Atkins, Johnston In Prexy Run-Off; Lowder Edges Downing For VP Post

Atkins Leads In Primary Race

 The body of the new Government president and vice-president was named last night in a vote which has resulted in requests for recounts.
 John Atkins led the presidential race with 980 of 1,223 votes and Steve Johnston trailed three votes to 919.

The first candidate, Joe Atkins, received 113 votes. Downing had called for a recount of the ballots if the recount shows no change in the outcome of the election. John Atkins will face Atkins in a run-off vote Thursday.

Atkins was practically voted out, his biggest margin coming from the freshmen, but 179 to 11, Johnston won the Sophomore 162 to 82.

Atkins' reaction to the voting was, "I was naturally pleased with the result and take it as being encouragement for my program of building stronger school spirit and atmosphere by conducting my campaign. I will urge those who supported me this time to continue their support."

Atkins will be working hard. I will want to add the thanks of Steve McGarry to my supporters. I think that all of you will want to get into the campaign this time. I am sure that I will not have the chance to visit all the students.

The Department of Student Activities is responsible for Student Government and the judicial system, the YMCA and all religious programs, the social fraternities, the Erdahl-Cloyd Union, student publications, and all student clubs and societies. The Department is now dealing with a wide range of objectives including the expansion of the student union program, increased attention to the fraternities, involving both the opening of the new fraternity housing project and broadening the concepts of the fraternity program, and the implementation of the academic integrity study being conducted with the aid of Student Government.

R. W. Shoffner replaced L. L. Ray as the Director of Foundations and Public Relations on March 1, 1964. Mr. Shoffner was formerly the Assistant to the Dean of the School of Agriculture.

The primary purpose of the foundations which his office supports is to raise funds in order to assist programs in teaching, extension, and research. Many distinguished scientists and professors are at State today because of these foundations, which raised \$1,227,000 last year.

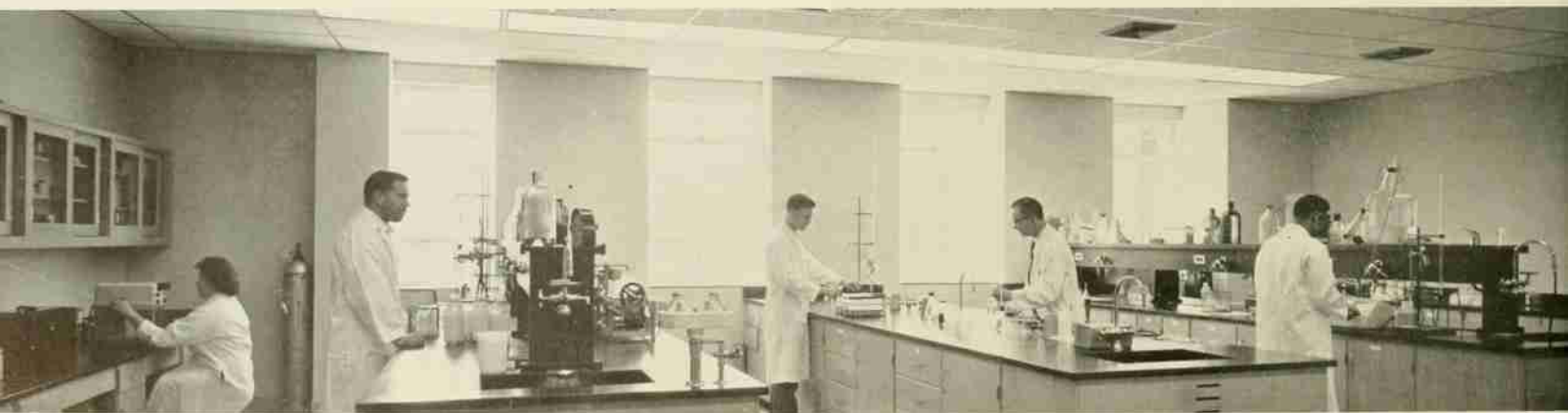

SCHOOL OF DESIGN

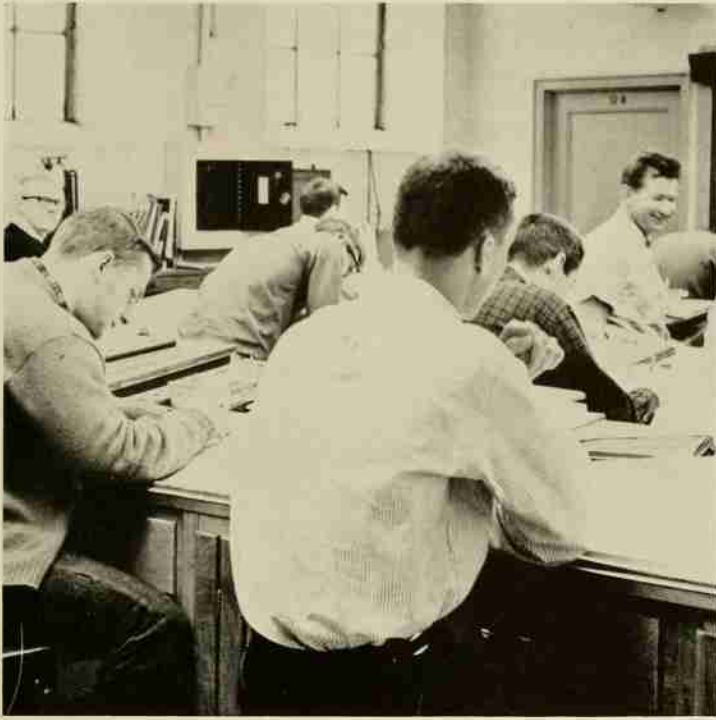

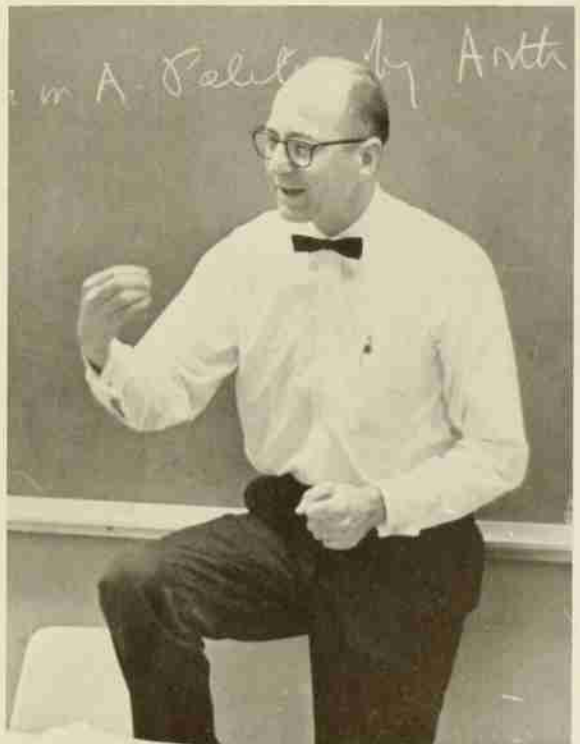

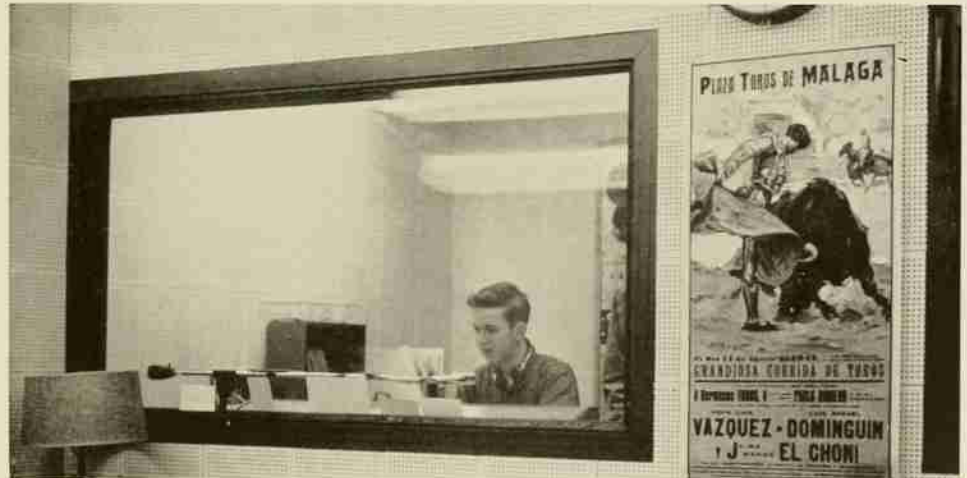
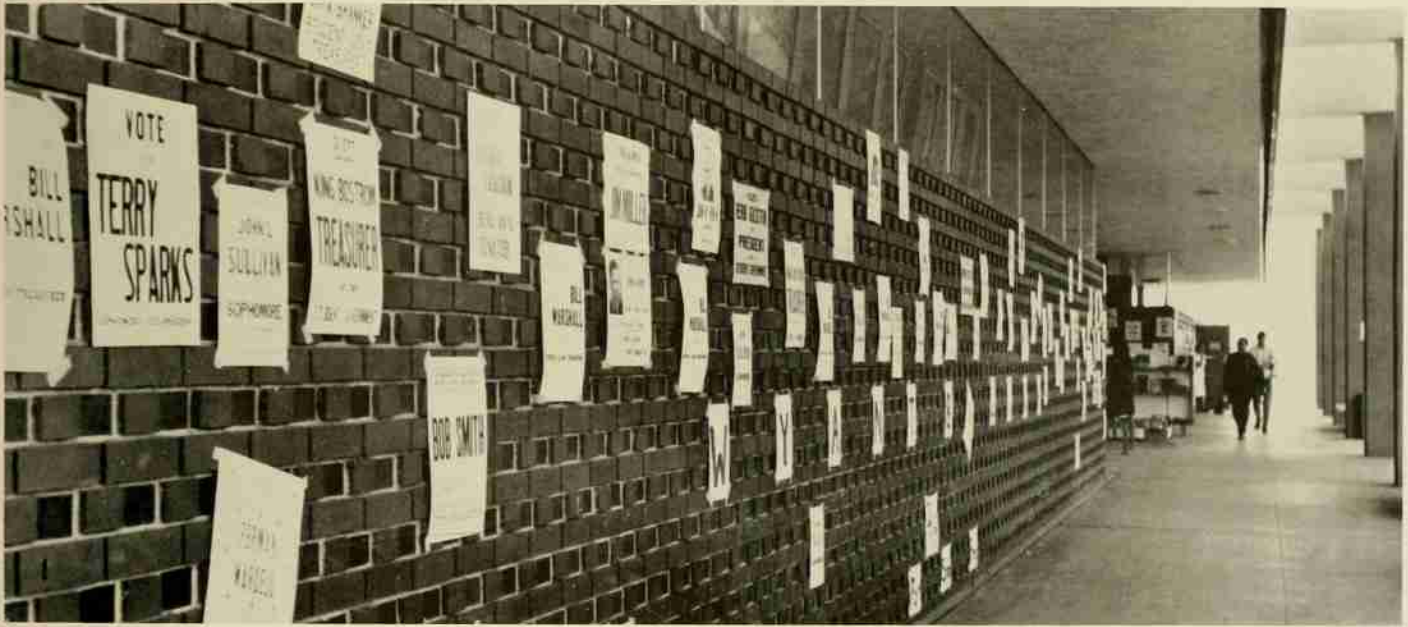
PROFESSOR C. M. ASBILL

