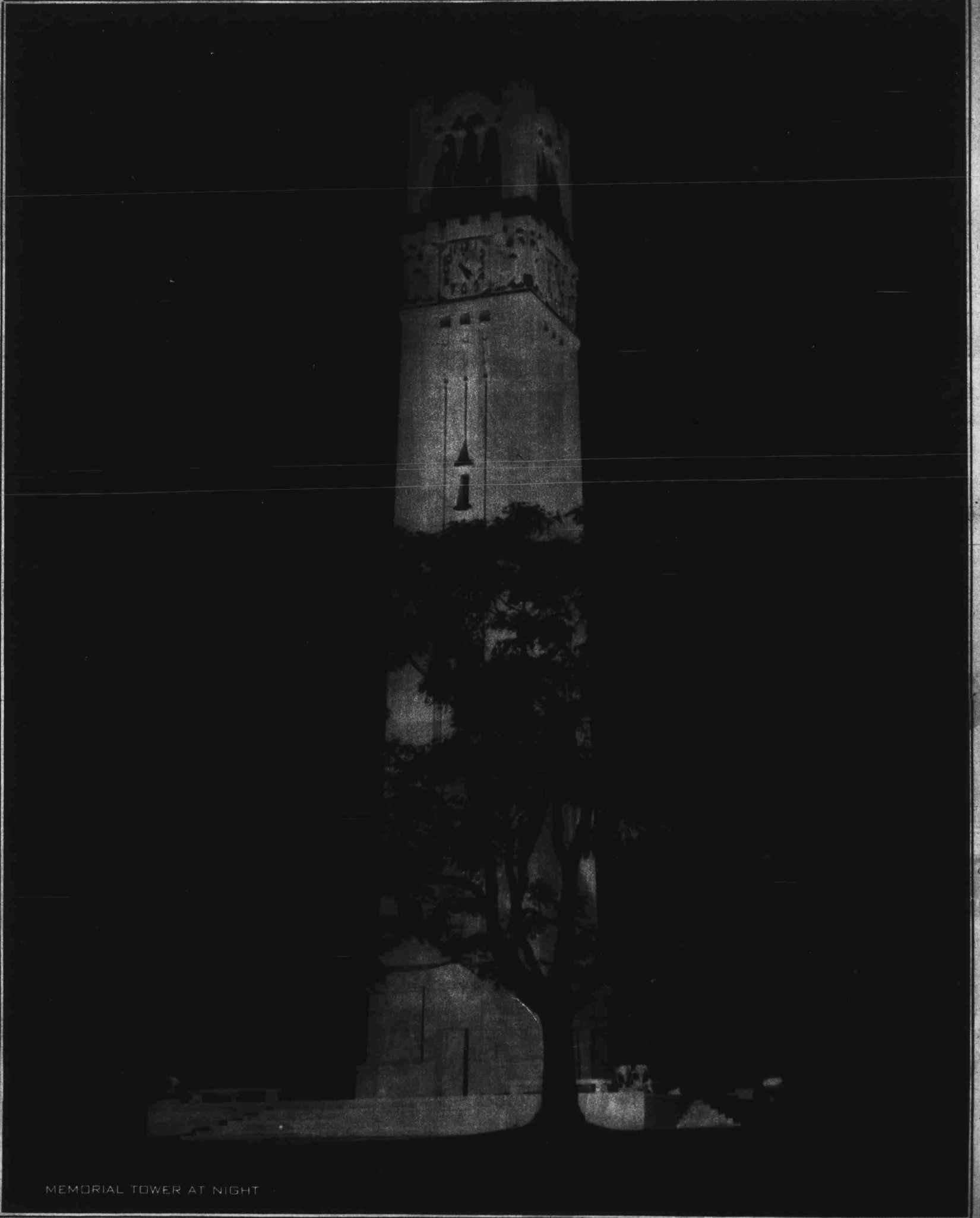

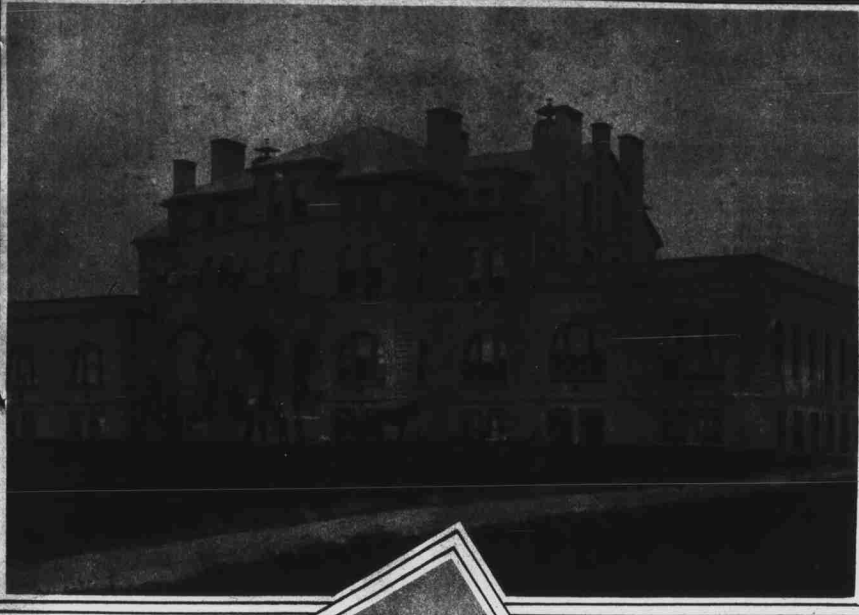

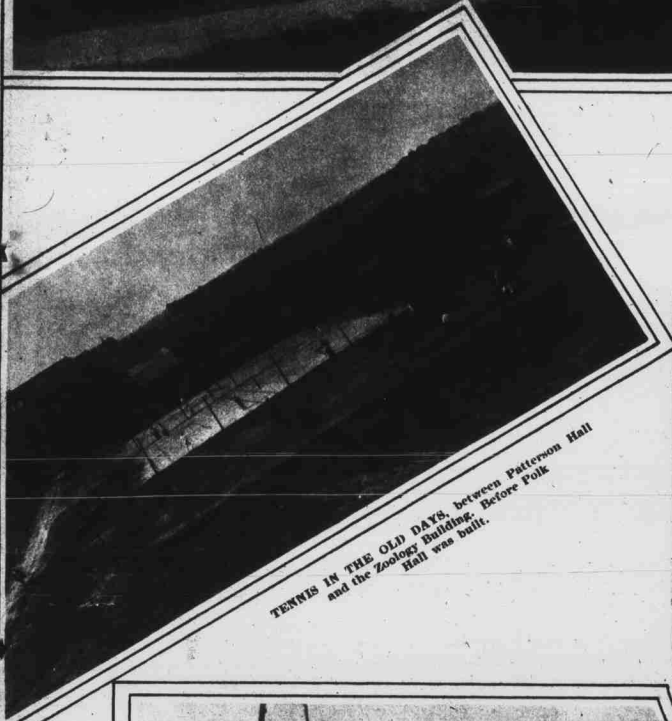

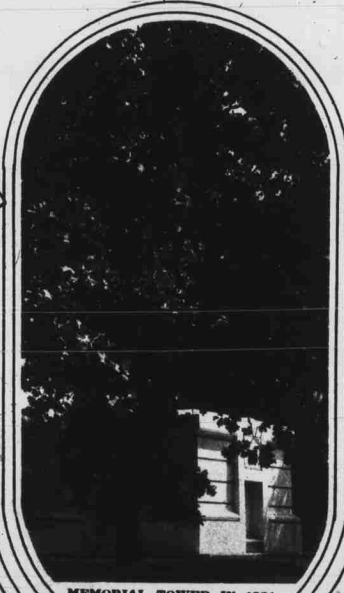

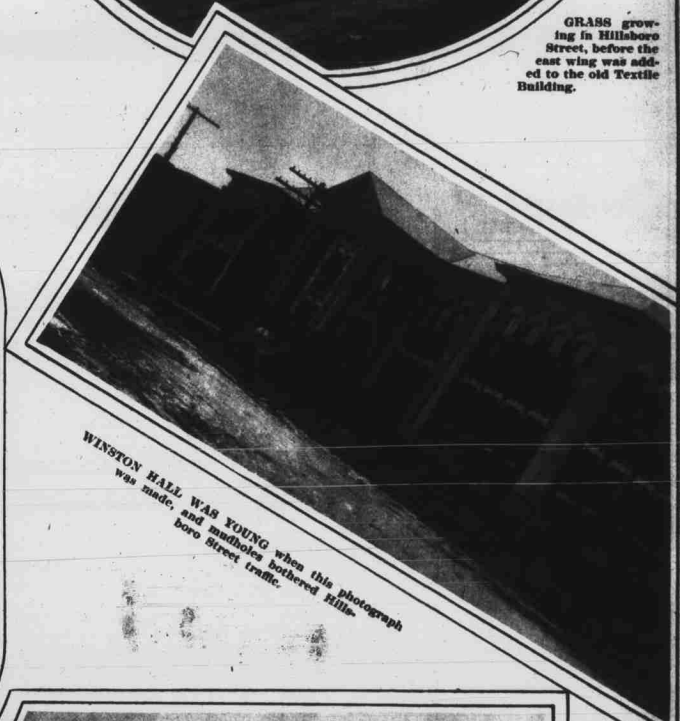
GRASS growing in Hillsboro Street, before the east wing was added to the old Textile Building.

