opener, State dropped a 26-6 decision to the University of North Carolina Tar Heels. The two teams battled on even terms for three quarters before the Carolina lads could muster enough scoring strength to down the Pack.

All-American Charlie (Choo Choo) Justice proved to be the deciding factor in the game. Justice, bottled up by the powerful State line, had to take to the airways to carry his team to victory.

Coach Beattie Feathers' lads had three opportunities to score but could only capitalize on one of them. Midway of the third quarter, tailback Bill Thompson plunged over from the three yard line for the Big Red's first and only score.

On the opening kickoff, fullback Jim O'Rourke getting excellent blocking by his teammates, hauled the ball to the Carolina 29 yard line before being downed. Three plays later, Bill Thompson, on a running pass, hit end Tony Romanowsky on the Tar Heel 15 for a first down. However, after Thompson had carried to the two, the big Carolina line held and consequently took the ball over on downs.

State made its second bid in the closing minutes of the first half. Tailback Ed Mooney returned a Justice punt to the Tar Heel 41. The Pack's Ogden Smith and Dick Johnson highlighted a drive to the 36. At that point, Smith tossed a long aerial to end Roland Simon for a first down on the 15. Then sophomore Bob Branyan took another Smith heave for a first down on the five yard line. Again Smith passed, but the Tar Heels' Dick Bunting intercepted behind his goal line to end the threat.



On the next play, after faking a pass, T-Quarterback Smith carried to the seven. Fullback Paul Bruno hit the center and bulled down to the two. However, Smith fumbled and lost ten yards. Then with fourth and 13 to go, he passed to Steve Kossila in the end zone to register the touchdown.

DAME FORTUNE SMILES AT LAST




In the waning minutes of the first quarter, the Red and White hit pay dirt again as a result of a pass from Mooney to Thompson from the Wake 27.




It Was A Cold, Rough Afternoon





FRESHMAN FOOTBALL





BASKETBALL

Finishing his fourth year as head mentor of State College's original "flaming freshmen," Coach Everette Case produced this season the combination which he termed his most successful. Led by All-Americans, Captain Dick Dickey and Sam Ranzino, the 1950 Pack climaxed their campaign by taking third place in the NCAA tournament. This year's fourth straight Southern Conference championship team finished the season with a fifth place national ranking and a 27-6 record.



Not only did 1950 produce a top flight team, but also this season marked the first use of the huge William Neal Reynolds Coliseum, which has a seating capacity of 12,014. This mammoth arena, which measures 371 feet by 180 feet, recorded an attendance of 230,000 spectators for the home season. That mark set a new national attendance record for games played on a college campus.

In Dickey and Ranzino, State had two of the slickest forwards in the nation. They each were placed on five All-America teams. In addition they were first All-Southern and first NCAA District Three selections. Guard Vic Bubas and center Paul Horvath also were mythical-team members.

For Dick Dickey, the making of post-season mythical teams was nothing new. The strawberry blonde has been picked on them since 1947. He was first team All-America in 1948 and was honorable mention All-America last year. Dick has been All-Southern for four straight seasons and has been placed on numerous other "all" squads. However, this year, for the second time, he had to take second place honors to his running mate, Sam Ranzino, in the scoring department. Sam got 381 points to




Dickey's 355 last year. This year Ranzino joined the select "600" class with 624 tallies. Dickey got 460.

In marking up its 27-6 record for the year, the Wolfpack whipped such strong intersectional foes as San Francisco's 1949 NIT champs, fourth ranking Holy Cross, LIU, Michigan, Loyola of Los Angeles, Rhode Island State, and Louisville (two wins). Twelve victories were registered against Conference teams. Two losses, one at Duke and the other at William and Mary, marred the Pack's Conference record. In return engage-




ments with the Blue Devils, State won by 18 points. The Indians had been defeated in a previous game by 14 points.