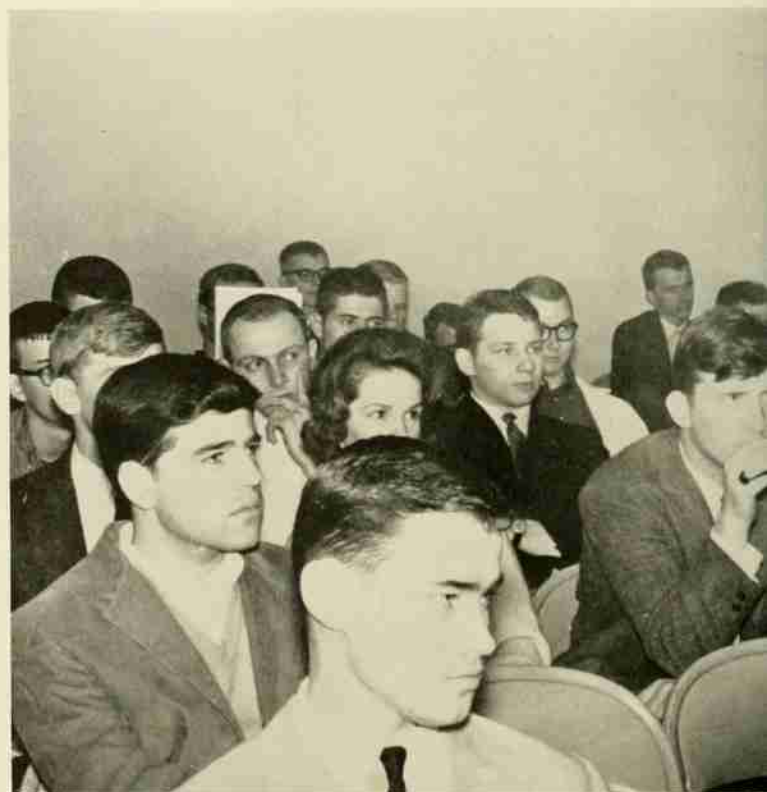


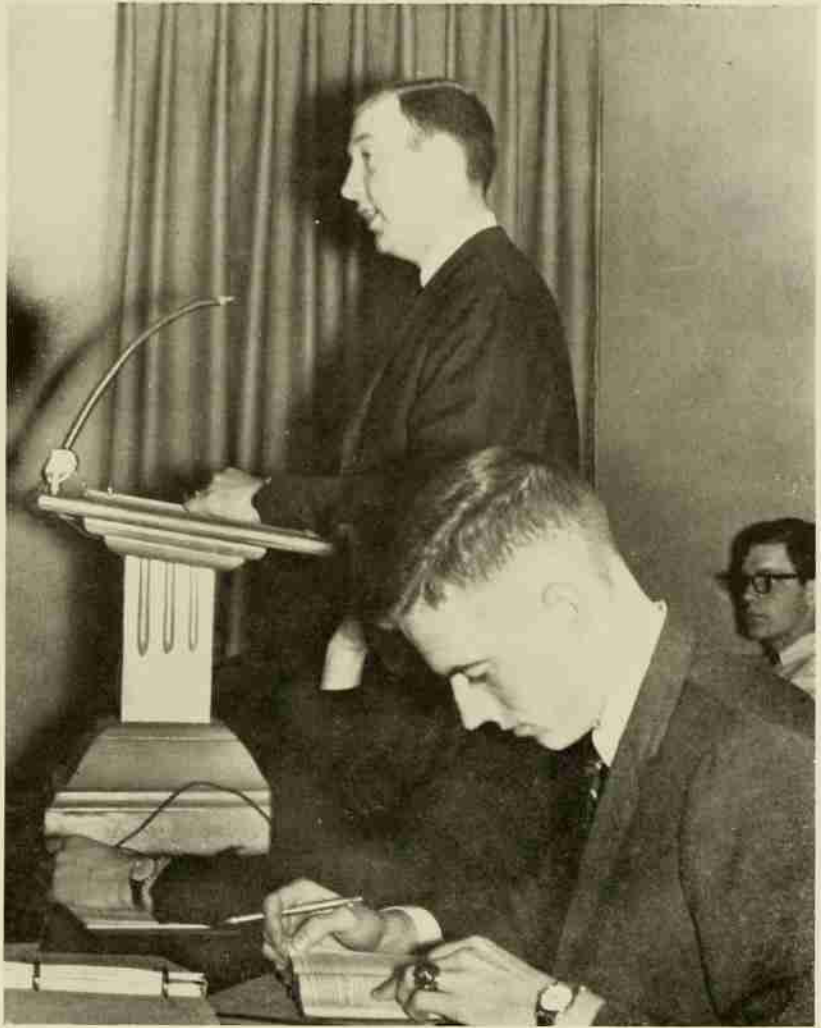

Student Government is the body charged with administering all student self-government on the campus. These student leaders coordinate all student activities and organizations and represent the student body in dealing with the faculty and administration.

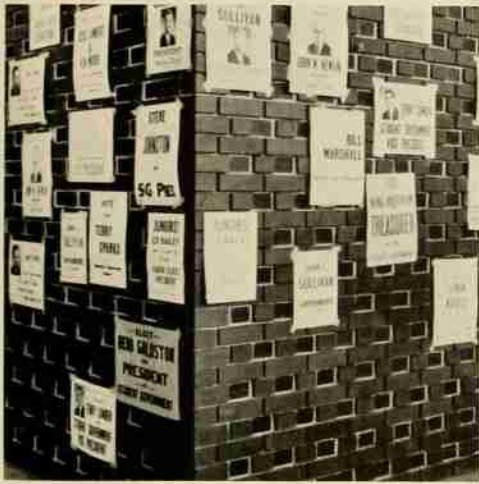

The Honor Code is a basic part of the educational process at North Carolina State. The heart of the Code is the pledge not to lie, cheat, or steal. When the pledge is violated, the Honor Code Board has the responsibility of trying the alleged violation. The Board is comprised of two sophomores, four juniors, and four seniors.

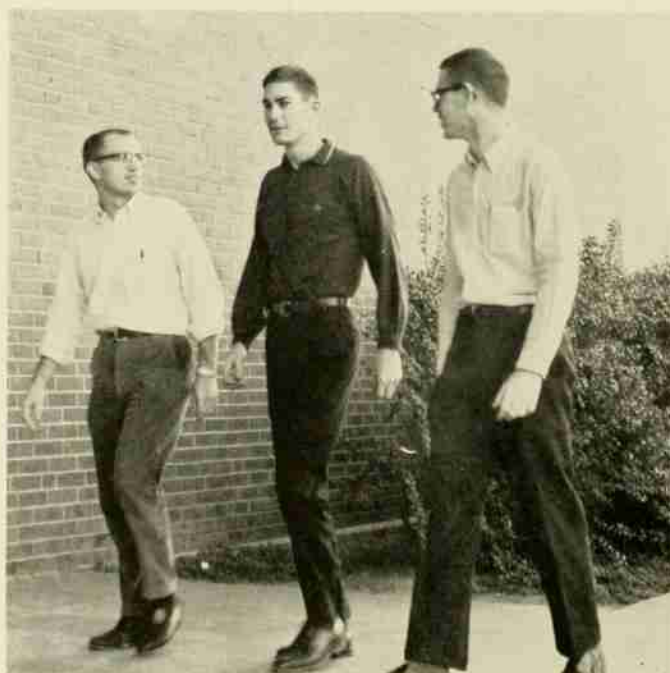

The Board of Directors is composed of faculty members who are available for advice and coordination.