WINSTON HALL WAS YOUNG when this photograph was made, and mudholes bothered Hillsboro Street traffic.



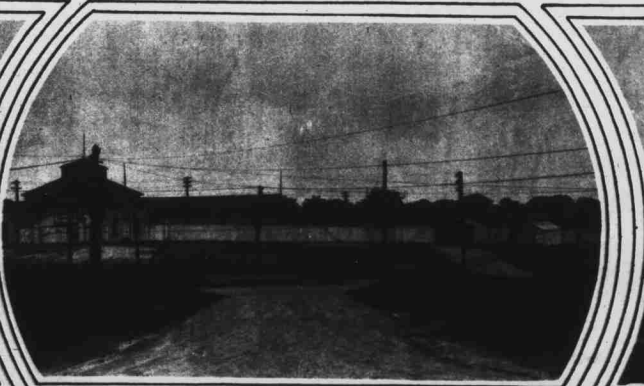
STYLES OF 1915 are portrayed by this class in soils, working back of Patterson Hall. Striped pants are part of military uniform used then.



BY 1920, the R. O. T. C. uniforms followed the army pattern, possibly to use material left from the World War. These boys are judging work stock.



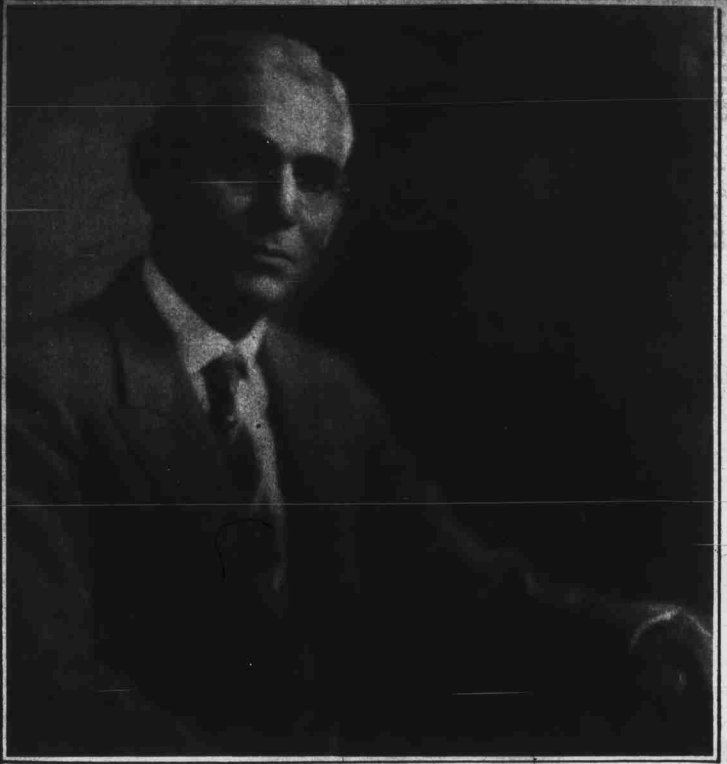
RIDDICK FIELD AS IT LOOKED IN 1907 The Class of 1898 is playing the varsity

