Rise, fall of Valvano Empire fortunately reversed

Perhaps State's 1982-83 national championship basketball season can best be described as the rise and fall of the Jim Valvano empire. Fortunately, for the enthusiastic Wolfpack coach and his "team of destiny", the chronology was reversed.

The fall came first. After the early edition of the Wolfpack jumped out to a 7-1 record and a ranking as high as 12th in the country, State fell upon hard times when leading scorer Derek Whittenburg fell on Virginia guard Othell Wilson's foot January 12 and broke his foot just after halftime. He had scored a phenomenal 27 points in the first half.

Suddenly, one third of the isosceles triangle of seniors Thurl Bailey, Sidney Lowe and Whittenburg was missing. When Whittenburg went out of the lineup, State went out of the polls. The Pack lost five of the next six games, but those defeats were to national powers Virginia, North Carolina and Memphis State, tough foes even when a team is full-force.

That stretch of losses started the doubts, and it marked the first of many times State was "down for the count." But before such severe adversity claimed the upper hand, the Wolfpack was back on its feet, winning eight of the next 10 games including a stunning 70-63 upset of third-ranked North Carolina February 19. That upset may very well have been the turning point of the season.

State won that game without Whittenburg. The Wolfpack had regrouped and reloaded. Lowe and Bailey never played better. The sophomores — Terry Gannon, Lorenzo Charles and Cozell McQueen — matured ahead of schedule, and a freshman, Ernie Myers, Whittenburg's replacement, contributed 15.1 points per game.

Gannon, like Whittenburg a bombardier, dazzled the crowds with his "downtown" range, hitting 53 of 90 attempts from beyond the three-point line in the ACC's first year under the new rules (three-point play and 30-second clock). Charles answered the need for a power forward who could muscle inside, and McQueen, averaging only three rebounds a game before the infamous "football", lifted his average to 7.1.

The Wolfpack was on the rise, and there was only one thing that could give State a greater high — the return of Whittenburg. He was back on the hardwood with a healed fifth metatarsal Feb. 27 at Virginia, but the rest of his body was less than 70 percent, and the Pack fell, 86-75. But the team was getting stronger, and finally, on March 5, State put it all together — scoring 130 points (the highest point production by a collegiate team this year) against Wake Forest to wrap up a tie for third place with Maryland in the Atlantic Coast Conference regular season.

If those points weren't a premonition, then State's next game against Wake should have been. In the first round of the ACC Tournament in Atlanta, the Wolfpack slipped by the Deacons, 71-70, when Charles canned a pressure free throw with :03 on the clock. State then knocked off No. 5 ranked North Carolina again, 91-84 in

overtime, and No. 2 ranked Virginia, 81-78, to win the coveted crown.

Bailey, Whittenburg and Lowe were all-ACC Tournament selections, and Lowe, who broke the ACC record for most assists in a season (North Carolina's National Player-of-the-Year Phil Ford had 753) with 762, was the Most Valuable Player in the ACC Tournament. Lowe and Bailey were also named first team all-ACC with North Carolina's Michael Jordan and Sam Perkins and Virginia's Ralph Sampson.

But the regular-season honors were overshadowed by the ACC Tournament championship. The last time the Wolfpack had won the ACC Tournament was in 1974, the same year State captured its first NCAA National Championship.

But that year, the Pack had its own two-time National Player-of-the-Year in David Thompson, the tallest center in the country in 7-4 Tom Burleson, a point guard who didn't miss free throws named Monte Towe, another lightning quick guard named Mo Rivers and a power forward who would become a major leaguer for the Baltimore Orioles named Tim Stoddard. With that talent, those guys were supposed to win it all, and they did.

This year's team was not supposed to be playing basketball in April. To say State's trip to the Final Four and eventual national championship was expected would be an understatement. Whittenburg was not "supposed" to return. The doctors pronounced his collegiate career over the week of January 12 and, when he went out, the sympathy cards poured out.

Bailey was not "supposed" to shine the consensus all-Americans. His parents asked him not to play street ball during his formative high school years, preferring instead a culturally rich upbringing that included playing three musical instruments instead of playing the hoops with the asphalt contingency. The articulate senior learned the moves and the shots and carried the poise from his personal life onto the court. In the meantime, he became the 11th all-time scorer in State's basketball history with 1,495 points.