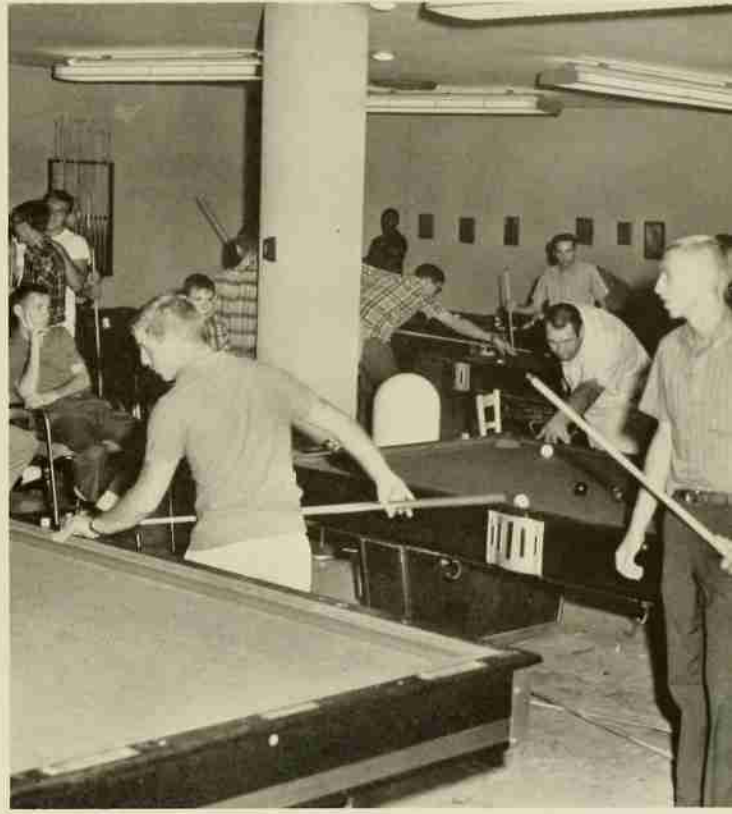

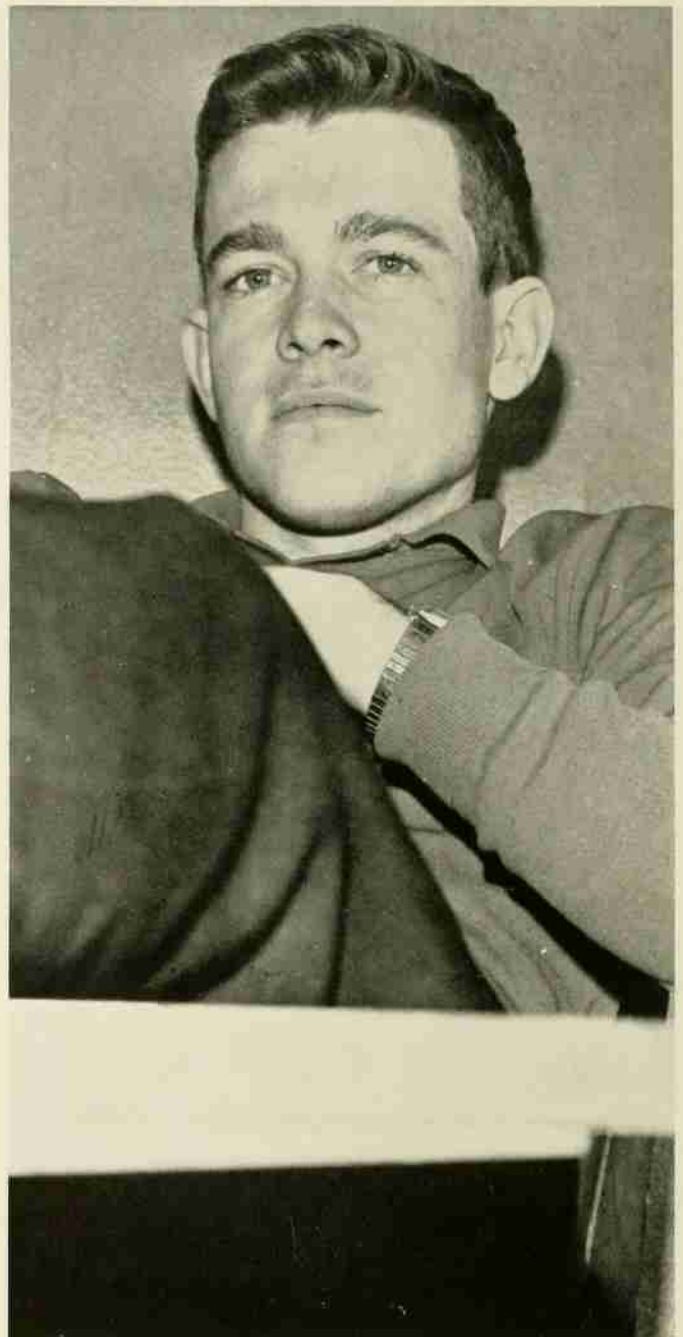
Now in its forty-fifth year, the tri-weekly newspaper informs students of the latest happenings, from news to sports.

For the first time in its long history, **The Technician** ran color pictures this year in its coverage of the Liberty Bowl football game.

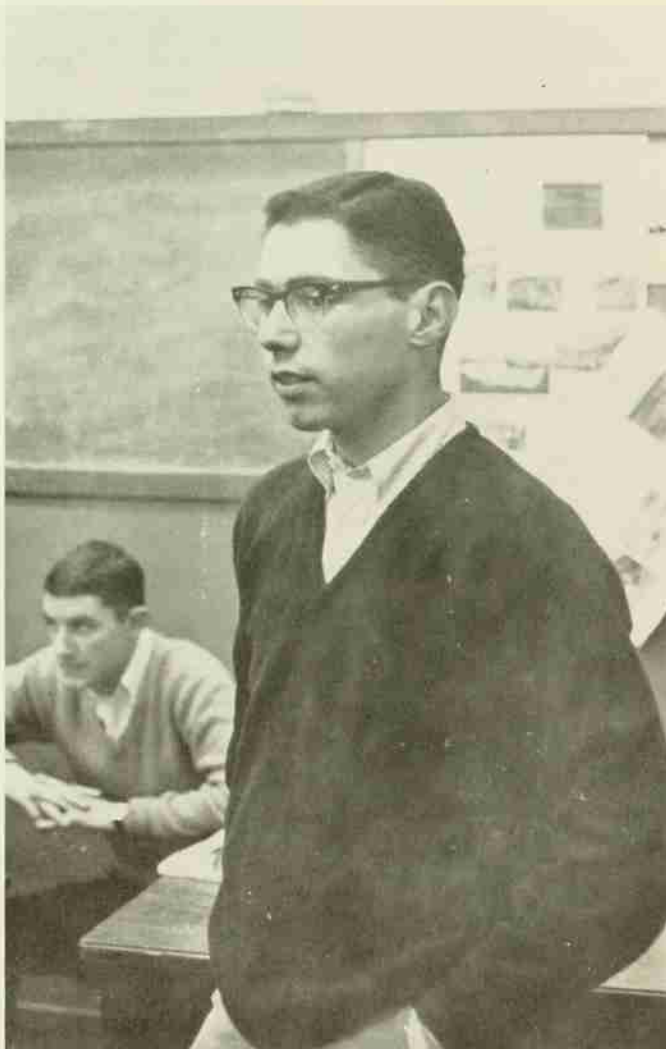

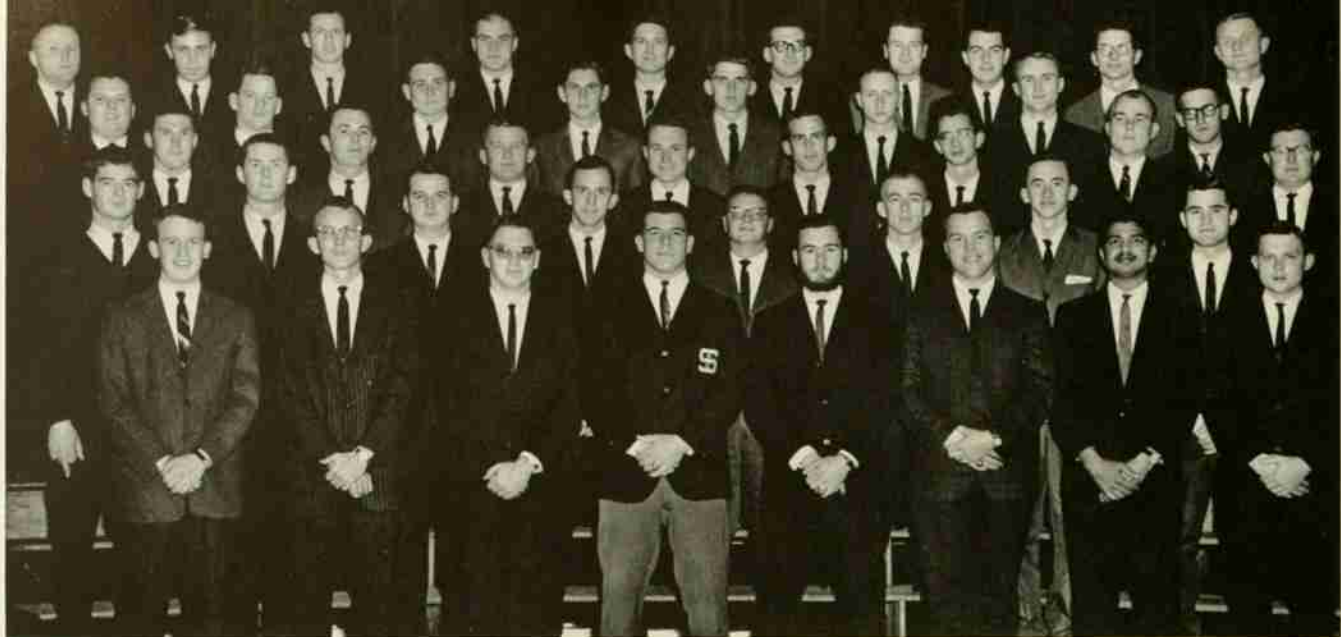

The AIP also attempts to bring about a greater understanding between the faculty and the student through such means as an annual picnic for the purpose of introducing the new students in physics to the faculty.