Coach Case's lads participated in three tournaments during the season. The first annual Dixie Classic was inaugurated in the Coliseum during the Christmas holidays with the Big Four playing host to Rhode Island State, Georgia Tech, West Virginia, and Penn State. The locals downed Rhode Island State by an 81-64 count, Georgia Tech by 57-34, and Penn State by 50-40 to cop the tournament championship. The second tournament was the annual Southern Conference Tourney, which the Wolfpack won handily for the fourth consecutive season. Duke was defeated in the finals by a 23 point margin. The third and final tournament in which the Pack participated was the NCAA Tournament. In gaining their third place position, the State five outran Holy Cross, 87-74; lost to CCNY, the ultimate winner,



DICK DICKEY—6 ft. 1 in., Alexandria, Indiana—Received All-American mention his last three years. All-Southern four successive seasons. Dick scored 460 points this year. Scored 1644 points for four varsity seasons. Not only a great scorer, but also an excellent defensive player. Senior—completed eligibility.

SAM RANZINO—6 ft. 1 in., Gary, Indiana—Has paced Wolfpack in scoring last two years. Dropped in 624 markers this season for almost 19 points per game average. Last season scored 381. Good rebounder and excellent ball-handler. Made five All-America squads. Junior, one year eligibility left.

WARREN CARTIER—6 ft. 4 in., Green Bay, Wisconsin—Missed only one game in four years. One of Case's most valuable men, Cartier seldom got credit he deserved. Did just about anything on a basketball court and during his four years played center, guard, and forward. One of the Pack's best clutch men, came through in many a tight spot this year. Senior—finished eligibility.





78-73, in an exciting game that was nip and tuck until the final gun sounded; and were victorious in their final test over a slow, methodical Baylor University Team, 53-41.

The Wolfpack practically rewrote the record book in their NCAA appearances. Of the five team records, the Pack broke three and tied two. Ranzino broke two marks and tied another in the individual book. Dickey and Ranzino were named on the All-NCAA Tournament first team.

Coach Carl "Butter" Anderson's outstanding freshman team lost only two games in 25 starts and again took the Big Four championship. Such future stars as Lovington, Speight, Kukoy, Crull, Morris, Goss, Sief, and Yurin are expected to plug the gaps left by the departing of Dick Dickey, Warren Cartier, and Charlie Stine.

The rampaging frosh quintet burned the nets for a better than 75 points per game average. Anderson's charges, who collectively averaged approximately six feet, five inches, hit the coveted century mark in scoring twice during the year.

With the addition of the glittering array of talent produced from the frosh, plus Paul Brandenburg, a six foot, five inch Bayonne, New Jersey, Junior College transfer. Coach Case should be able to send to the courts in 1951 another of his annual powerhouse aggregations.





BASEBALL

Coach Vic Sorrell guided the 1949 State baseball team into a second place tie with the Carolina Tar Heels in Big Four Play. The veteran Pack coach's charges racked up five wins while dropping eight.

In regular season play, including all games, the Pack fared slightly better, with a final mark of eight wins and 12 setbacks.

Captain Bill Evans, All-Southern outfielder from Burlington, was the offensive leader in Big Four activity for State, with a final batting mark of .321. Shortstop John Norrell

actually had a higher average than Evans, but, by coaches' agreement, players had to appear in 10 games to qualify for the batting title. Norrell had a final mark of .333.

Irvin Page led the Pack moundsmen with a Big Four record of two victories and two defeats. Everette Lail had one win and no losses.

Ernie Johnson, a knuckleballer from Mt. Gilead, was again the workhorse of the loop. He pitched $59\frac{1}{3}$ innings and tied with Dick Vander Clute of Wake Forest for the strikeout crown. Johnson had a three-four record for the season.

State opened the 1949 season with Cornell University. It was a dull, rainy day, and the game had to be called at the end of five innings with the score 2-2. The Pack's starting lineup was composed of Ned Council at first, Pinkie Gardner at second, John Norrell at short, Hank Utley at third, Don Cheek in right field, Bill Evans in center, and Bill Mussack in left. The battery was Ernie Johnson, pitching, and Bill Fowler, catching. Ned Council paced the batters with two doubles in two trips. Two days later the Washington and Lee Generals journeyed to Raleigh and were defeated 6-3 on the six-hit pitching of righthander Bob Smith. Hard hitting by Don Cheek, Hank Utley, and Jack McComas helped Smith garner his first win. McComas smashed the first homer of the season in the fifth inning.