Charles was not supposed to average 11.1 points and 8.3 rebounds in State's six games of the NCAA Tournament. Gannon was not supposed to keep bombing shots from downtown when they didn't count three points anymore. In fact, Lowe was the only one who did what he

was supposed to — he made assists and he didn't make turnovers.

But the "Cardiac Pack" really outdid itself in the NCAA, transcending the wildest expectations by making last-minute miracles seem commonplace.

- Beating Pepperdine in double overtime, 69-67. Down by six points with 70 seconds left in first overtime, McQueen put in a rebound after a missed free throw with :06 left to send the game into second overtime. Whittenburg hit 8-for-10 free throws in the second overtime.

- Beating Nevada-Las Vegas, 71-70. UNLV, which had led by 12 in the second half, led 70-69 and was on the foul line for a one-and-one with :32 left. Bailey banked in his own rebound with :04 left on the clock for the win.

- Beating Utah, 75-56. A breather against another team that wasn't supposed to be where it was, State led 68-48 with 2:23 left. Whittenburg scored 27. State shot a phenomenal 78.9 percent (15-for-19) in the second half, 68.3 (28-for-41) for the game.

- Beating Virginia, 63-62. Virginia led 62-61 and was on the foul line for one shot with :54 left. Charles hit both ends of a two-shot foul with :03 left for the victory and the West Regional Championship. Whittenburg was named MVP.

- Beating Georgia, 67-60. State controlled the tempo against the speedy Bulldogs to stretch its lead to 59-41. Bailey and Whittenburg scored 20 points apiece, and McQueen pulled down 13 rebounds to send the Pack to the national championship game.

- Beating Houston, 54-52. State trailed 50-44 with 3:56 left and forced the Cougars to the line, where they converted just 2-of-5. Lowe and Whittenburg connected two bombs apiece as the Pack tied the game, 52-52. Whittenburg's short 35-footer dunked by Charles with :01 left clinched it. The Wolfpack held the Phi Slamma Jamma to just one dunk. Lowe, Bailey and Whittenburg were named all-Tournament.

In all, State had come from behind in seven of its last nine games to win. The newspapers echoed phrases like "tiptoeing along a tightrope," "flirting with defeat," "down for the count but not out" and "destiny's darlings."

Heroes were everywhere. Charles' free throws and dunk. Lowe's assists. McQueen's tap-ins. Gannon's bombs. Bailey's second effort. Whittenburg's second chance.

It all added up to a death-defying march to the '83 national championship.

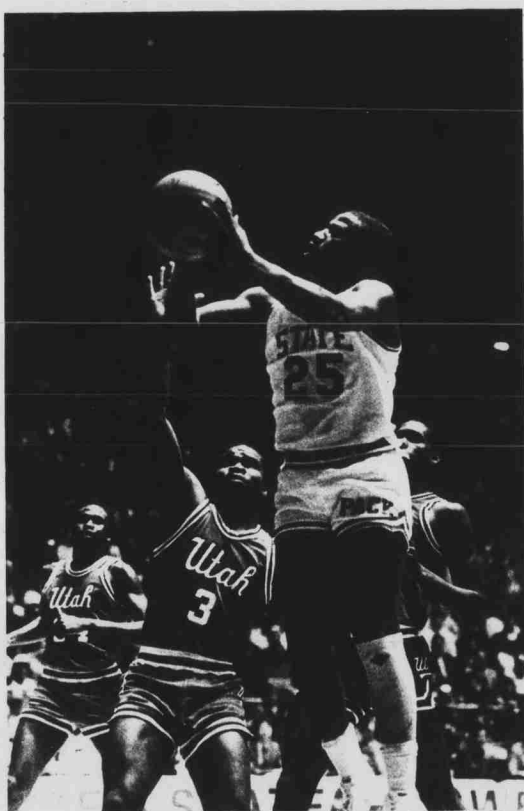
Ausley and Dornburg have been through the lean years as well as the

big ones with the Pack and Ausley, for one, gives the '83 team the excitability check.