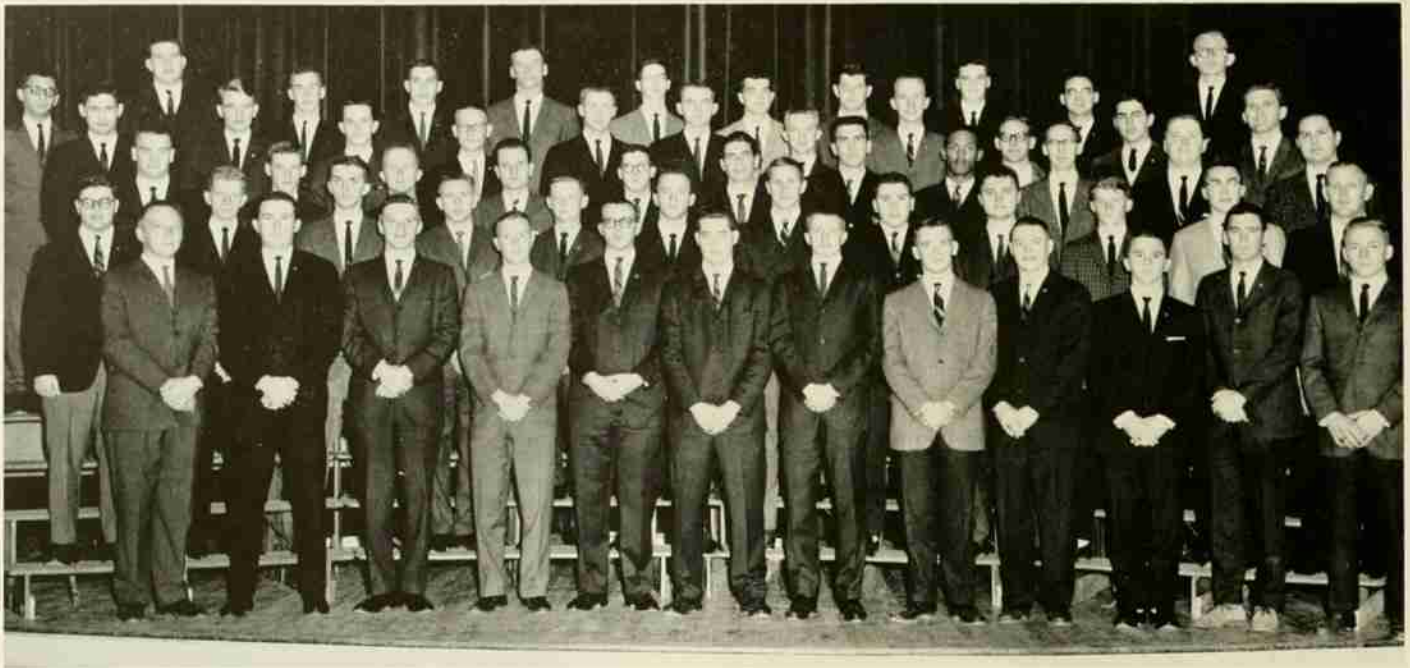
AMERICAN NUCLEAR SOCIETY

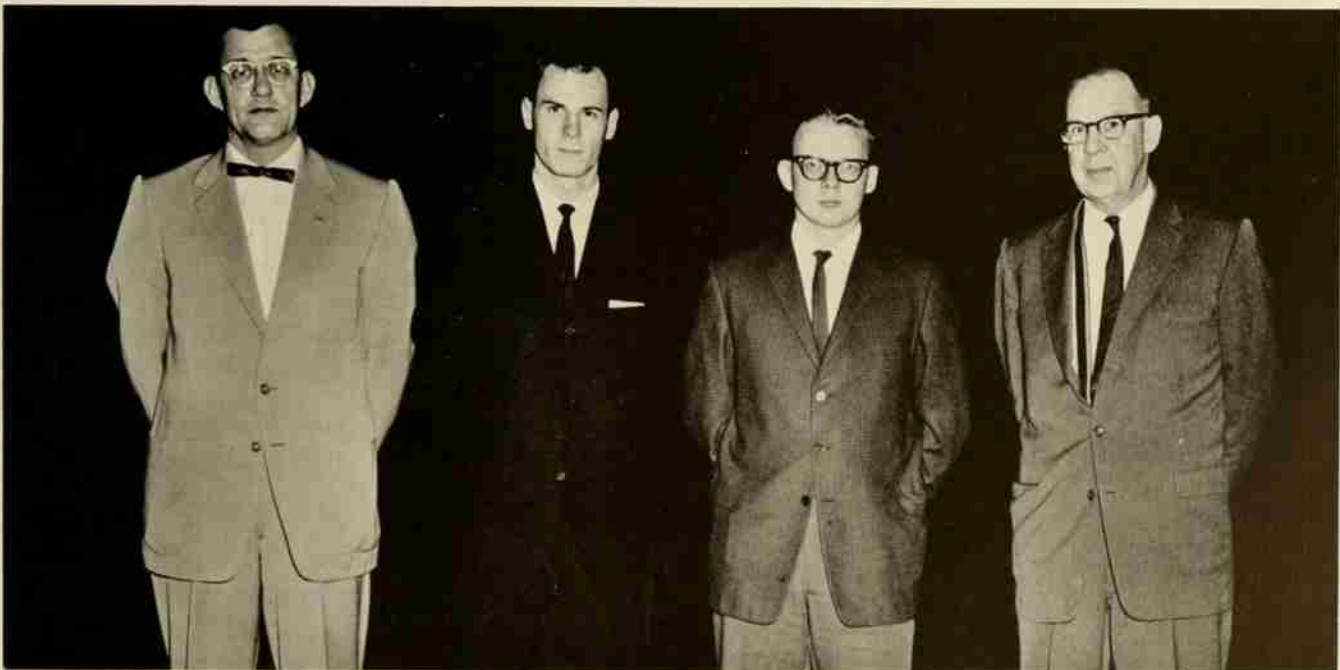

NATIONAL EDUCATION ASSOCIATION

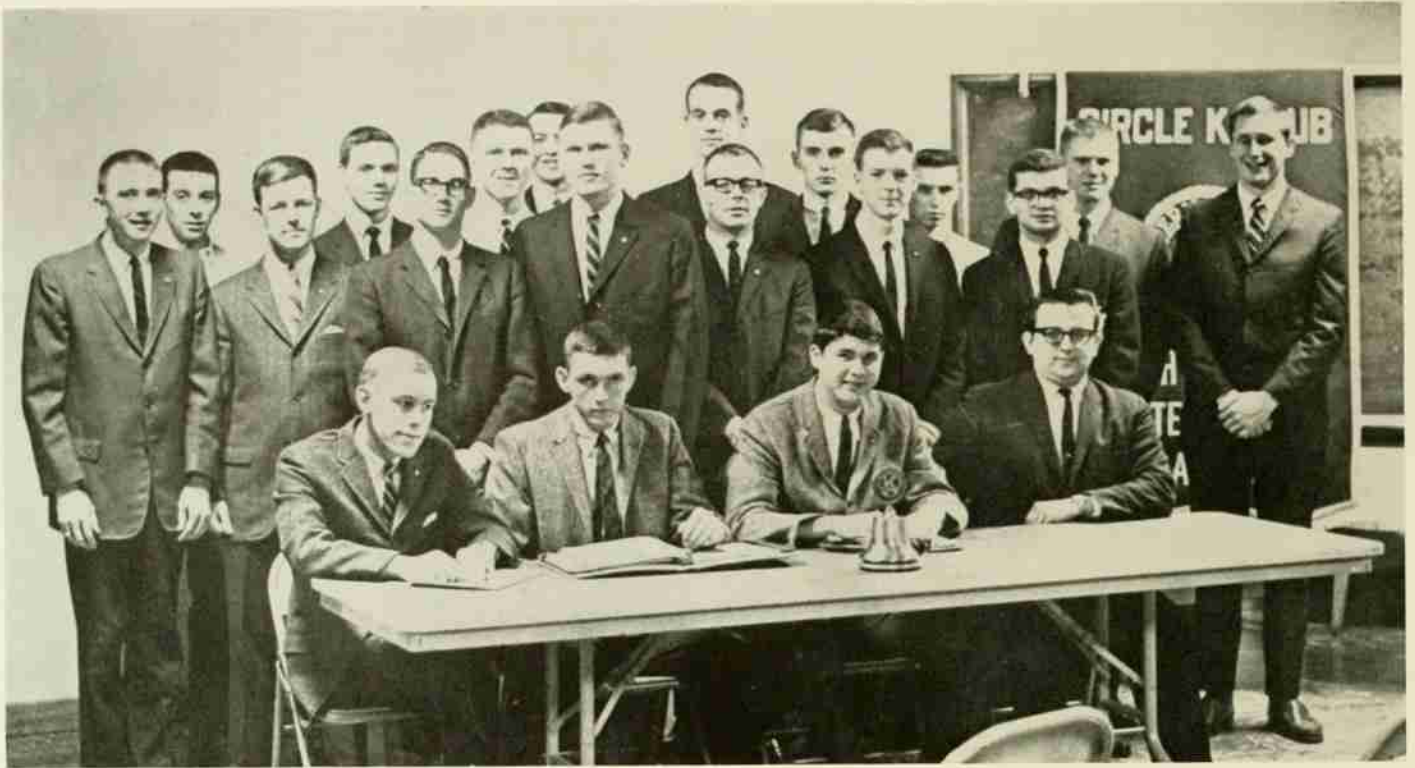

MATH AND SCIENCE EDUCATION CLUB

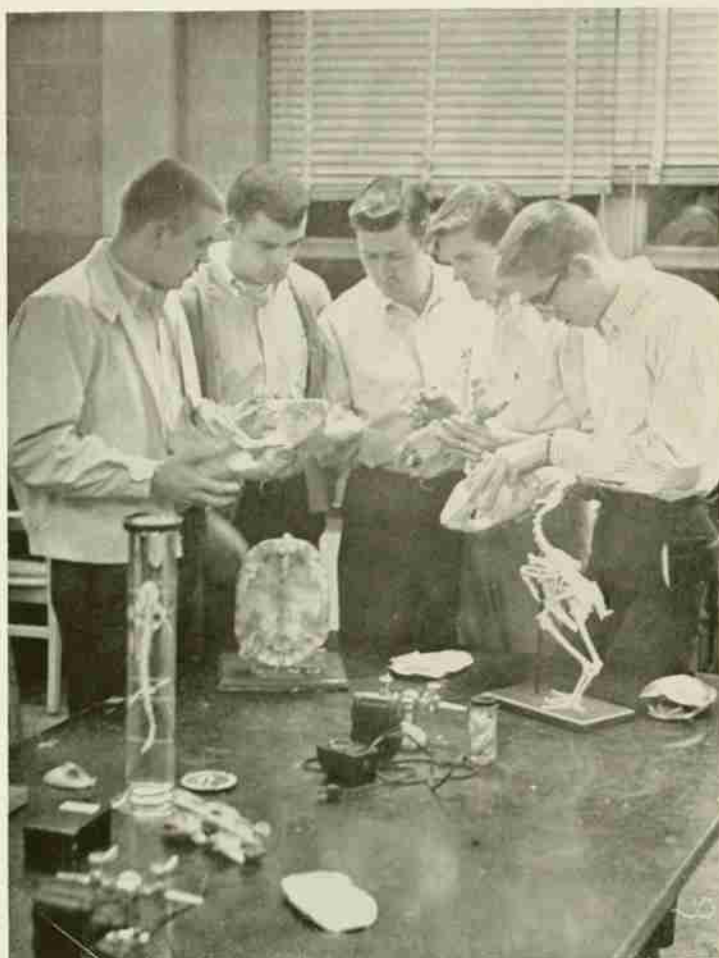

