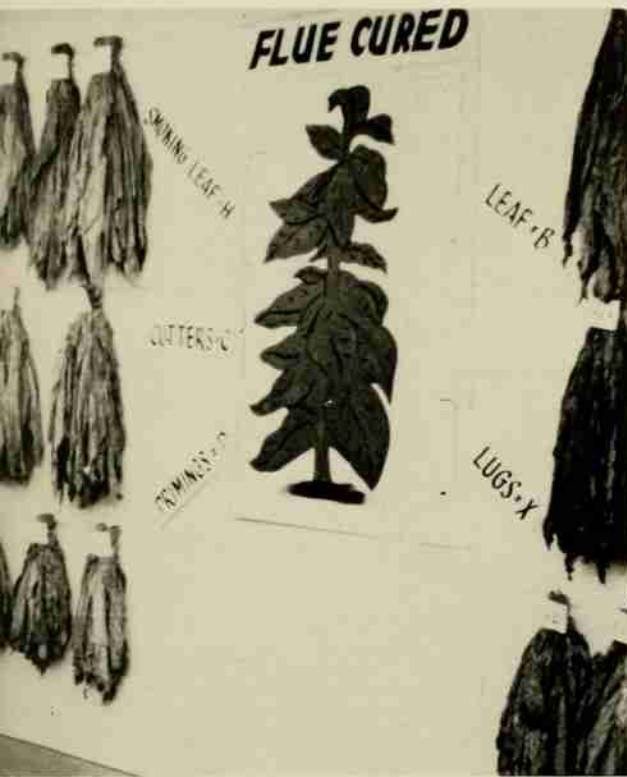
THE SCHOOL OF AGRICULTURE

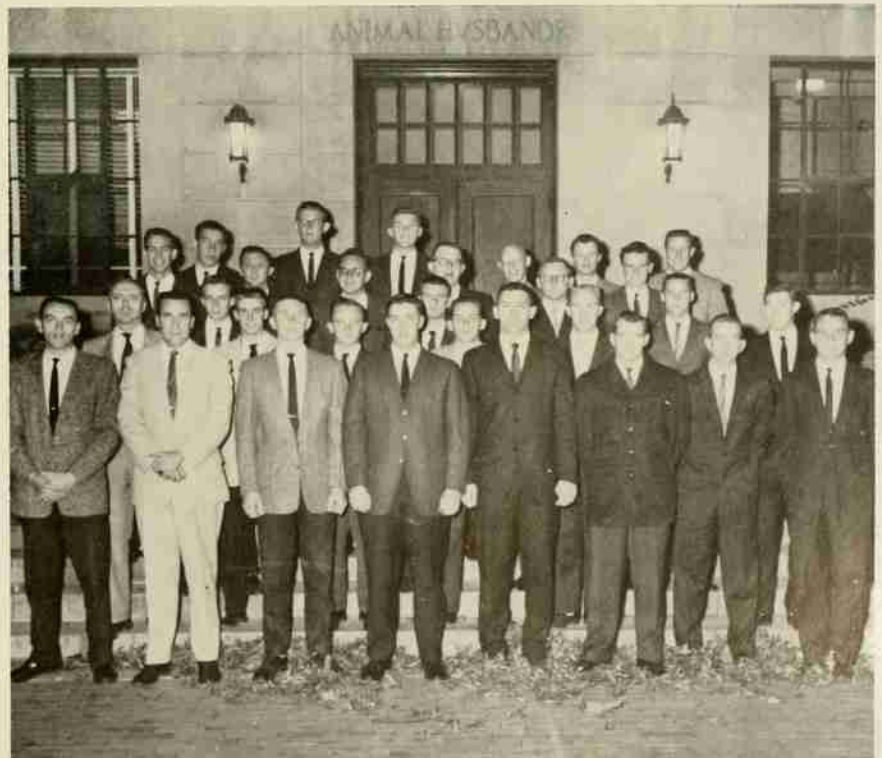


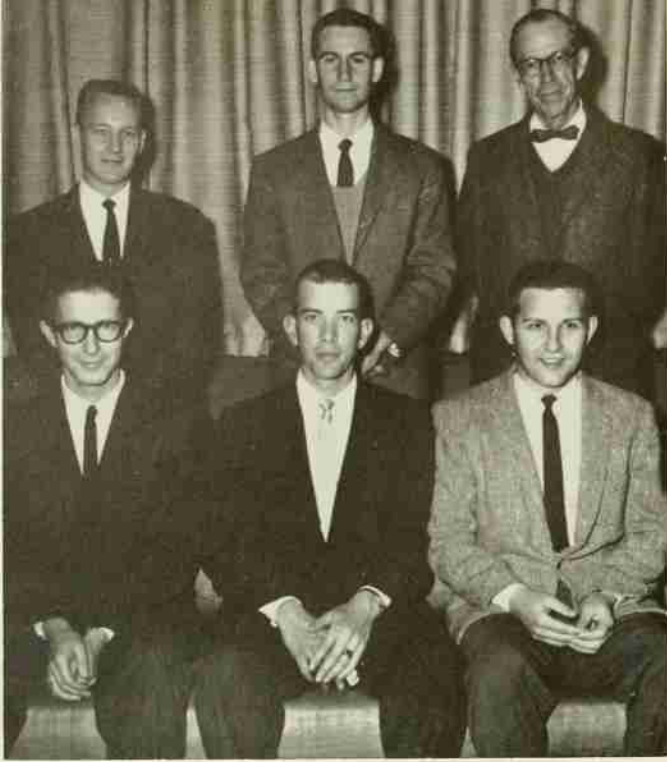

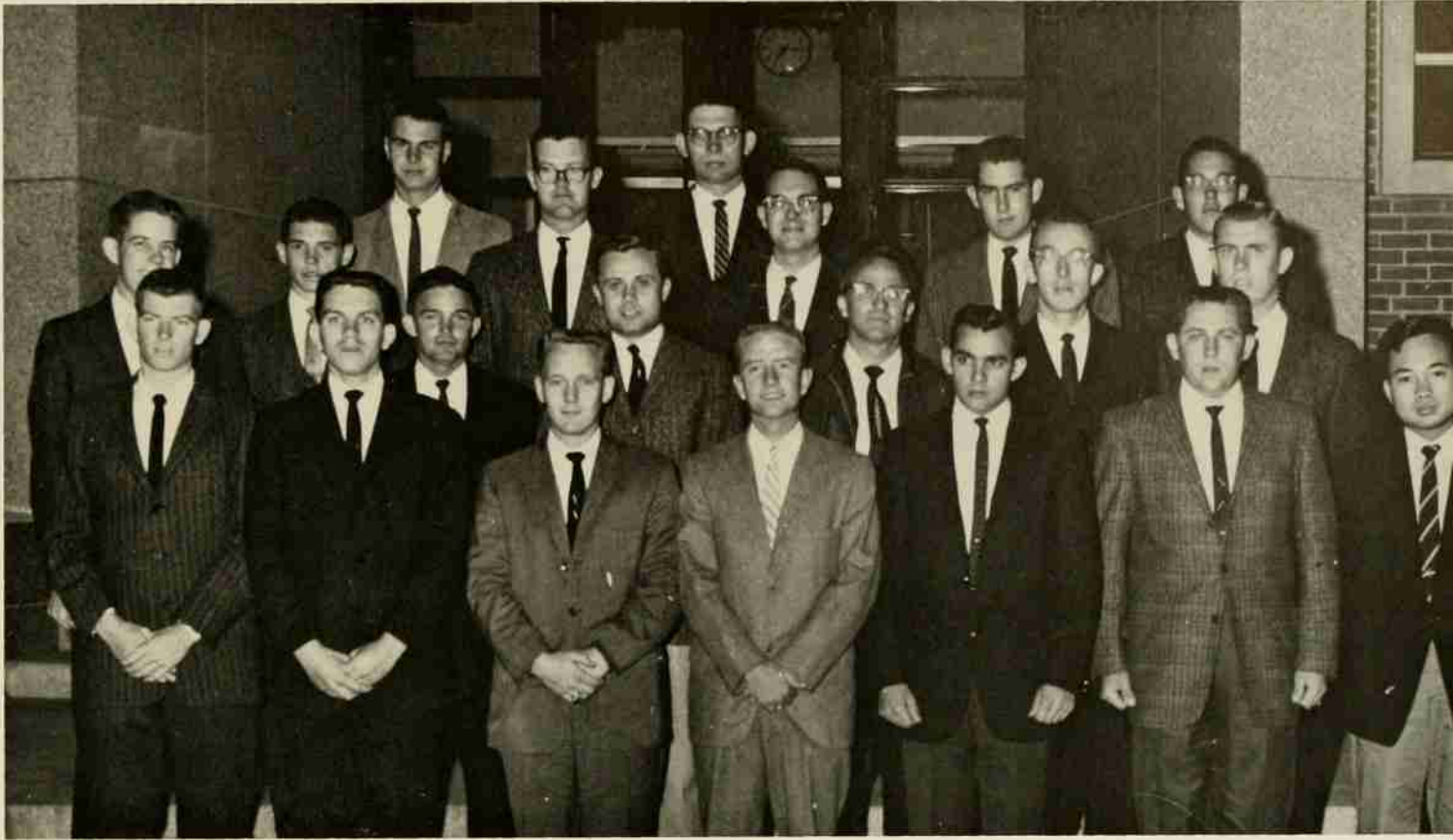
Each year the Council sponsors entertainment programs, students' Ag Fair, Barnwarming Dance, and Ag Day.

