



S. B. Simmons, State Supervisor of Vocational Agriculture in Negro Schools, B.S.A. A. & T. College, B.S.A. University of Illinois. He has done graduate work at universities of California, Colorado, and Kansas State College. He has taught in Pennsylvania, Kansas, and has served as itinerant teacher trainer at Tuskegee, Alabama before coming to North Carolina, his home state. He is regarded as one of the pioneers of the NFA organization and has served in an executive capacity, first as executive secretary-treasurer, now as executive treasurer. The late President F. D. Roosevelt honored him with a certificate for his one-year service with the selective service system, and President Harry S. Truman has also honored him with a certificate and medal for his service during World War II. When the state reduced the State Appeal Board to one in the state, Governor R. Gregg Cherry appointed him to represent the Negro and agriculture. He has served in an executive capacity on a number of committees in the interest of the progress of the state and the Negro race. He has held his present position since 1924.