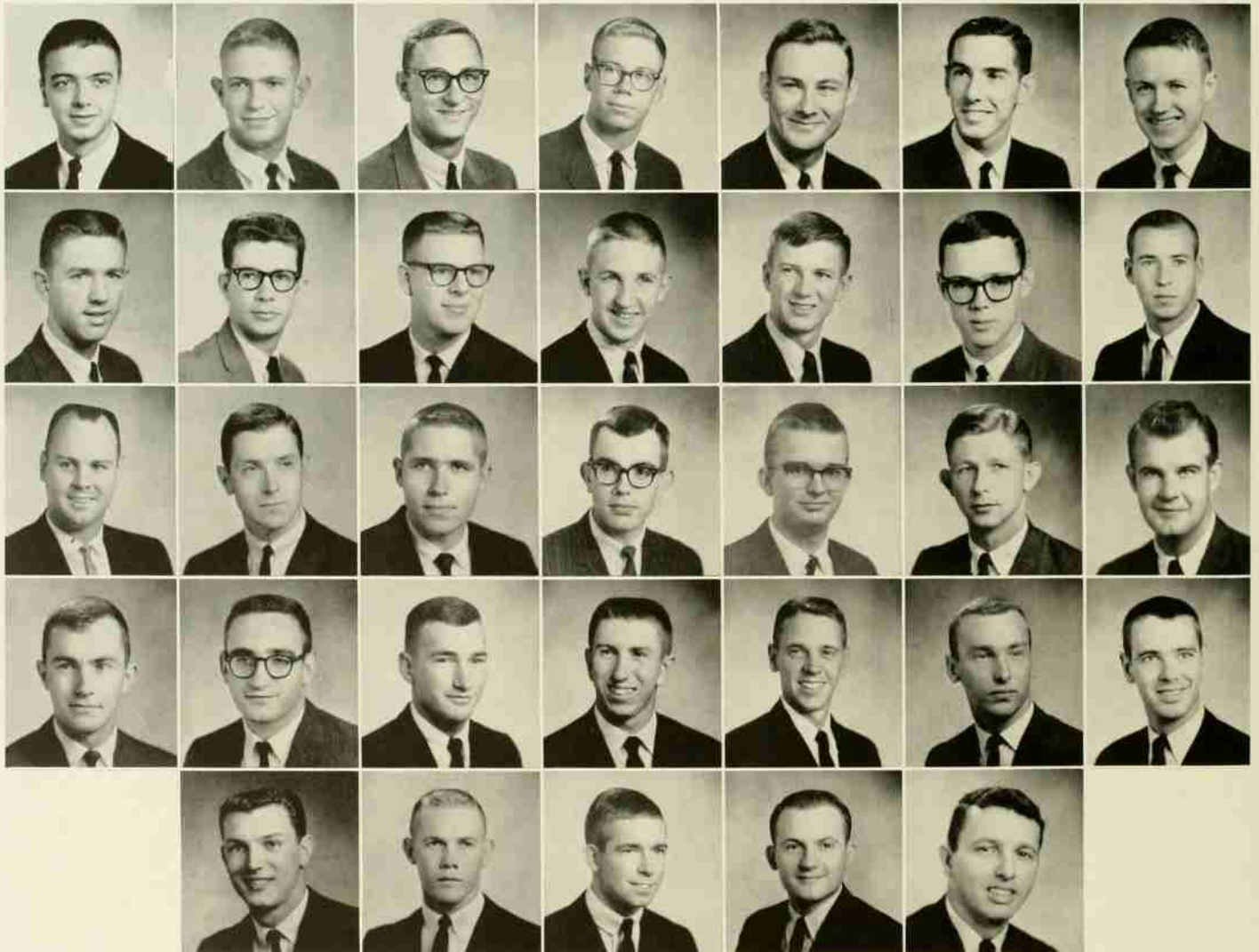
Rho Chapter of Theta Tau was founded at North Carolina State University in 1927. Since then, the fraternity has shown active participation in many projects around the campus.