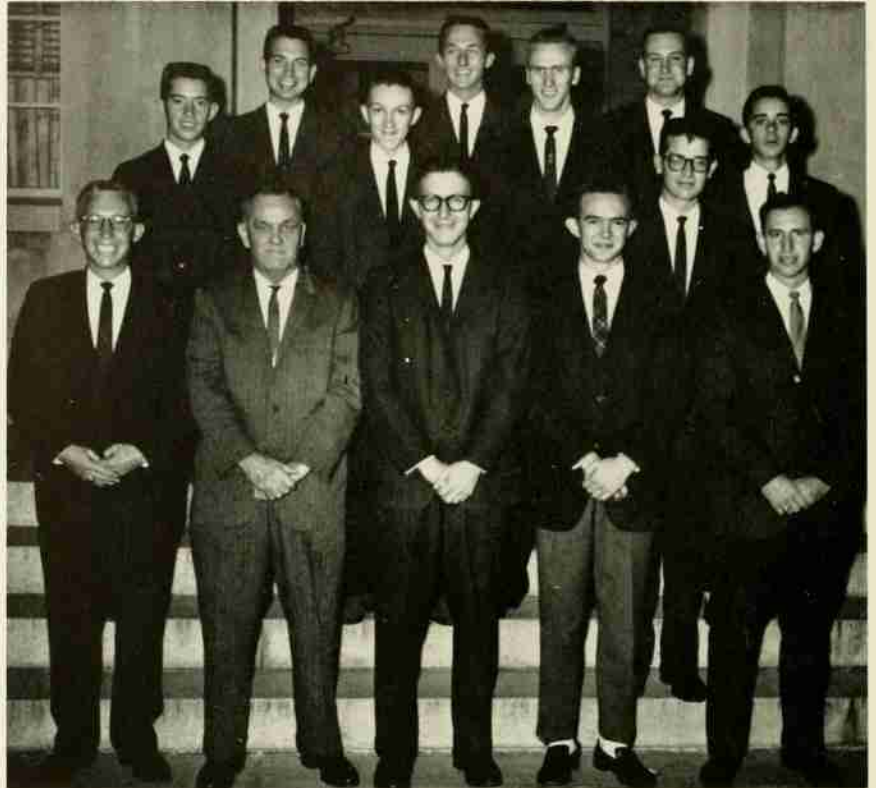

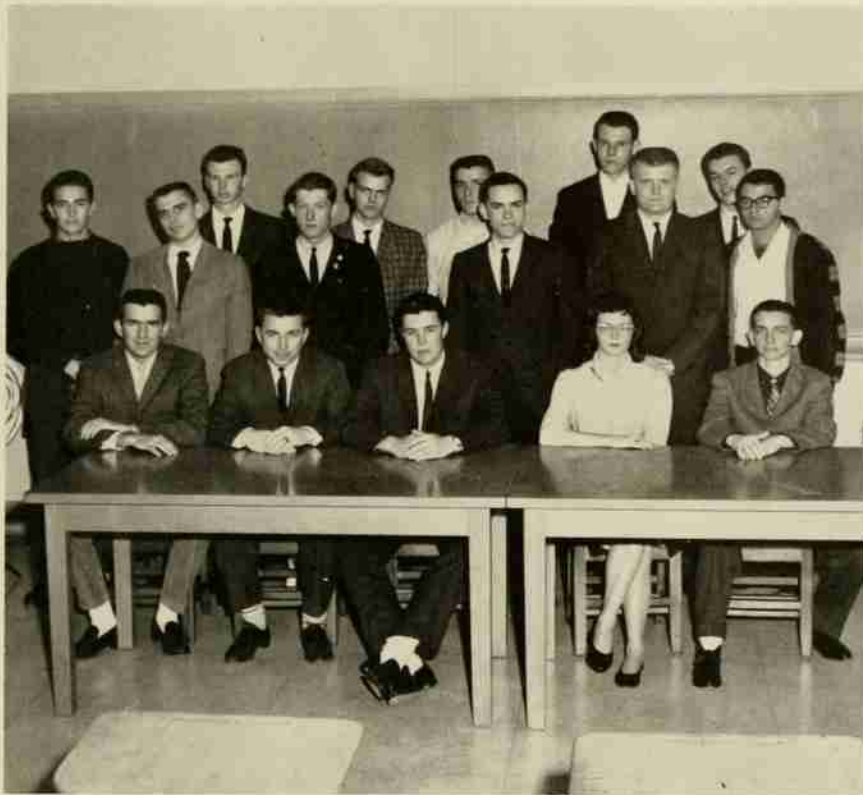

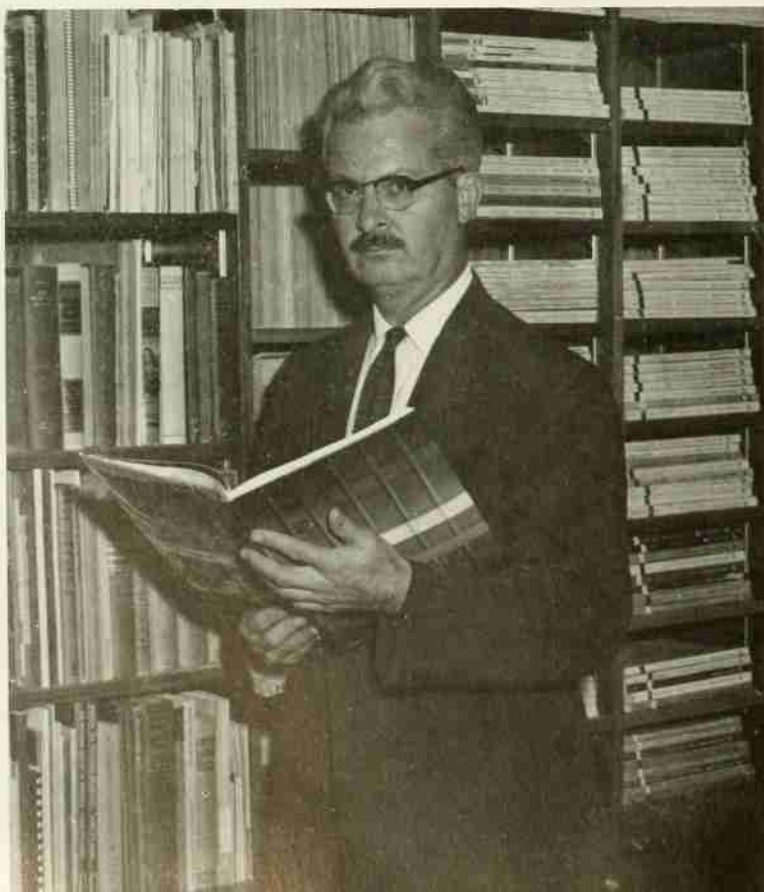
THE SCHOOL OF DESIGN

The School of Design is devoted and dedicated to the development of a native architecture and its accompanying art forms for the southern region.