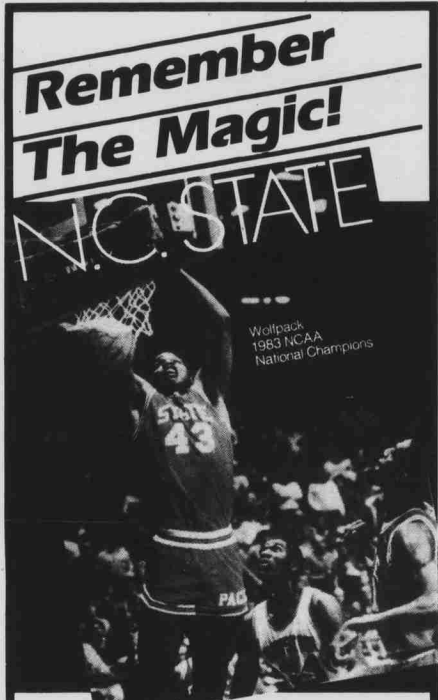

I know it was a tough road because we had to win one of the great games ever in the (ACC) Tournament. Then we were down seven against UCLA in the second overtime and came back and won that one. There were some exciting moments, but this ballcuz wasn't even supposed to win in Atlanta. I'm not even sure we were supposed to have beaten Wake Forest. This one has been totally different. This one's been much more exciting."

Dornburg felt the ups and downs

Cardiac Kids' Road to Albuquerque

Here are game-by-game capsules of State's drive to the national championship:

State 103, Western Carolina 66: Nov. 29 in Raleigh. The Wolfpack's first experience with the ACC's experimental rules yielded eight of 10 State three-pointers, including a 6-of-7 effort by Whittenburg (28 points), and the school's highest output since the 1979-80 season. Bailey (27), Lowe (school-record 18 assists) and Myers (18), making his collegiate debut, led the way. Record: 1-0.

State 100, N.C. A&T 70: Dec. 3 in Raleigh. The Pack cracks the century mark again, bagging the Aggies on the boards, 47-32. Five players in double figures, including Lowe (16 points, nine assists), Bailey (14 points, 10 rebounds), Whittenburg (14), McClain (12) and Myers (11). Record: 2-0.

State 57, East Carolina 49: Dec. 8 in Raleigh. The Pirates hold their own on the boards, tying the Wolfpack with 28 caroms, and holding a 36-34 lead with 13 minutes left. With Myers (15) supplying the points down the stretch, State managed to pull away. Lowe and Whittenburg score 11 and 10 points, respectively. Record: 3-0.

State 45, Michigan State 41: Dec. 11 in Raleigh. The Pack has to revert back to the

cat-and-mouse days of past to edge past the Spartans of the Big 10. With 17 seconds to play, MSU has possession and trails by two when defensive specialist Harold Thompson makes a steal. Record: 4-0.

Louisville 57, State 52: Dec. 21 in Louisville. The Pack experiences its first taste of defeat in its first road game against a highly talented group of Cardinals, eventual Final Four participants. The Cards gain a 34-26 rebounding advantage, and break open a 33-33 halftime deadlock. Whittenburg tallies 22. Record: 4-1.

State 67, West Virginia 59: Dec. 28 at East Rutherford, N.J. Whittenburg keys a second-half surge, scoring 13 of the Pack's first 18 points as State never looks back. Whittenburg finishes with 22, and Bailey adds 18 against the 20th-ranked Mountaineers. Record: 5-1.

State 111, Fairleigh Dickinson 76: Jan. 3 in Raleigh. The Pack and all of its subs have a fairly good time performing a three-point show which totalled 12-of-18 from beyond 19 feet. Myers (22) and Bailey (16) work inside enemy lines and Whittenburg (21) and Gannon (17) head the bomb squad. Record: 6-1.

State 76, Clemson 70: Jan 7 at Clemson. The Tigers claw back from an 11-point half-time deficit to make the Wolfpack scrap to its first

ACC win. Bailey dogs the inside with 11 boards and 25 points and Myers trims the Tiger 'D' with 25 points. Record: 7-1.

Missouri 49, State 42: Jan. 9 at Columbia, Mo. In days of old, when State got cold, and shot-clocks weren't invented, it wrapped its paws around the ball, and losses were prevented. The Wolfpack failed to score on seven straight second-half possessions, and the Tigers pull away from a 35-35 tie. Record: 7-2.

Virginia 58, State 80: Jan. 12 in Raleigh. What looks to be the biggest win ever under third-year coach Jim Valvano turns out to be the most disastrous during his tenure at State. The Pack jumps out to a 16-point lead and holds a six-point advantage at the half as Whittenburg scores 27 first-half points. Early in the second period, however, he broke his foot and the Cavaliers Sampsonize State once again. Record: 7-3.