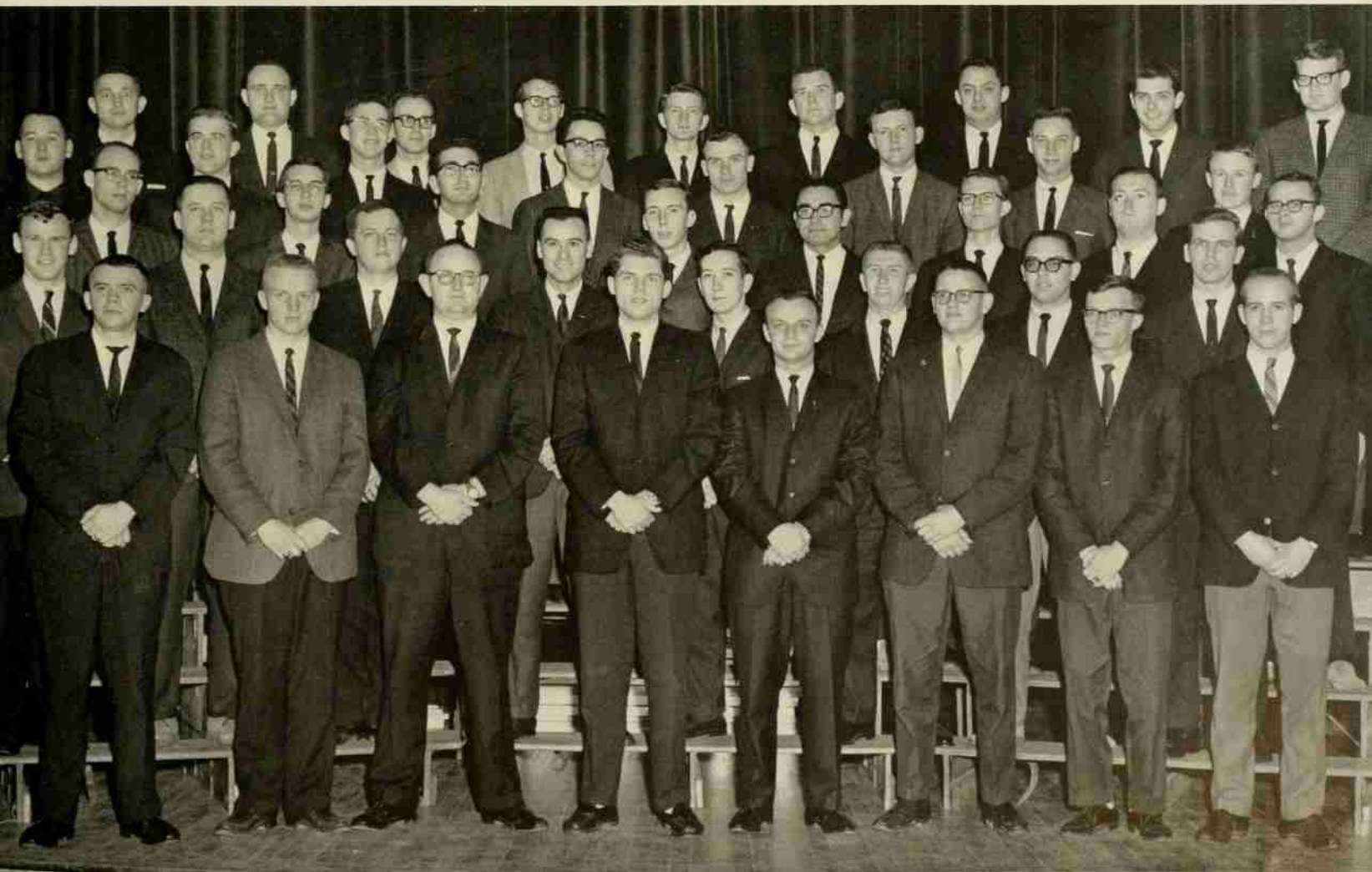

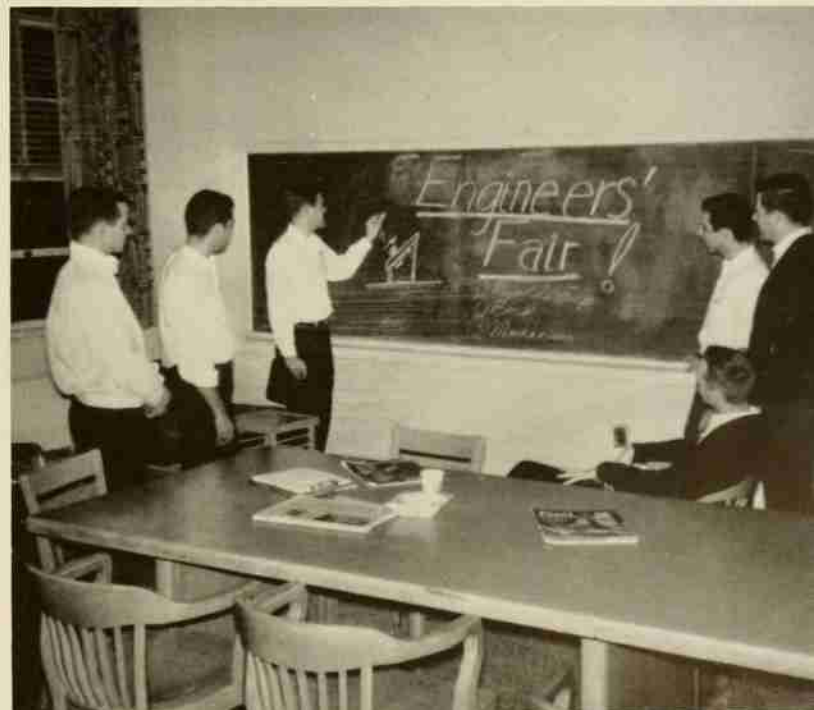

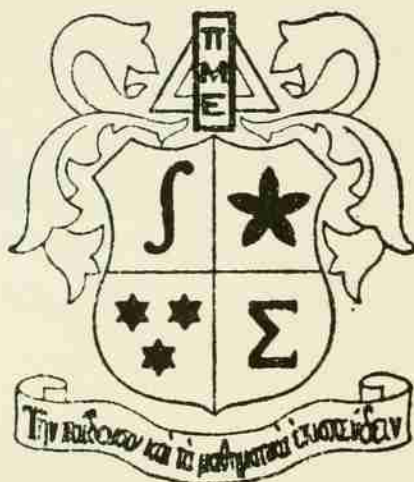

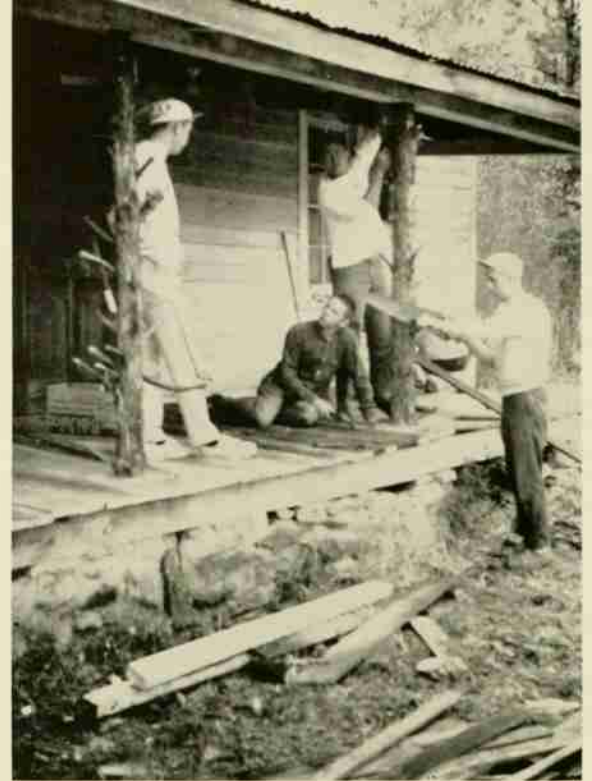
ALPHA PHI OMEGA

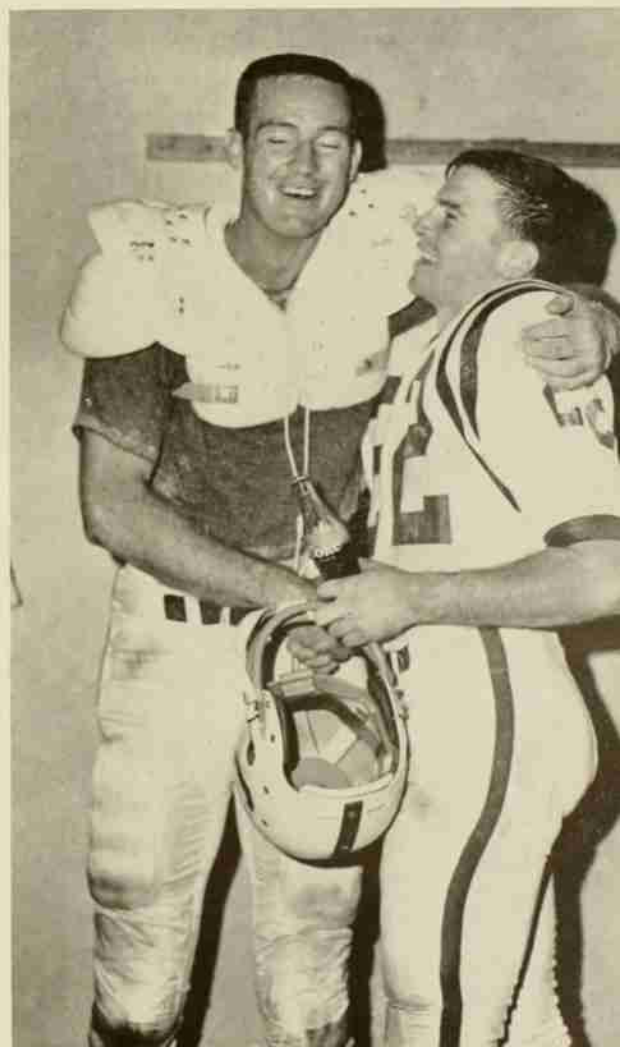
STATE 36—MARYLAND 14

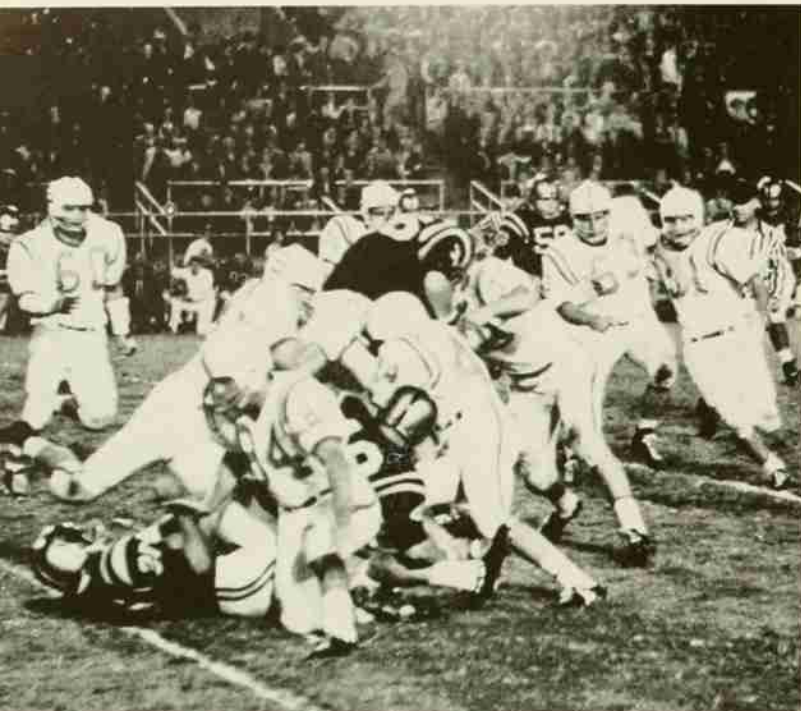