The following day the Wolfpack pulled a 6-5 victory over the Wildcats of Davidson out of the fire in the ninth. After starting pitcher John (Tootsie) Holding had been shelled from the mound, Everette Lail pitched beautiful relief ball to get credit for the win. Don Cheek, lanky right fielder, broke up the ball game with a terrific wallop to left center.

In an intersectional engagement, the Michigan State Spartans handed State its first defeat of the season. The Pack blew an eight run lead to lose by a 13-10 score. Jolting Jack McComas led the Sorrellmen at the plate with four for five.

The second successive defeat came the following day when the Virginia Tech Gobblers blanked the Pack 6-0 on the five-hit pitching of Calvin Schadel.

Davidson evened the count when State journeyed there and was defeated 3-1. Charlie Pearson, leadoff man for the Cats, smashed Ernie Johnson's first pitch for an inside-the-park homer.

The Pack's fourth straight defeat came at the hands of the William and Mary Indians, 12-2. Four errors helped the Braves scalp the Wolves. McComas again led the State hitting attack with four for five.



The 13th of April brought good luck to the Wolfpack. They snapped a four-game losing streak by defeating the Duke Blue Devils in their first Big Four game. Although outhit 12 to 6 and guilty of five errors to Duke's three, the locals scrambled to an 8-7 victory. Catcher Bill Fowler smashed his first home run of the season in the third with one mate aboard.

In the first game with Wake Forest's NCAA finalists, Coach Sorrell's lads came out on the short end of a 3-1 score. State's Ernie Johnson and Wake's Moe Bauer locked horns in a first-rate pitchers' duel for eight scoreless innings before successive fourbaggers by Paul Livick and Gene Hooks broke up the game. Fowler's double was the Pack's only safe blow.

After the heart-breaking loss to the Deacons, State pounded out a 10-6 victory over the Carolina Tar Heels. The high-

light of the game was a 370-foot grand slam home run by Jack (Jackrabbit) McComas.

Journeying to Wake Forest, the State aggregation again lost to the undefeated Deacons. However, the margin was by one run only. The Pack's Irving Page and the Deacs' Moe Bauer were hooked up in a pitchers' duel until the eighth. Wake Forest scored their only run on a two-base error by McComas to win 1-0.

Outfielder Don Check provided the clincher in State's 8-6 victory over the Carolina Tar Heels in a return engagement. Check slammed a game-winning triple in the ninth inning. Second baseman Buck Livingston was the batting star of the day with four hits in five trips. Included in this array of blows was a homer. Livingston drove in five of State's eight runs.

After dropping their next Big Four game to the Duke Blue Devils 7-4, the Pack again met Wake Forest. The Deacons made it 18 victories in a row by drubbing the Pack 9-2. Moe Bauer, the Deacs' stylish portsider, racked up his third straight victory over the State lads.

State evened their Big Four record at four wins and four losses by defeating Duke, 5-3. Don Check's three-run triple was the big blow of the game. Bill Evans led the hitting with three for five.

The Wolfpack was dropped into third place in the Big Four when Carolina punched out 18 hits off Johnson and Smith to win 8-4. Bill Mussack smashed a 330-foot homer in the eighth with one man on.

Again the time rolled around to play the undefeated Wake Forest Deacons. State pounced on Moe Bauer in the seventh to knot the count at three-all. Then in the eighth Dick Vander Clute was the victim of a four-run rally and State won the game 7-5. Wake Forest's balloon finally had burst. Hank Utley, third baseman, was the big noise for the Pack at the plate, hitting three for five. Irv Page went the route for the Pack.