State 81, Georgia Tech 61: Jan. 15 in Raleigh. Myers starts in place of Whittenburg and stings the Jackets with 27 points. The Pack jumps to an 11-2 lead and never Techs a look back. Bailey gets 20 points and Lowe 15. Record: 8-3.

North Carolina 99, State 81: Jan. 19 at Chapel Hill. The defending national champs jump out to a 19-6 advantage and coast as all five starters score in double-figures. Gannon leads Wolfpack with 18. Record: 8-4.

Wake Forest 91, State 83: Jan. 22 at Greensboro. Whittenburg's absence starts to take effect. State leads 30-26, before the runnin' and gunnin' Deacons dash away with the win. Lowe paces the Pack with 18, Bailey 16. Record: 8-5.

Memphis State 57, State 53: Jan. 23 in Raleigh. State meets another Tiger, but gets its third-straight bite of defeat, despite holding all-America Keith Lee to 14 points. The Pack almost pulls it out, leading 53-51, but commits defensive errors down the stretch. Record: 8-6.

State 94, Duke 79: Jan. 26 in Raleigh. The Wolfpack gets back into the win column in a key ACC contest. State runs off a 10-0 spurt to bedevil the Dukes. Myers breaks freshman single-game record with 35 points. Record: 9-6.

Maryland 86, State 81: Jan. 29 at College Park, Md. Steve Rivera comes off the bench to score 28 points as the Terps win the battle of the boards and build a 79-66 lead with two minutes left. State's downtown bombers make the final score more respectable. Gannon fires in 21. Record: 9-7.

State 74, Georgia Tech 64: Feb. 2 at Atlanta. Pack stays in conference race, but needs late second-half surge for its fourth league win. Myers whistles Dixie to the tune of 25 points. Record: 10-7.

State 51, Furman 48: Feb. 4 at Charlotte. A win is a win is a win, but the Wolfpack has to paddle down a rocky river to get this one in the North-South Doubleheaders. State shoots just 13 of 40 from the field, but takes advantage of Paladin turnovers. Record: 11-7.

State 57, The Citadel 47: Feb. 5 at Charlotte. Again, nothing pretty about this one, but State dogs its way to an early lead and leaves the Queen City with two victories. Bailey scores 16 points, seven rebounds and hands out five assists. Record: 12-7.

of the Wolfpack throughout the year as the second championship unfold.

"Wally and I are so close to the team," Dornburg said. "We travel with them and live with them and all. We sort of live and breathe basketball. When they have up moments, we're high and when they are do/wn — like Whittenburg's injury — certainly this has been a rollercoaster ride.

"The team was 9-7 at one point and were 16-10 going into the final regular season game. The thoughts were in everybody's mind, the coaches and players, wondering whether or not they could even get into the NCAA. They were talking about having to win against Wake Forest and then looking real good against Carolina. It just started to build."

The downs looked bad at one time but it was a no big surprise to Dornburg to see the development of the squad.

"When Whittenburg was out the team was struggling," Dornburg said. "We didn't really know if they were going to get it together. We saw the improvement of Gannon and Charles and Cozell McQuenn when Whit was out. Even at 16-10, to be honest with you, I really didn't know if State was going to get in the NCAA. We had a glimmer of hope. We knew we were going to go to the NT.

"Then all of a sudden it started to build. It was like putting one block on top of another. With each win they became stronger. When they got by Pepperdine, I knew they were going to go a long ways in the Tournament. I really did. I felt that. I didn't have any idea we would make it here (to the championship)."

Ausley was not highly optimistic as the Tournament began, but that all changed.

"Oh yea, I thought we were going to lose," Ausley said. "Seriously, I thought we would beat Pepperdine.

Then when we got down by six, write it off, that's the end of it. And a bunch of things happened and we won it and I knew we were going to lose to Las Vegas. We came back and won that one. Then I thought we'd beat Utah.

"Then I thought we'd lose to Virginia, but I wasn't quite so sure about Virginia, simply because the psychological effect of the ACC was there. The kids would get more jacked up against Virginia. If Virginia had been No. 2 in the nation from somewhere else, I don't think they would have gotten quite as jacked up for them but, playing against your own league, I thought we'd beat Georgia and then I really did think we had a good chance against Houston because of the contrast in styles."