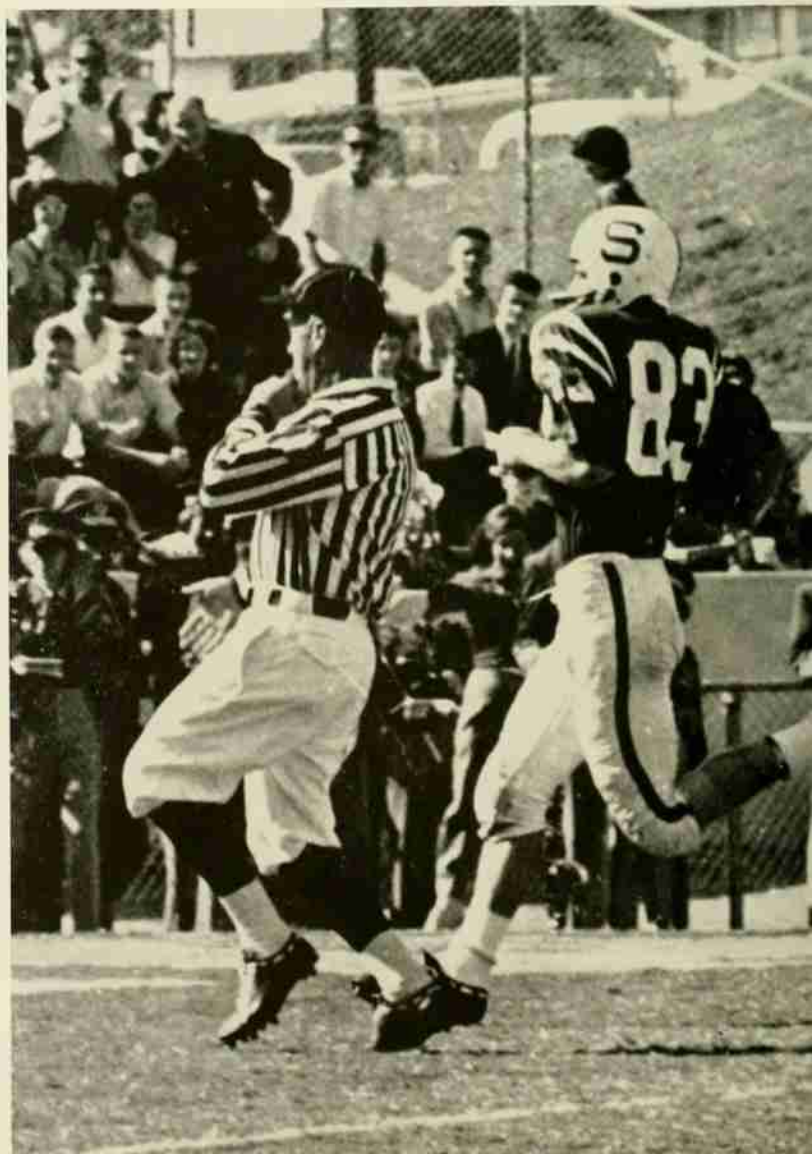

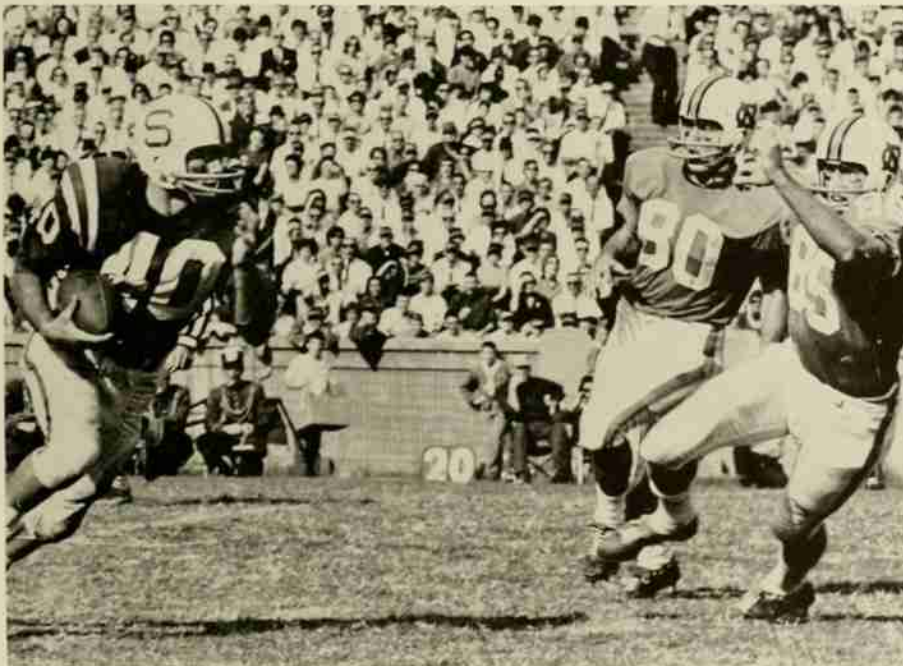

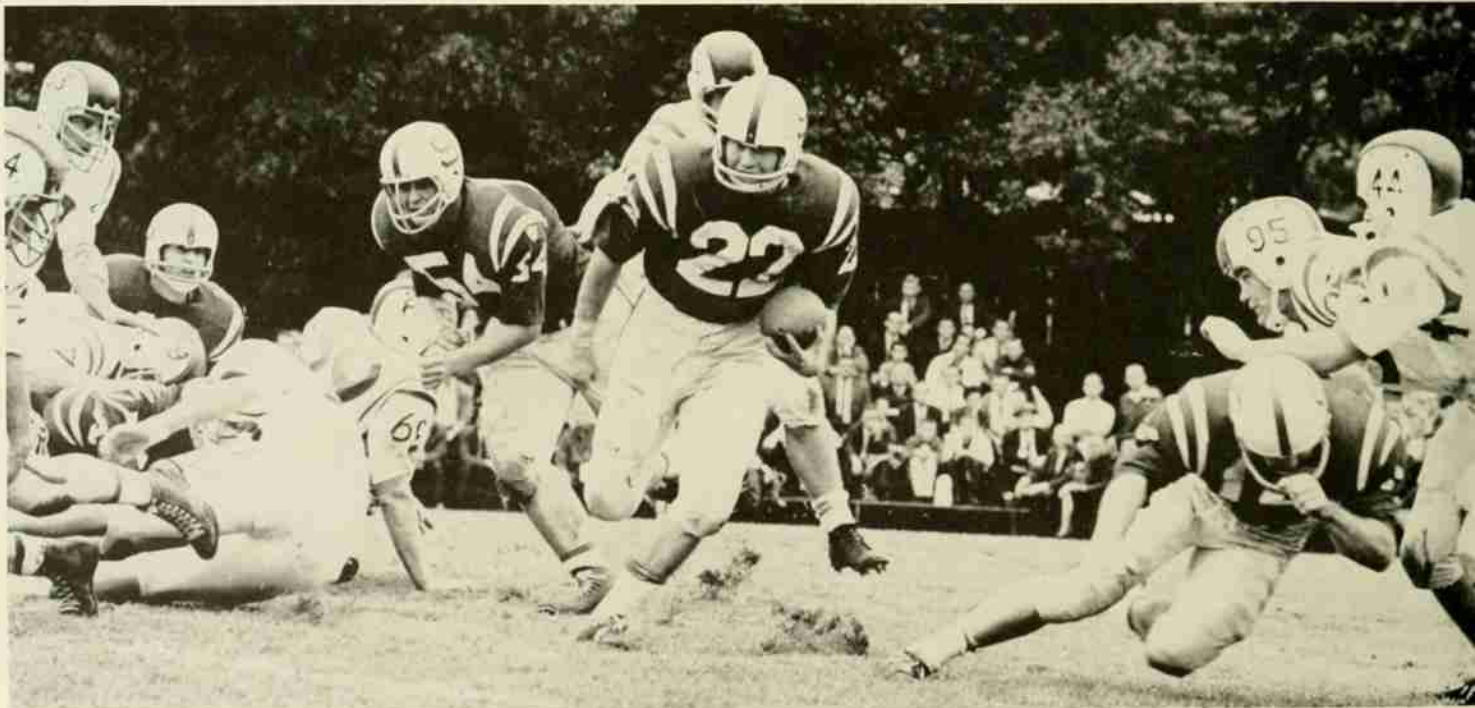


STATE 21—DUKE 7

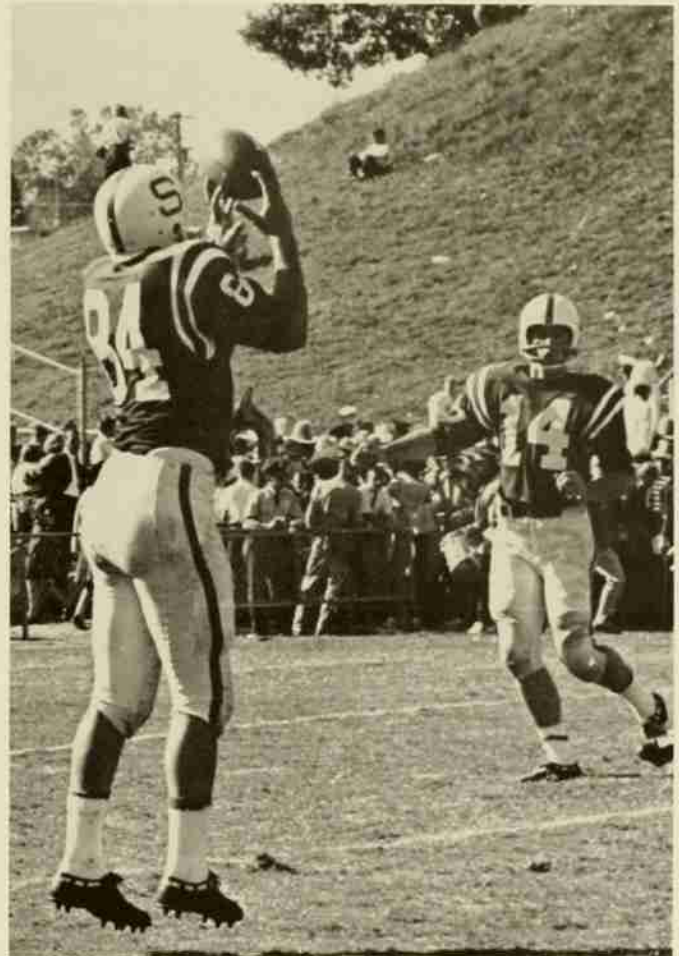
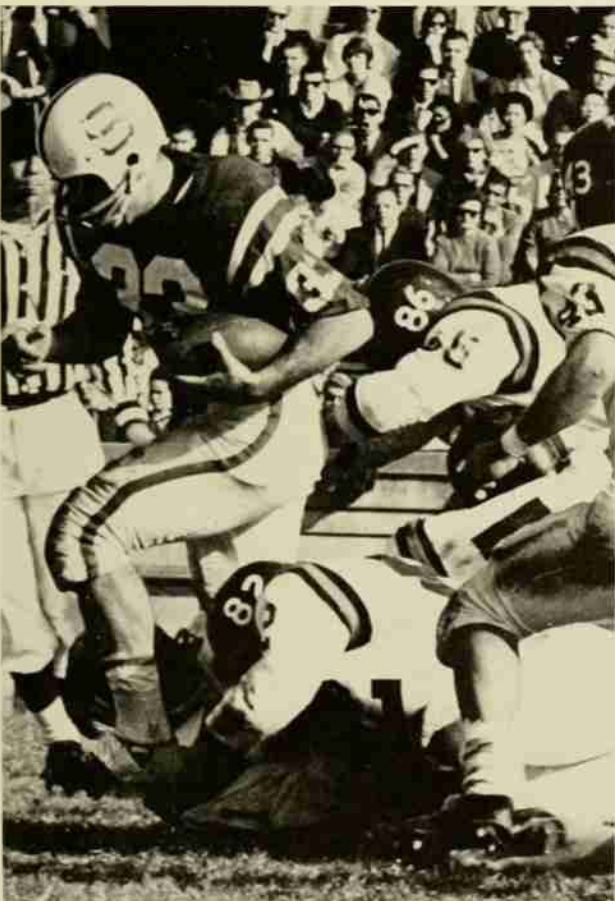
STATE 15—UNIVERSITY OF VIRGINIA 9