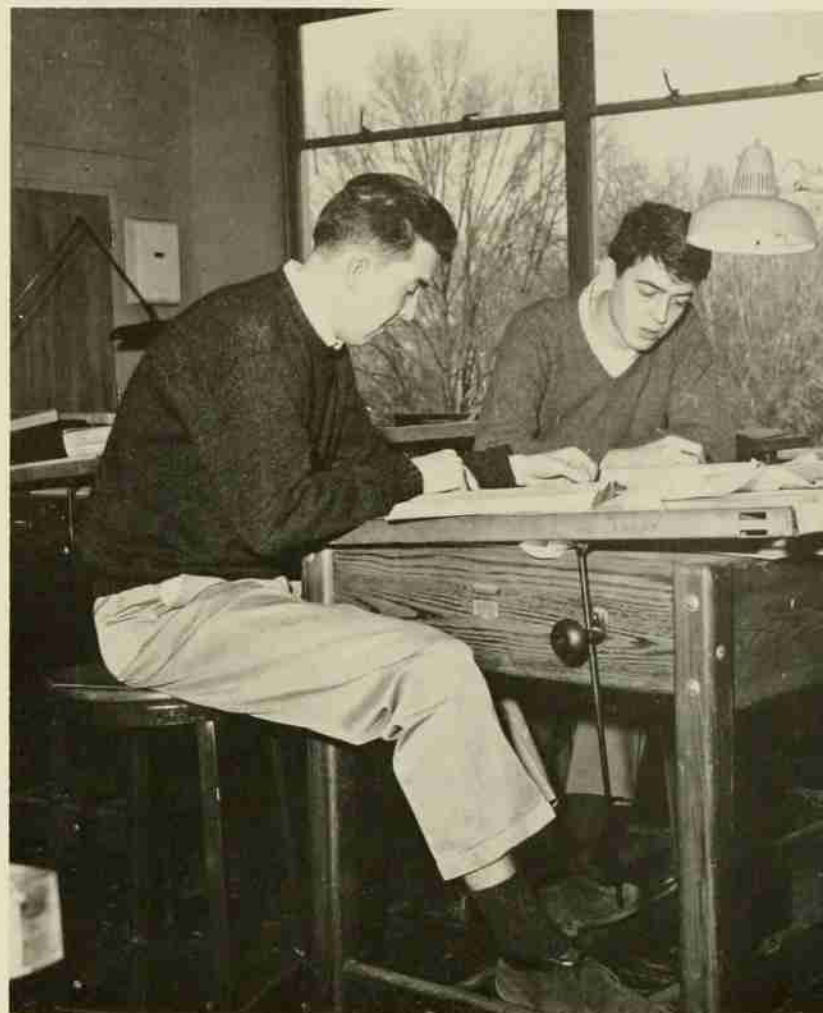

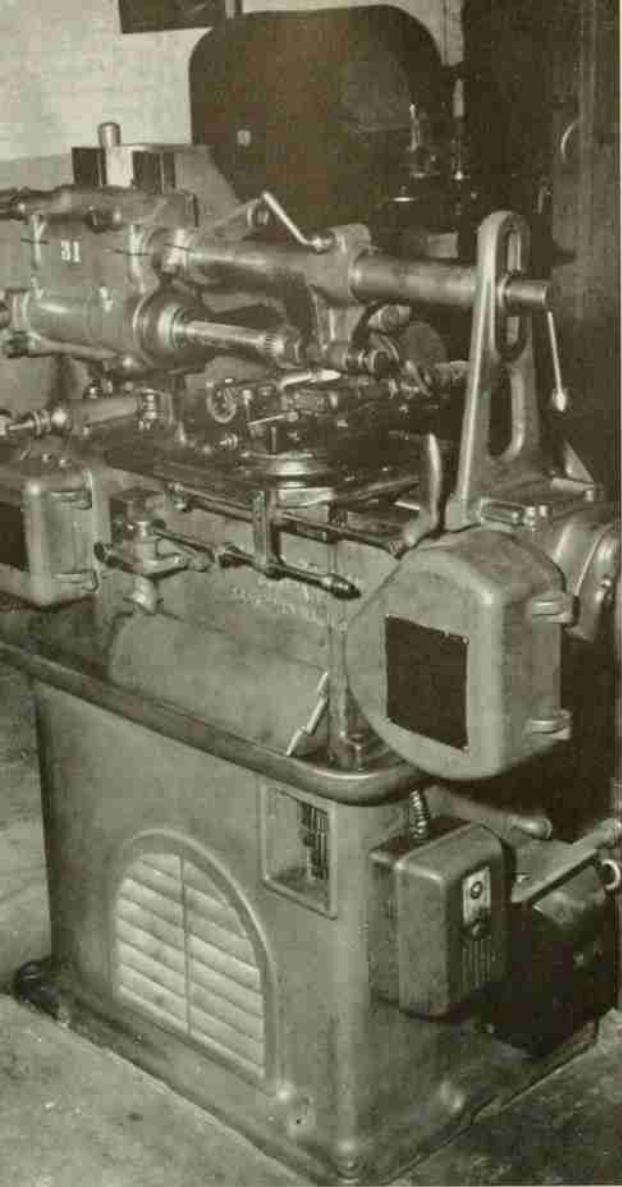
While its first aim is to serve North Carolina and the southern regions, the design school believes that its students will be equipped, through the teaching of the school, to work in any region.

