
# FOREWORD



# *of outstanding service*

MR. WILLIAMS was born in Johnston County, October 17, 1895, and was educated in the Johnston County public schools. He was a veteran of World War I. He received two degrees in poultry science at North Carolina State College and had been a member of the faculty of State College since 1925. Mr. Williams was a Professor of Poultry Science and also served as coach of the Poultry Judging Team.

MR. RUFFNER was born in Warrenton, Virginia, May 22, 1882. He studied at William and Mary, the University of Maryland, and Cornell University. He received his bachelor's degree at Maryland in 1908 and joined the State College faculty in 1919 where he received his master's in 1931. One of the best known members of the college faculty, Professor Ruffner retired last year as head of the Department of Animal Industry after serving the institution for 30 years as teacher and in official capacities. Since his retirement, he had had charge of the State College dairy herd.

MR. CLEVENGER was born October 7, 1881, in Fletcher, Ohio. He had been a member of the State College faculty since August 1, 1923. Professor Clevenger received his B.S. degree in Agriculture from Ohio State in 1906 and his M.S. in Animal Husbandry at State in 1932. He served State College both as Professor of dairy manufacturing and as specialist of the Agricultural Extension Service. In March, 1951, the dairy processing industry of North Carolina created the "W. L. Clevenger Research Fellowship in Dairy Manufacturing" to provide a graduate training program at N. C. State.







Programs are offered at the graduate level for those who wish to attain further professional development in these fields.



## TEXTILE FORUM




## CAMPUS GOVERNMENT





## ENGINEERS' COUNCIL


## INTERDORMITORY COUNCIL


## Y. M. C. A.

Since its organization around 1917, the club has been student governed with the faculty members acting only in an advisory capacity. The student members plan and execute all of its activities.




Five years after the Civil War, William Grigsby McCormick, former head of the McCormick-Deering Corporation, and four friends founded the first American chapter of Kappa Sigma. Kappa Sigma had its original founding at the University of Bologna in 1400, and soon spread to many of the larger universities of continental Europe. Since its founding in America on December 10, 1869, at the University of Virginia, Kappa Sigma has expanded until now it has at least one chapter in every state in the union. 
There are 32 active chapters of Alpha Gamma Rho. Nu Chapter, before becoming national in 1919, was the local fraternity Theta Beta.

Scholastically, the fraternity has always ranked in the upper quarter of the fraternities at North Carolina State.





It would be difficult to pick out many outstanding stars, for each of the players had a field day in one game or another.









## 1951-52 BASKETBALL SQUAD






# CROSS COUNTRY

Some of the team participated in the NCAA Cross Country Meet at the University of Wisconsin and made a very good showing.