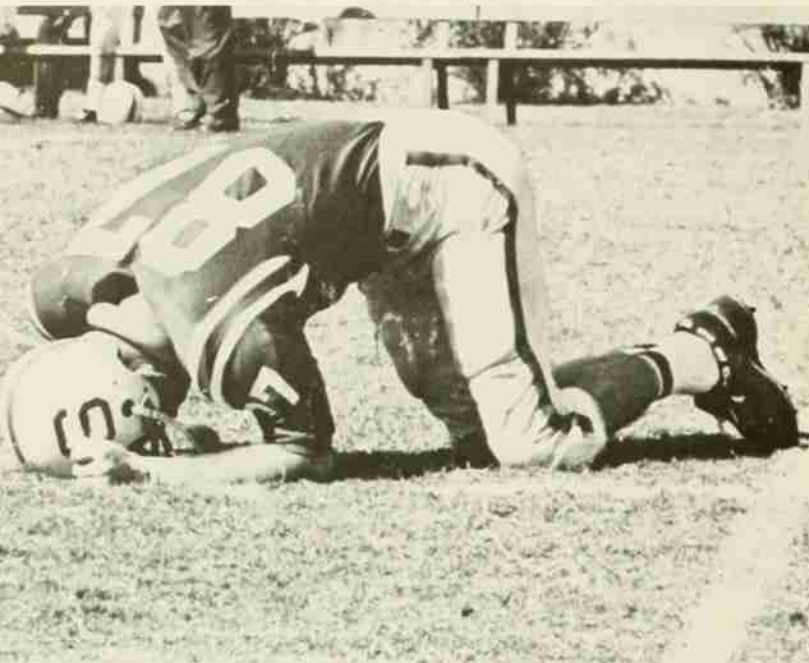

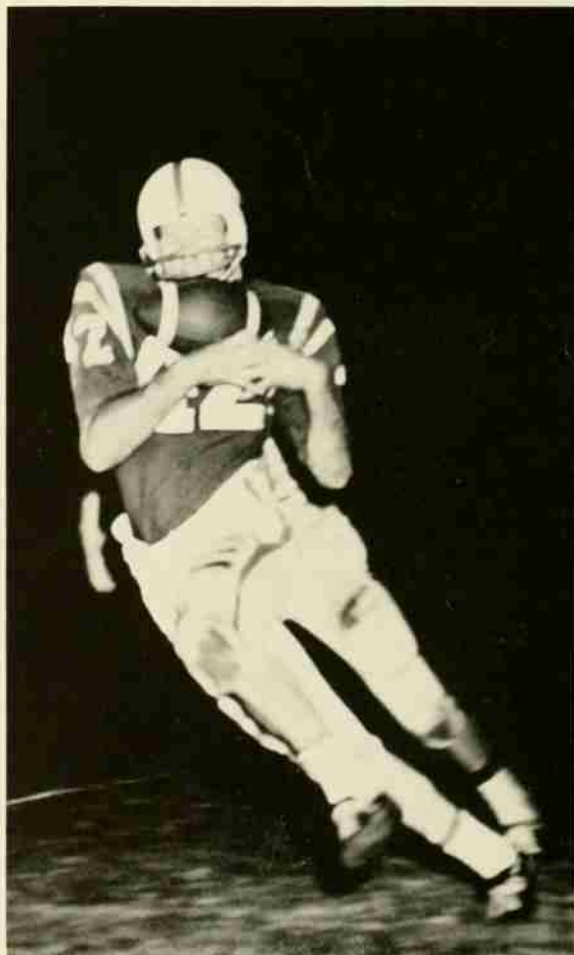
STATE 42—WAKE FOREST 0

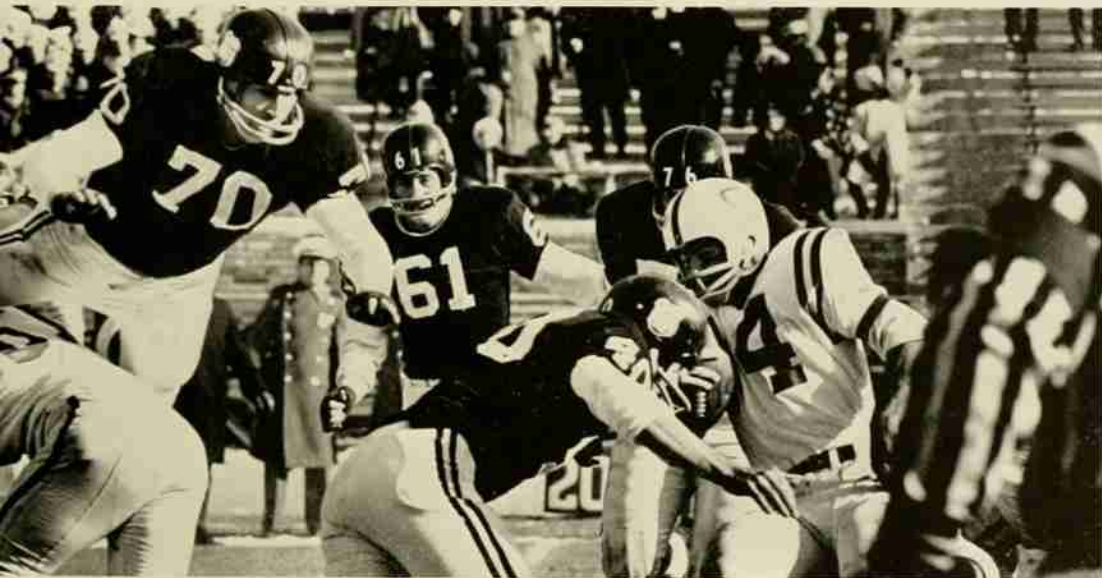
THE LIBERTY BOWL

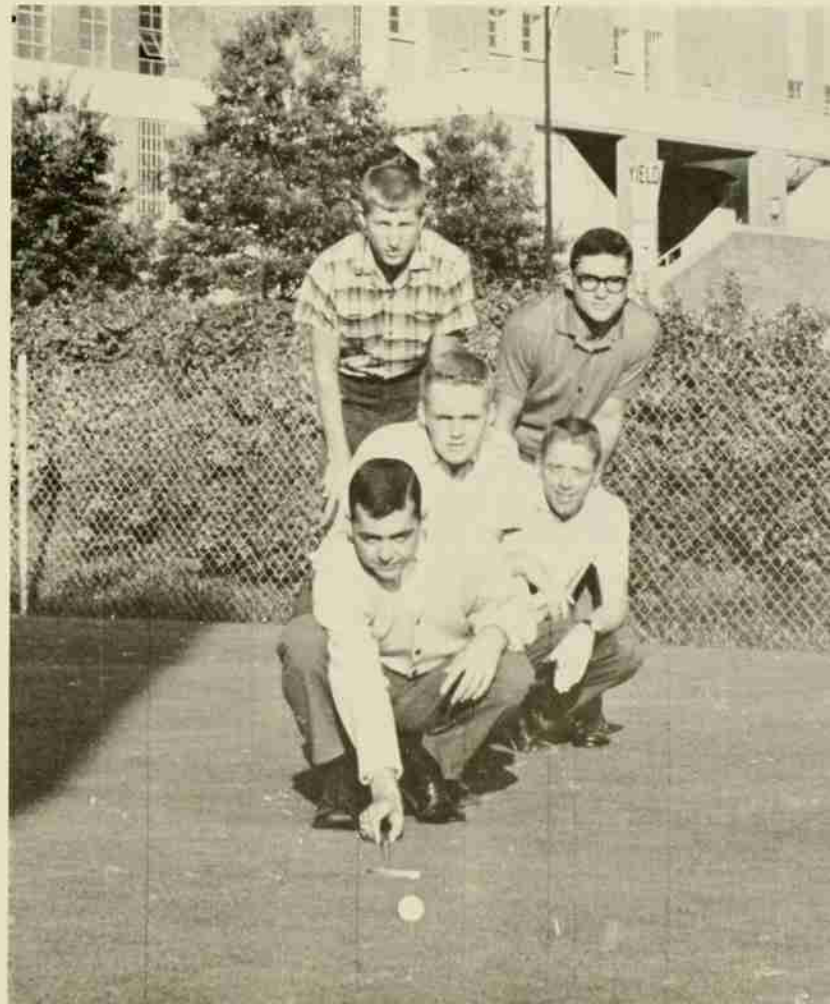

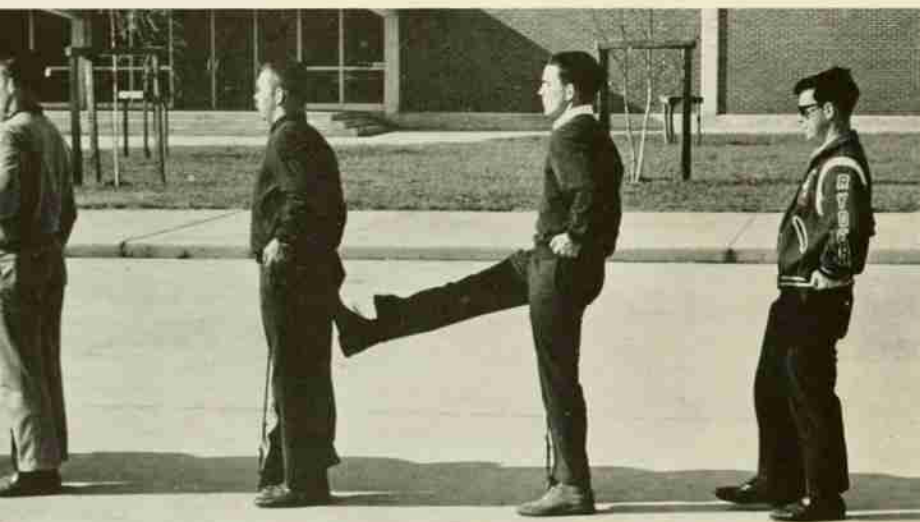
PERSHING RIFLES

The Navy Enlisted Scientific Education Program (NESEP) is a college training program for outstanding petty officers on active duty in the U. S. Navy and selected non-commissioned officers on active duty in the U. S. Marine Corps. The program leads to appointment to commissioned grade of ensign, U. S. Navy or second lieutenant, U. S. Marine Corps.

NESEP was established to meet the demand for personnel with a high order of technical competence in the scientific and engineering fields to cope with the problems and complexities of modern warfare and to add to the national pool of engineering and scientific talent. The NESEP was established at N. C. State in 1961.

Candidates for the program are chosen by a highly selective competitive procedure. Acceptance by the college or university is the final hurdle prior to entrance of an appointee.



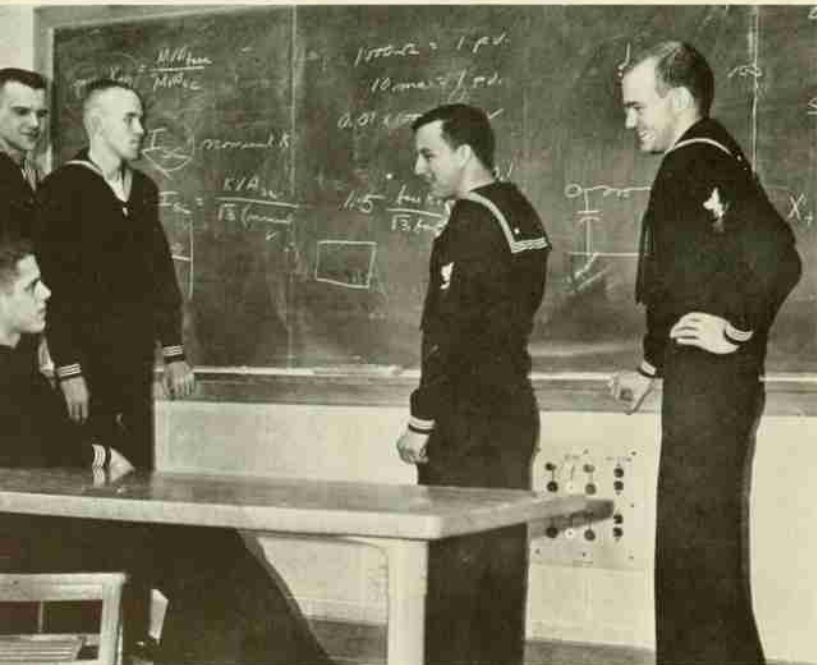