State continued its winning ways by putting a crimp in the Clemson Tigers' hopes for winning the Southern Conference baseball championship by scoring a 6-1 victory. Evans, Cheek, and Utley were leaders in the attack.

Duke's Blue Devils gained an even break with the Wolfpack by defeating them 3-2 behind the effective pitching of Bud Ayers.

Sorrell's club again seemed to be plagued with bad luck as the Wake Forest Deacons defeated them 6-4. Catcher Russ Batchelor of the Deacs slammed a long ball which

hit on top of the left field fence and bounced over for a home run.

In the final Big Four game of the season, the Tar Heels defeated State. This loss enabled the Carolina boys to tie State for the second place position in the standings.


FENCING





The Wolfpack track team captured two out of five meets during the 1949 cinder season, winning from the William and Mary Indians, 69-57, and from the Gamecocks of South Carolina, 86-40. The State thinclads lost to Wake Forest, 86-40; to Duke by 100-26; and to Carolina 81-45.

Outstanding among the Wolfpack tracksters were dashman Herb Goldberg and field experts Jim Byler and Joe Davis. Goldberg exhibited his prowess on the cinders by capturing first place in the 100 yard dash against Wake Forest and William and Mary. Against South Carolina, Goldberg won the 220 and was a close second in the 100. He topped off the season with a win against Duke in the 220, with a time of 21.9 seconds.


In the field events, Joe Davis and Jim Byler were the leaders. Davis captured first in the broad jump against Carolina, Wake Forest, William and Mary,

and South Carolina, while Byler won the shot put against the same outfits. Byler's best throw for the season was 47 feet, 9 inches, slightly under his best toss for last year.

The freshman harriers fared little better, breaking even in four outings. The Wolflets beat Carolina, 64-62, and Wake Forest, 86-40. Losses were sustained to Duke in two encounters, 86-40 and 87-31.

The Frosh squad provided a promising youth in Tyler Wadsworth, a Raleigh product. He shaped up as the outstanding contender for the Southern Conference 440 record. During the season he ran the event in 50.5 seconds, just one second off the present record.

Wadsworth was undefeated in the 220 and 440 yard events during the season and was beaten only once in the 100. He was also anchor man on the relay team



and will be counted on heavily during the current season. Other outstanding freshmen were Bob Branyon and Larry Seigal.

STATE 69—WILLIAM AND MARY 57

In the opening meet for the Wolfpack cindermen, the locals won out over the Indians of William and Mary, 69-57. Joe Davis was high scorer for the Pack with 12 points, followed by Herb Goldberg, who accounted for 10. State captured first in the 100, 220, shot, discus, javelin, high jump, 120 high hurdles, and the broad jump.

STATE 86—SOUTH CAROLINA 40

The Wolfpack took the measure of the Gamecocks of South Carolina, 86-40, in the second meet of the season. The meet was staged under the lights on the local track.

Again it was Joe Davis leading the attack, with 13 points. Making a clean sweep of the middle and long distance events, the State men finished one, two, three, in the 440 and 800; and one, two in the mile.

The power laden Tar Heels of Carolina were too much for the Wolfpack cindermen, turning them back, 81-46. The State boys were able to capture but three events in the contest.



In his first year as a track coach at State College, Coach Tom Fitzgibbons produced what was perhaps the best cross country team ever to represent the school. The Pack harriers turned in an undefeated record with only a tie with William and Mary to blot an otherwise perfect season.

Leaders for the Wolfpack were Captain John Hunter, Bobby Leonard, and Dave Dubow. Leonard gave the best individual performance of the year when he defeated Captain John Hart, 1948 Olympic finalist of the Quantico Marine team. Leonard broke the tape in the brilliant time of 20 minutes and 52 seconds. Hart finished behind him in 21 minutes and 18 seconds.

Although undefeated in the regular season, the State team did not win the annual Southern Conference meet. They finished second behind a very fine University of Maryland squad. The Maryland lads pulled down the meet by a wide margin for the third straight year. The final count was Maryland 32, State 80. The Pack, as expected, captured the state meet held on the West Raleigh campus.