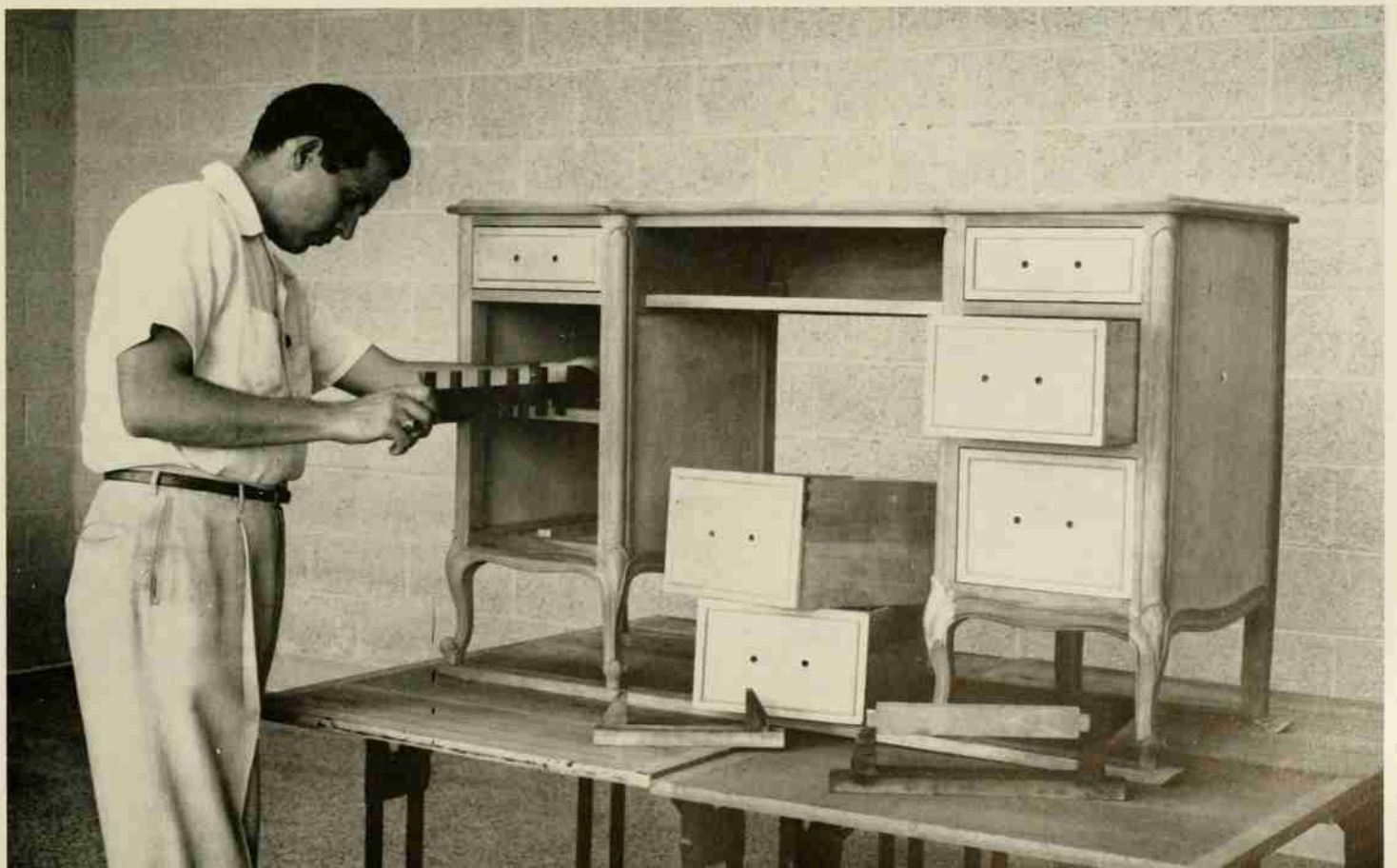
THE SCHOOL OF EDUCATION

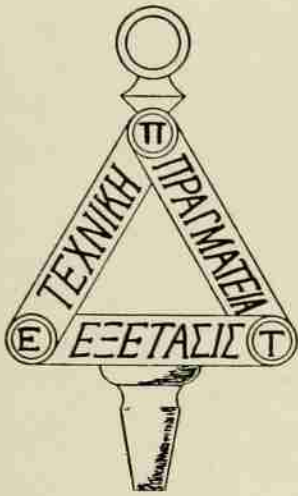

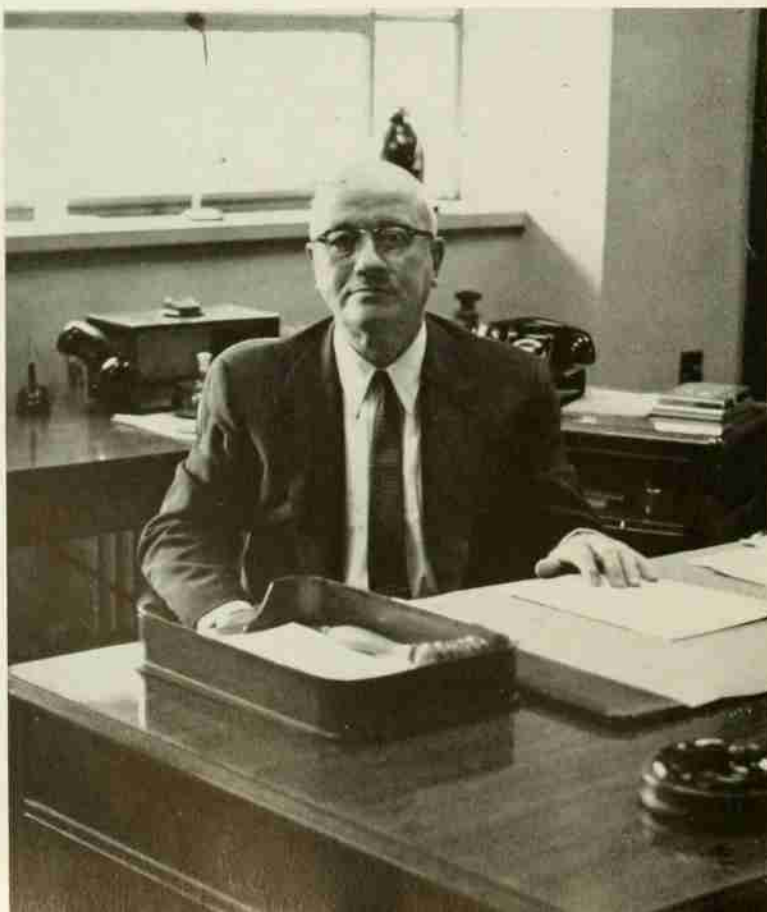


THE SCHOOL OF ENGINEERING

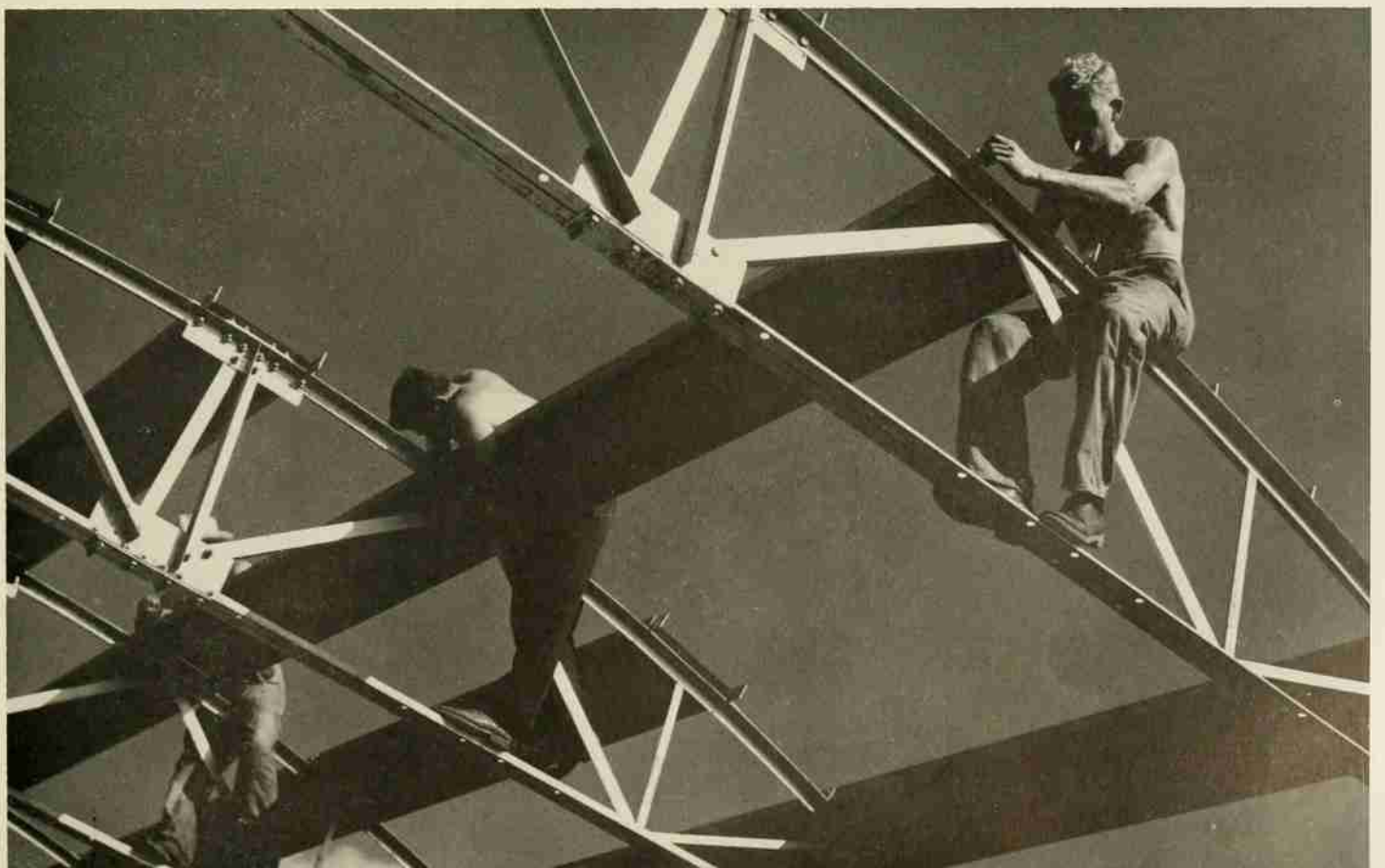
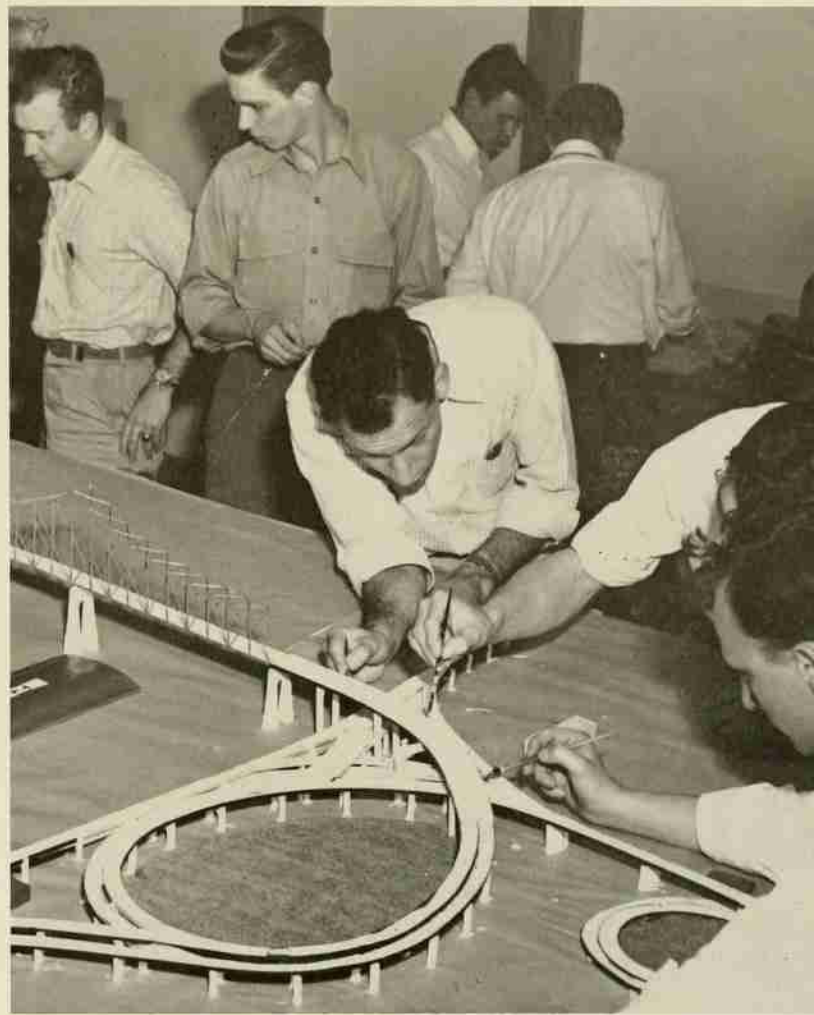

Chi Epsilon is a national professional Civil Engineering honorary fraternity, based on the broad objective of increasing the efficiency of the profession as an instrument of social betterment.