Even that game had its ups and downs, though.

"At the end of the half, I really felt good," said Ausley. "Dereck and Sidney were running past the Houston guys. They weren't getting any dunks. We weren't shooting well, but then they weren't either. Then when they went up by seven, there again, I said this is the end of the season. I'm not out there playing. Whose to expect that with five minutes left in the game and you're down to the No. 1 team in the nation by seven that you have any reason to comeback? What are you going to do to comeback? And bang, what happened. Houston decided to sit on it. When they did that, then I started feeling good again."

Dornburg finds it hard to single out one game as the most exciting in the stretch.

"It starts with senior day, and that Wake Forest win," he said. "That was something special, a kind of momentum that you had to have going into the Tournament. I would say the most exciting moments were in the Pepperdine comeback. They were literally buried and dead. There was no way that a team could come back down five points with 54 seconds left. There's no way a team can come back from that. And they

did. That was probably the most exciting moment outside Lorenzo's jam (in the championship game).

"I thought the most exciting game was the Carolina game in the Atlantic Coast Conference Tournament. That was incredible. Not only because of being down like they were and coming back. We're talking about a game in overtime against

Dean Smith. That never happens, and it happened."

For Dornburg and Ausley it has been happening for many years and probably will for several more. For State's 1983 edition it happened just once, but what a memorable one time.

State 70, North Carolina 63: Feb. 19 in Raleigh. The Pack heals some of its wounds with an emotional victory. Valvano's first over the Tar Heels. State trails by a point with six minutes left, but holds its own down the stretch, despite a poor performance from the line. Bailey and McQueen can't contain all-America Perkins (18), but they do some damage of their own with 20 points and 12 rebounds, respectively. Record: 15-8.

State 96, Duke 79: Feb. 23 in Durham. Charles is not intimidated by Duke fans' antics as he boxes the Devils with 13 points on a six of eight accuracy. Seniors shine, however, with Bailey getting 26 points and 12 rebounds and Lowe 23 points and 12 assists. Record: 16-8.

Virginia 86, State 75: Feb. 27 at Charlottesville, Va. Sampson gets his last victory over the Wolfpack. Whittenburg makes his return, scoring his first three-point attempt and leads State with 14 points, despite a 4-of-13 accuracy. Lowe (13), Bailey (12) and Charles (11) provide a balanced scoring attack. Record: 16-9.

Maryland 67, State 58: Mar. 3 in Raleigh. State leads 55-52 with six minutes remaining, but the Terps hit five of seven free throws down the stretch run. Whittenburg tallies 15 points, but connects just six of 15 from the floor. Charles also pops for 15 and adds eight rebounds. State's last loss. Record: 16-10.

State 130, Wake Forest 89: Mar. 5 in Raleigh. The Pack avenges an earlier loss by having a picnic in the seniors final home game. Whittenburg and Gannon score 25. Bailey adds 23. Lowe parcels out 14 assists and McQueen yanks down 10 boards. Record: 17-10.

State 71, Wake Forest 70: Mar. 11 at Atlanta. Valvano is concerned with playing the Demon Deacons twice in the same week, despite the last score. The final score tells why. WFU freezes play for four minutes, before Lowe steals an Alvis Rogers' pass with 17 seconds left, penetrates and feeds to Charles, who is fouled. Charles hits one of two free throws with three seconds left to begin a

State trails most of the way, but Charles' two free throws with 23 seconds left is good enough for the Pack's trip to the Final Four. The Cavs miss two shots in the waning seconds. State 67, Georgia 60: April 2 at Albuquerque. The Wolfpack holds down the running fort of the Bulldogs, another sleeper from the South, by slowing the tempo down to a more operational level. State leads the whole way, gaining its biggest advantage of 59-41 with

The Cougars take over the second half and squirt out to a 42-35 lead with 10 minutes left before going to their Locomotion spread. Trailing 52-48 with three

minutes left, State forced Houston to win it from the free throw line, which it failed to do. Lowe and Whittenburg score two apiece from outside to force a 52-52 tie with 1:59 left. The Cougs miss a free throw with 1:05 left and McQueen clears the board. Whittenburg's 35-footer was short and Charles dunked the winning shot with :01 left. State is the NCAA National Champion. Record: 26-10.