Coach Fitzgibbons had two of the finest distance men in the Conference on his '49 freshman aggregation. They were Bobby Jones and Clyde Garrison, who both broke all existing freshman marks for the two-mile frosh course.

In their most successful season since the war, the Wolfpack netters completed the 1949 season with an impressive record of eight wins, three losses, and one tie in twelve dual meets.

Coach Walt Seeger's boys started the season off strong by taking six straight wins before dropping a contest to Duke's Blue Devils. Other losses were to Carolina and to Virginia.

The first encounter for the Red and White was with the netmen of Colgate University. This match ended in a 3-3 deadlock, being halted because of rain.

Following the Colgate match, the Wolfpack took wins over South Carolina and Wake Forest, and traveling north they posted wins over Albright College of Reading, Pa., the University of Richmond, VMI, and Washington and Lee.



The Pack sustained their third loss at the hands of the University of Virginia in their next meet, and they completed the season with a win over the University of Maryland.

Art Culbertson, a junior from Goldsboro, and Charlie Boney, a senior from Wilmington, were co-captains for the 1949 season. Bill Weathers, a senior from Raleigh, played the number one position for the Pack.


pack picked up the other points by virtue of a forfeit in the 175-pound division and a draw between Doug Martin and Adelberg in the 155-pound bout.



Pack wrestlers took every bout in the Presbyterian match and handed the Blue Stocking a 33-0 pasting. Next, Coach Crawford's matmen downed the Quantico Marines, 27-5, before a record crowd of 8,500 fans in the Coliseum. The only match State lost against the Marines was the 145-pound class bout in which Hess of Quantico pinned Martin in 2 minutes, 19 seconds. Martin had just won the open welter-weight boxing championship in the 12th Annual

Eastern Carolina Golden Gloves Tournament at Memorial Auditorium before hurrying to the Coliseum to join the wrestlers for the matches.

Charlie Musser, heavyweight, finished his eligibility with three years of varsity wrestling. During the three-year period he was defeated only once. That defeat came in the VMI match prior to which Musser had been confined to the college infirmary for three days due to sickness.


Coach Willis Casey's tankmen ended the 1950 season with a record of 11 victories in 13 meets. The Wolfpack swimmers opened their impressive season with three straight wins over Virginia teams. State opened against the Norfolk Division of William and Mary in a non-conference match. Following that came a victory over Virginia Tech, 43-22, and a 50-27 triumph over William and Mary.

In the Tech meet Billy Ward took the 100-yard freestyle event, and Matt Lojko captured the 150-yard backstroke race. Lojko broke the pool record in the latter event against William and Mary.

After a meet with VMI, the Pack swimmers took a southern trip to Georgia. Casey's lads suffered a 41-34 licking at the hands of the Georgia Tech Yellow Jackets, but they bounced back into the win column the next day to trounce Emory University, 57-18. In the Emory fiasco, Ward, Depres, and Lojko set new marks. The three combined their talents in the 300-yard medley relay to establish new standards, and Lojko alone turned the trick in the 150-yard backstroke.

The nautical Pack returned to the State College campus from a jaunt into the northland with two hard earned victories over Loyola of Baltimore and the Colonials of George Washington, Southern Conference foes. An intersectional battle with Catholic University scheduled for this trip was cancelled.

A victory in the 400-yard relay gave State a 40-35 triumph over Loyola. The meet was close all the way,

Moving over to Washington, the Pack edged George Washington, 41-34, in a hard fought clash.

In the last event of this meet, State copped the 400-yard medley relay to break a 34-34 tie and to win the meet.

Victories over Davidson College (two wins), Virginia, and Duke followed. The State team entered the Southern Conference, the Eastern Intercollegiate, and the NCAA tournaments. The results are not available as the 1950 AGROMECK goes to press.




The Wolfpack suffered defeat at the hands of Wake Forest twice, and South Carolina and North Carolina once each.



INTRAMURAL ADVISORY BOARD