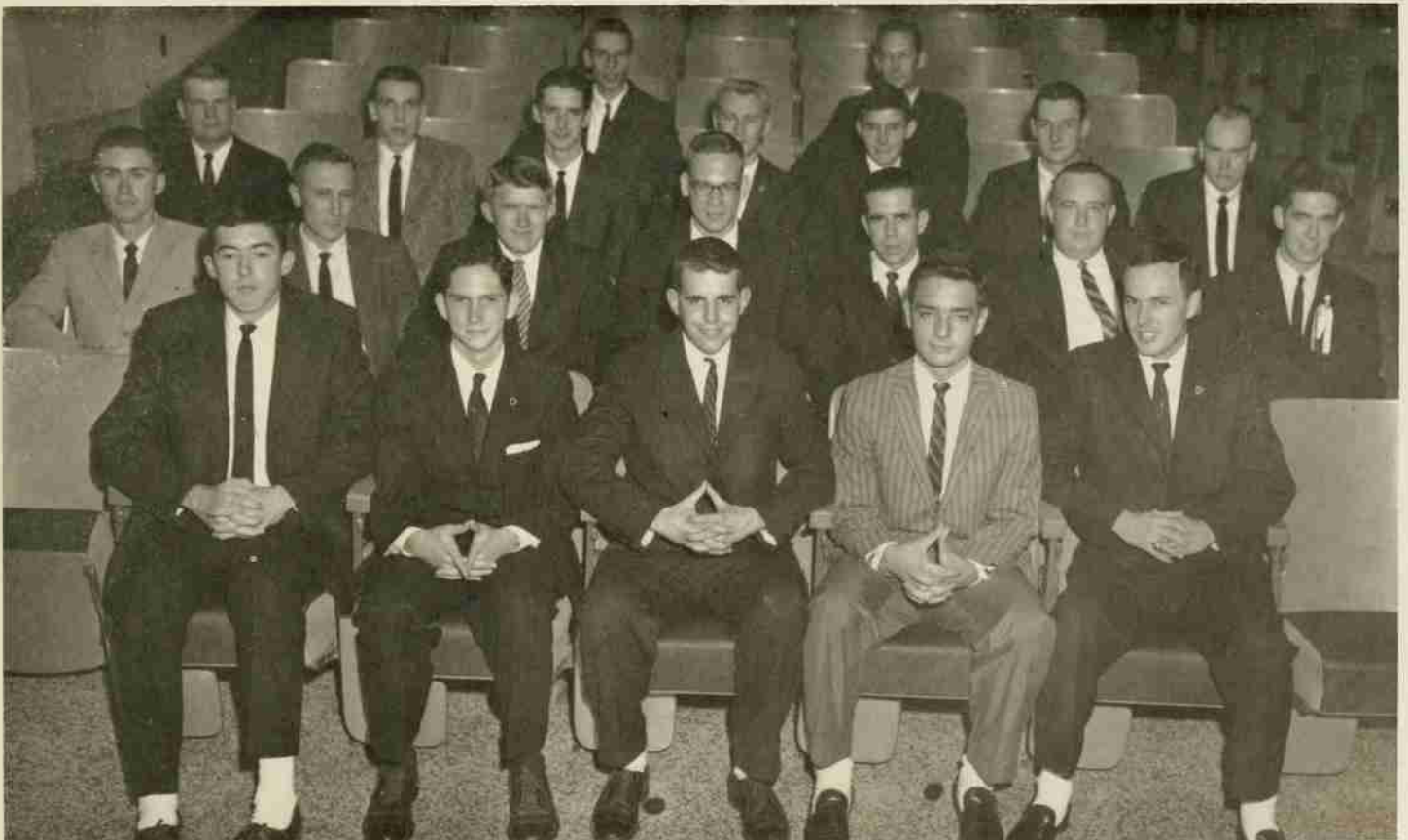

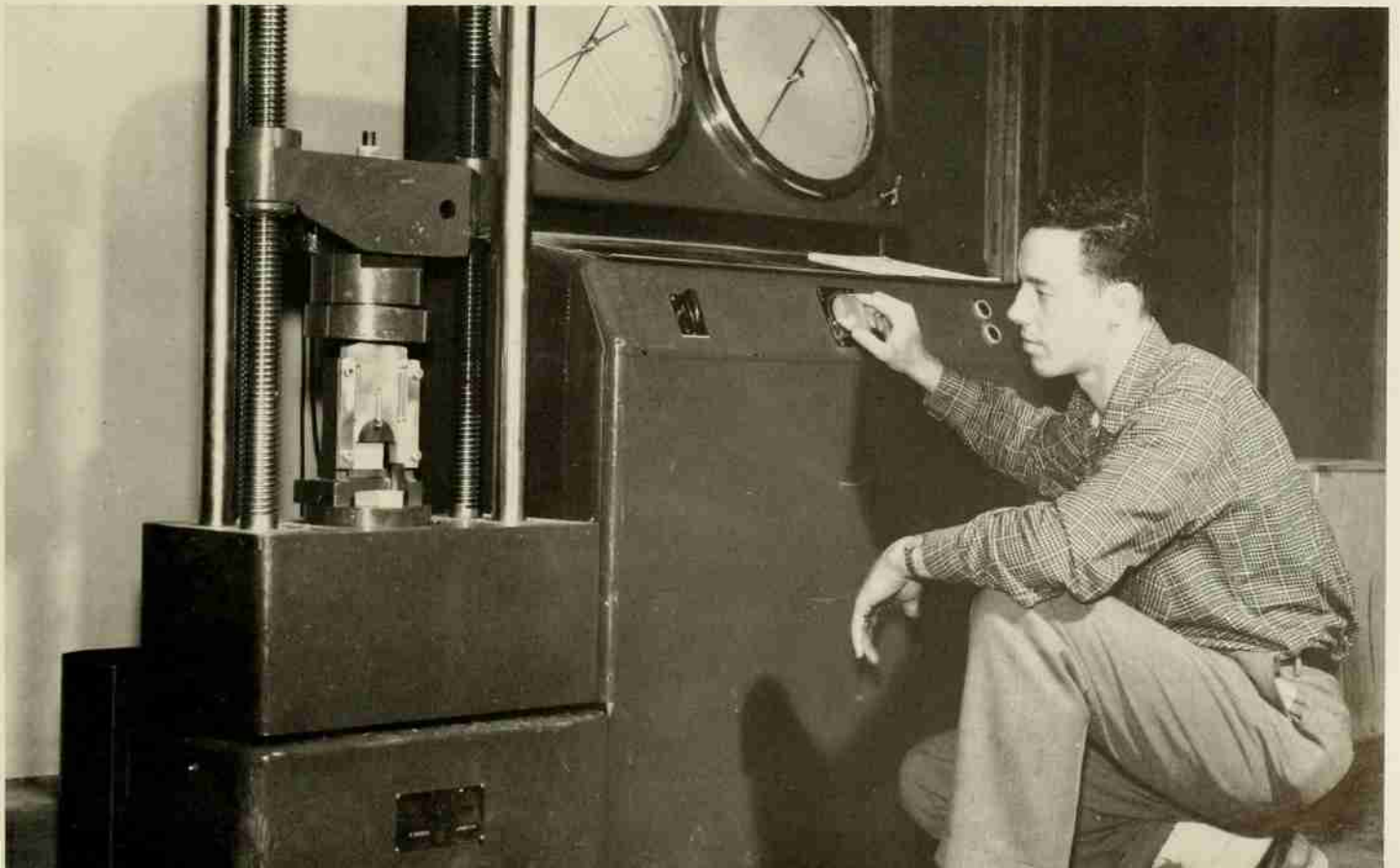
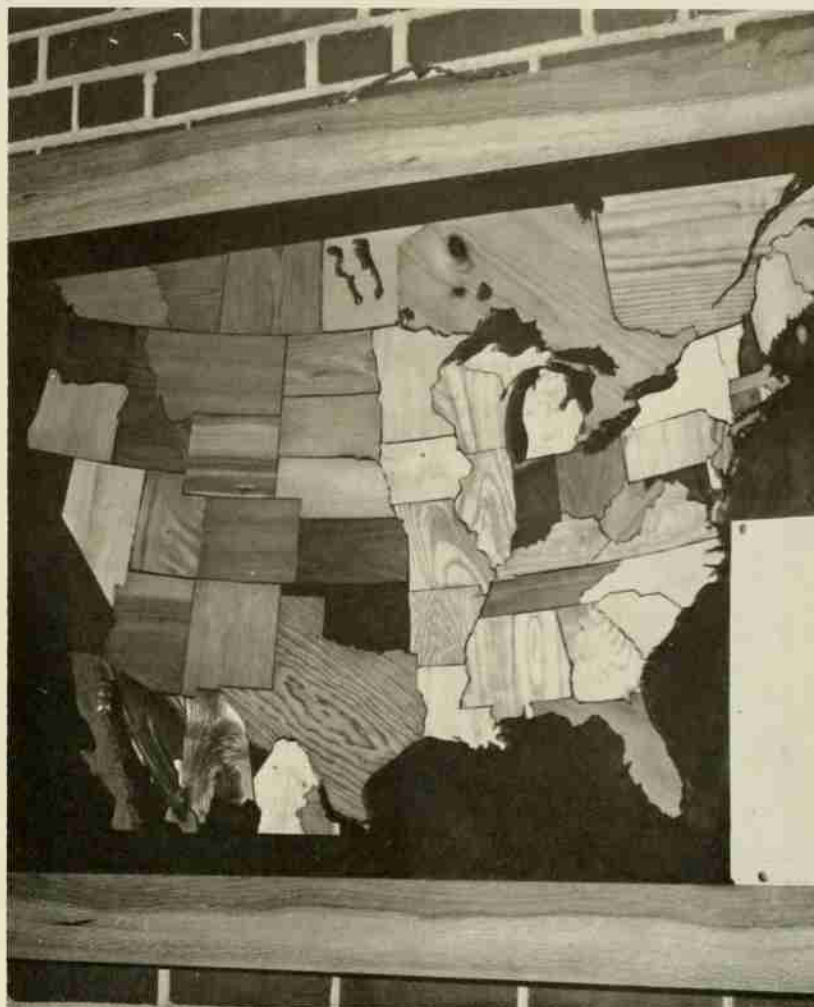


THE SCHOOL OF FORESTRY

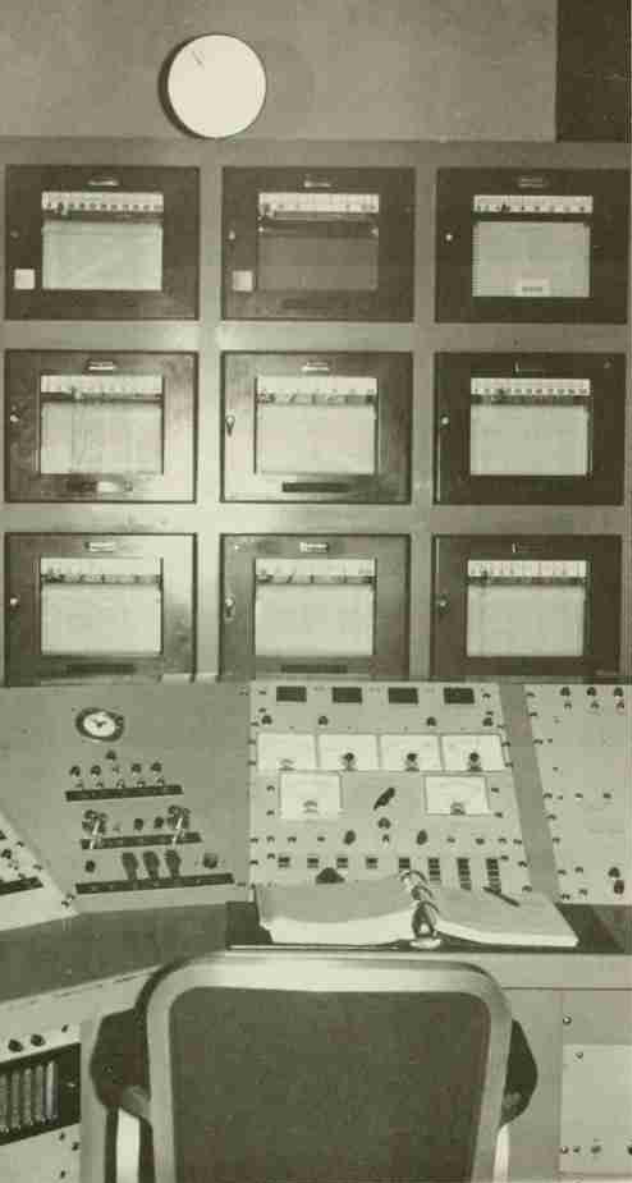

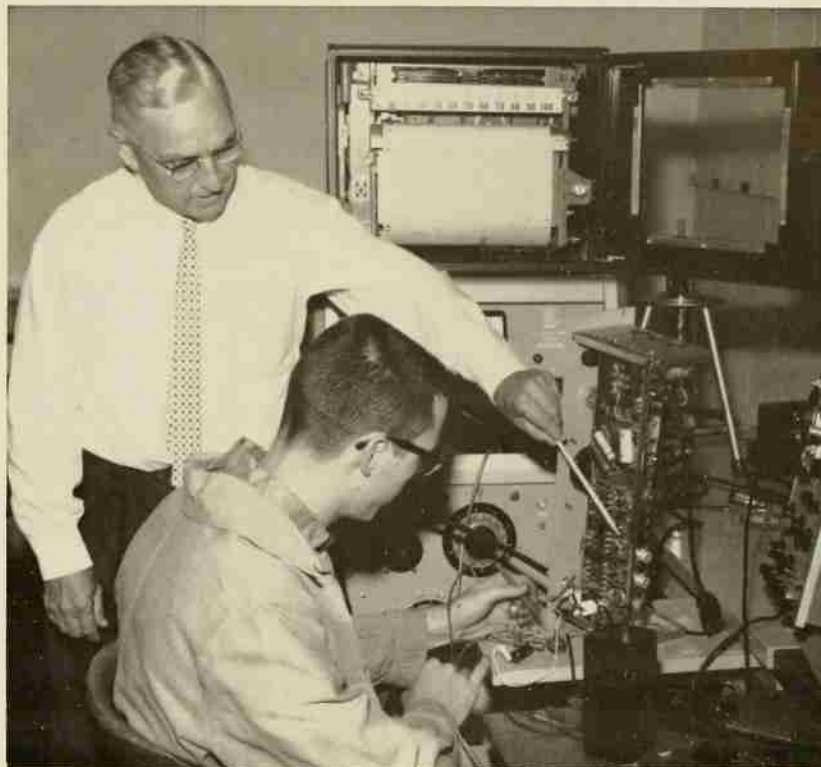
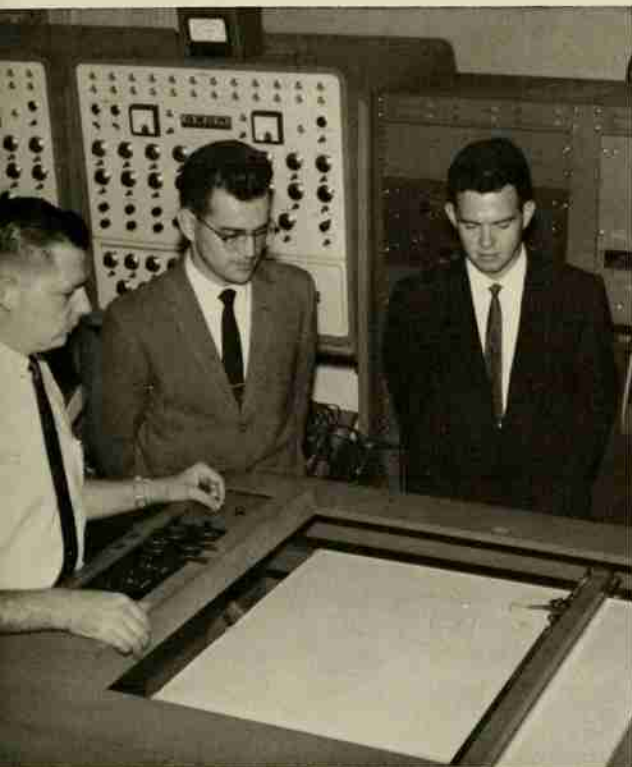
The School of Physical Sciences and Applied Mathematics has two missions at North Carolina State College: the training of well-qualified scientists and mathematicians; the technical support of curricula in Agriculture, Education, Textiles, Forestry, Design, and Engineering.

The School of Physical Sciences and Applied Mathematics is fully equipped for instruction and research. Special equipment and laboratories associated with the departments of the School include a complete radio-chemistry laboratory; a low power homogeneous reactor and a heterogeneous reactor designed for 100 kw; a one million volt Van de Graaff accelerator; two analog computers, GEDA and Donner; and an IBM 650 digital computer supplemented by access to the UNIVAC 1105 at the University of North Carolina Computation Center at Chapel Hill. Other facilities on the campus available for teaching and research are an RCA electron microscope, complete X-ray laboratories with diffraction and radiographic equipment, and precision instrument shops.

Undergraduate curricula leading to the Bachelor of Science degree in Physics, Experimental Statistics, Chemistry, and Applied Mathematics have been established. The Master of Science degree is offered by each department of the School, with the Doctor of Philosophy degree available in the departments of Physics and Experimental Statistics.

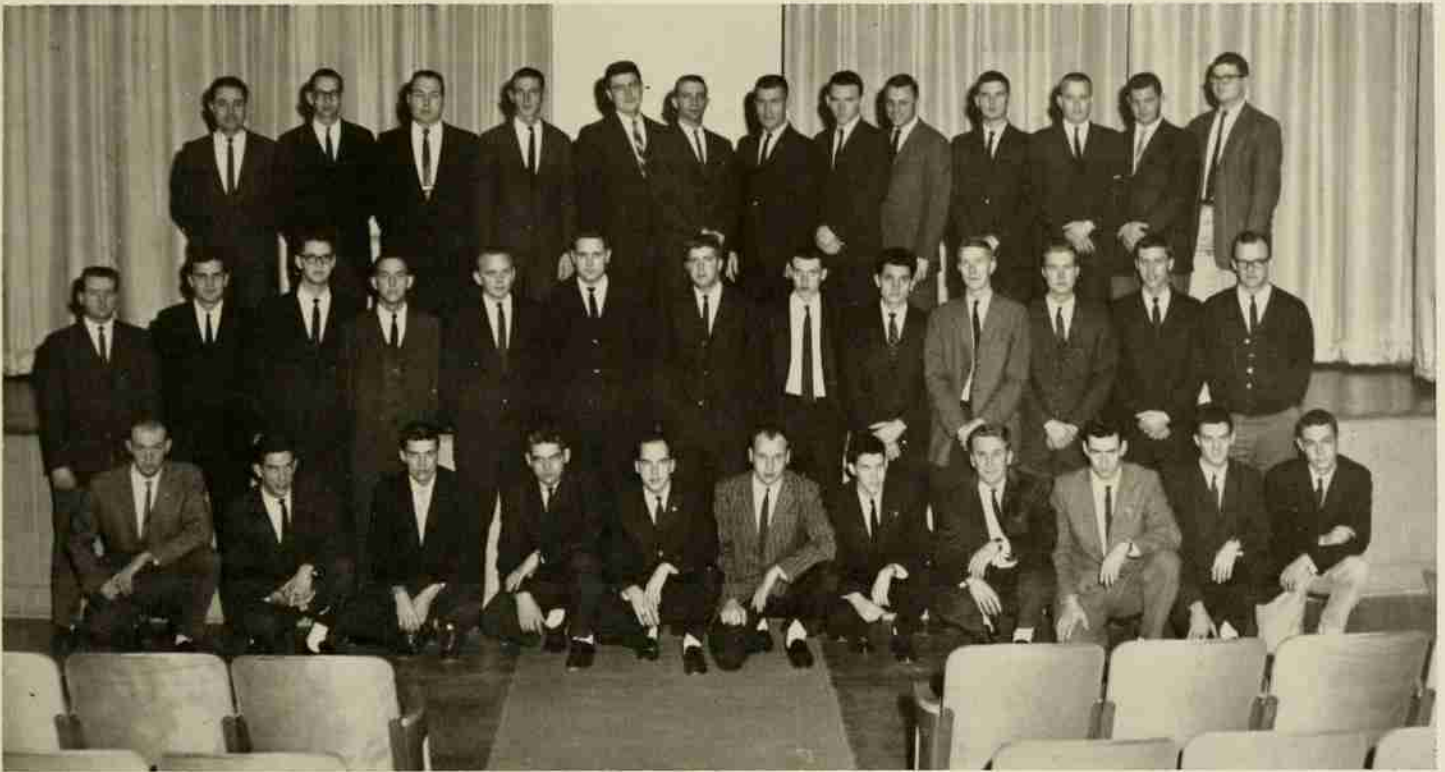
The Tompkins Textile Council is the students' governing body of the Textile School. It is composed of representatives from the various textile organizations and representatives from each class.

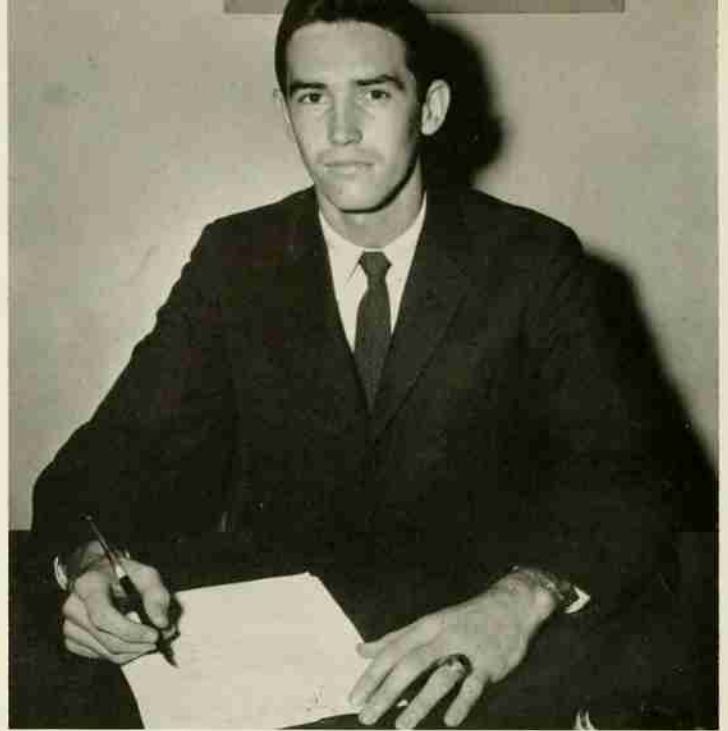
STUDENT GOVERNMENT

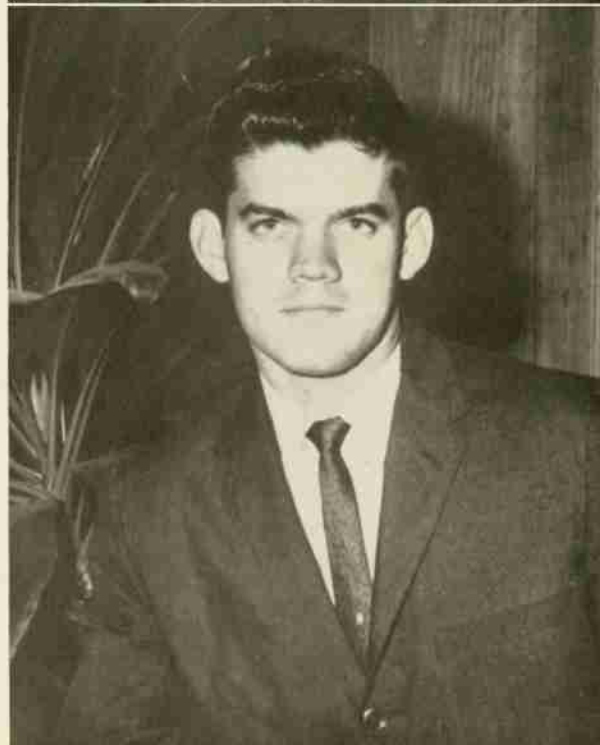
YMCA

All these things go into the making of a college annual. It has truly been a memorable year.

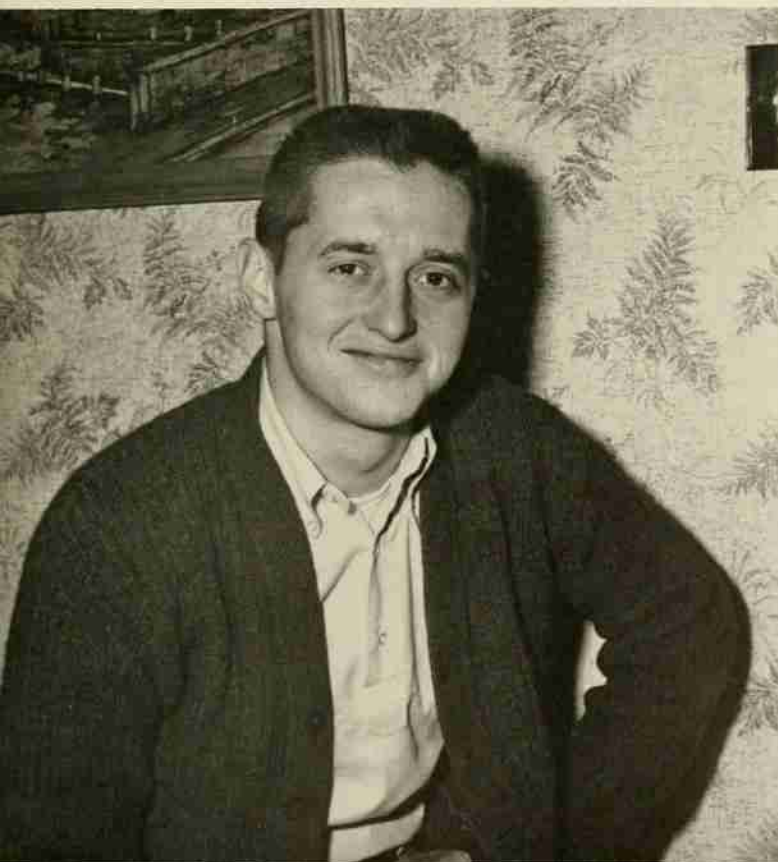

State Quarterback Roman Gabriel was selected to the FWAA, FCAA, and Look Magazine's All-American Teams this past season. A look into his record explains why he was such a popular choice.

He was one of five players in major college football this year to compile more than 50% of his team's total offense. Gabriel personally accounted for 1356 yards of N. C. State's 2539 yards gained total offense, which personally made him responsible for 53.5% of the Wolfpack's attack.

Gabriel passed or ran for 15 of State's last 17 touchdowns. Passing nine and scoring six, he was responsible for 92 of State's 148 points. He completed 105 of 186 passing attempts for 56.5% this year. Roman was also the most accurate passer in the NCAA's 1959 listing of the top 25 passers with a 60.4 completion percentage. His amazing feats on the playing field in addition to his conduct on the campus make Roman Gabriel a true All-American.

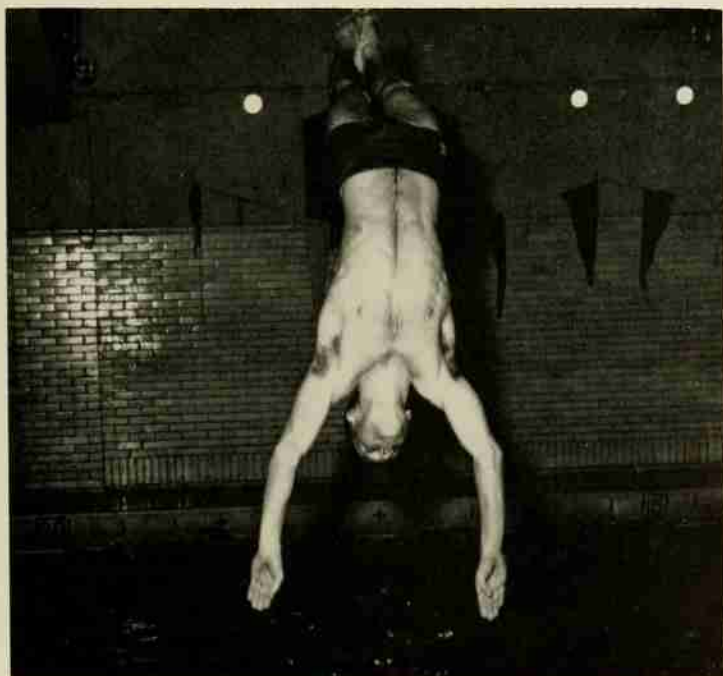

State ended the season as Tri-Champions of the ACC, with a 6-2 record.

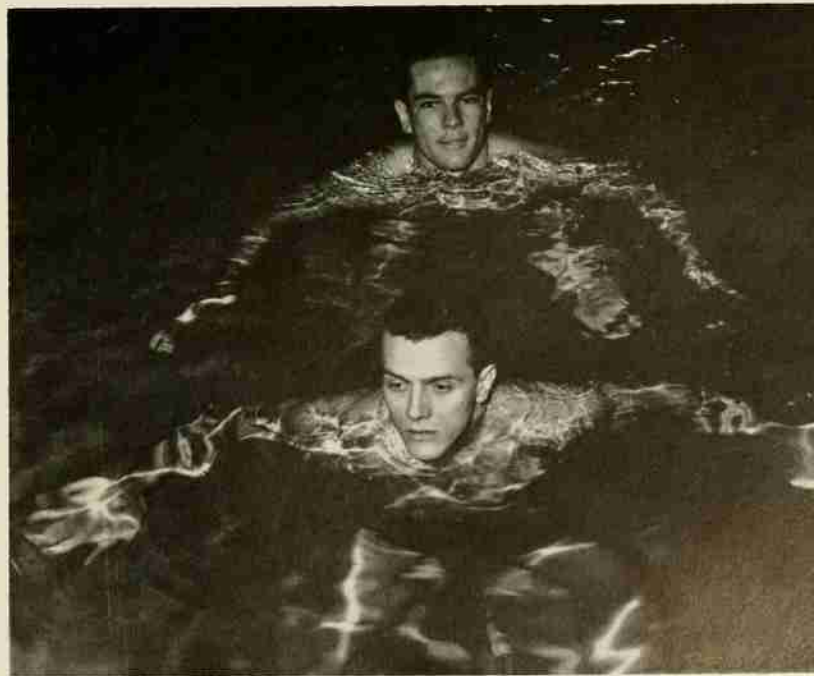

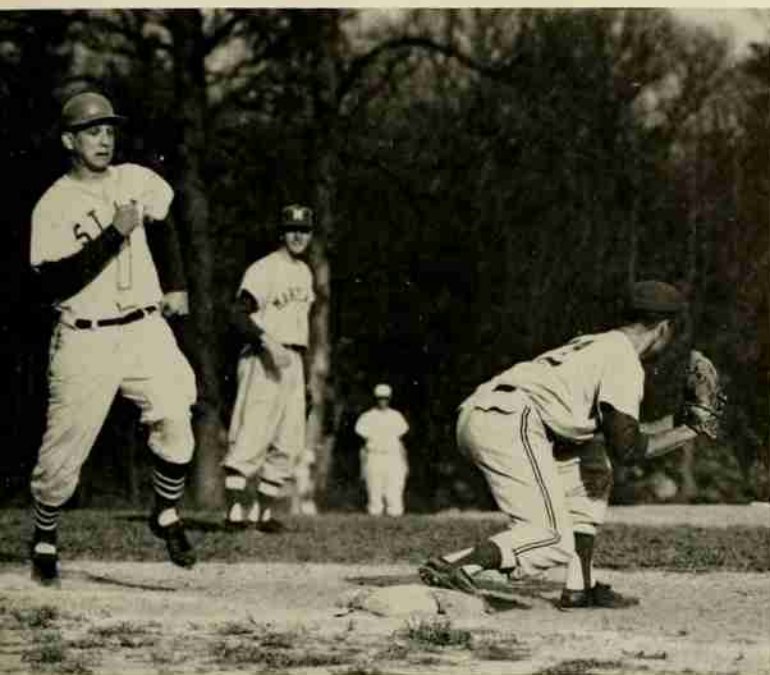

North Carolina State, who went down to the wire for the Atlantic Coast Conference baseball championship in 1960, will play a 20-game baseball schedule this spring. Coach Vic Sorrell's Wolfpack will play six non-conference opponents by April 3, before playing 13 straight conference games in a bid to capture the Wolfpack's first Atlantic Coast Conference baseball title.

Sorrell will be starting his 16th season as Wolfpack coach with his two top pitchers of last year returning in Joel Gibson and Wilson Carruthers. These two right-handers won 10 of the 12 Wolfpack victories in 1960. As the social feature of the college year, the Council sponsors two dances—the Pledge Dance in the fall semester and Spring Greeks.

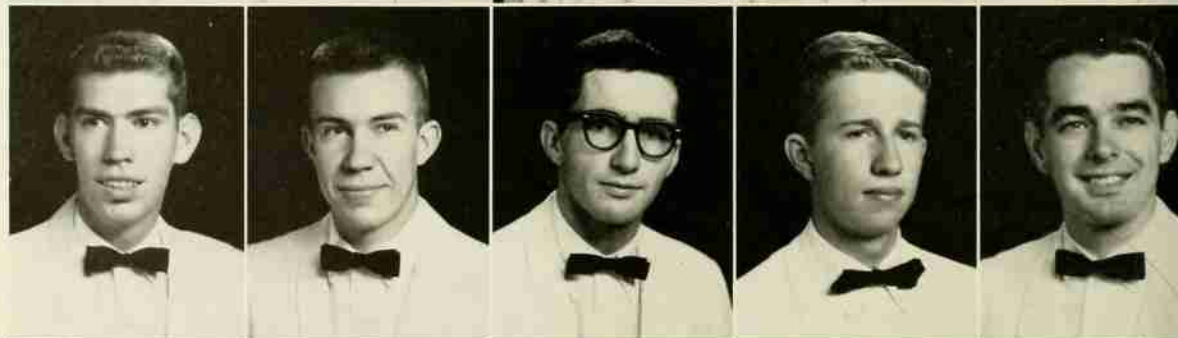