COMMANDANT, heading the R. O. T. C. department is Col. Thomas W. Brown, the new Professor of Military Science and Tactics. He succeeds Col. Charles S. Caffery, who is retiring from active duty after three years in the post.

Col. Brown's father was a field artillery officer. He attended William and Mary College and the University of Pennsylvania. Colonel Brown's army career began when he enlisted in Battery G, First Artillery. He was commissioned a Second Lieutenant of Infantry in 1901 and was assigned to the 27th Infantry. He served during the Moro campaign in the Philippines and went to Cuba in the second intervention in 1906. He has seen service in Hawaii and Panama. Col. Brown was detailed on the War Department General Staff during the World War. Before coming to State College this fall, he was stationed at Governors Island, N. Y., on the General Staff at Headquarters of the Second Corps Area.

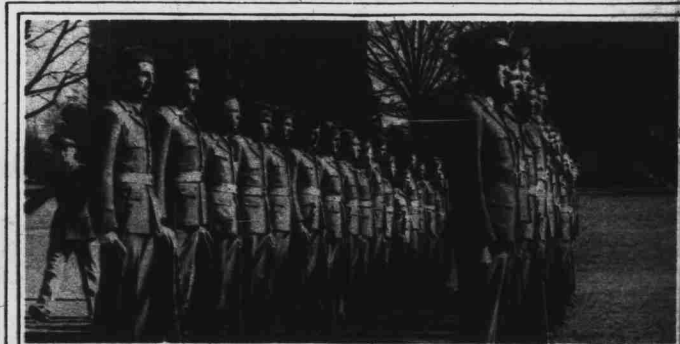

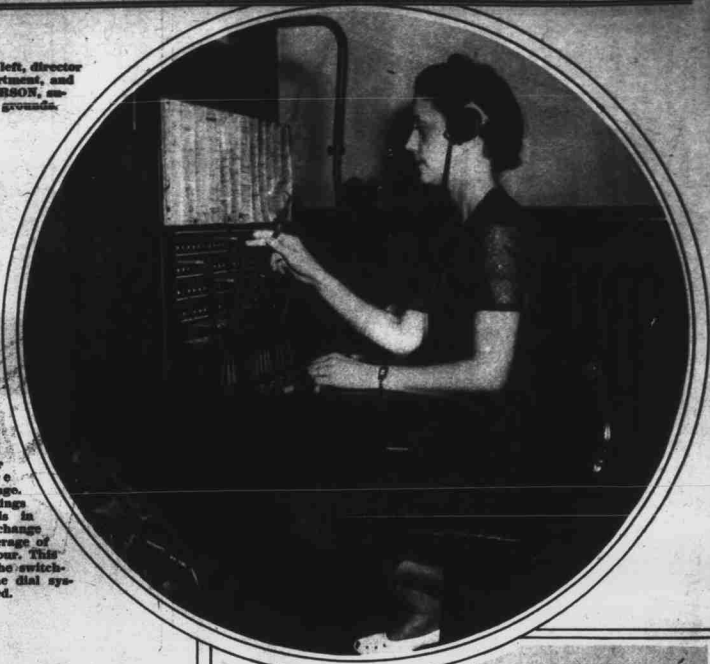

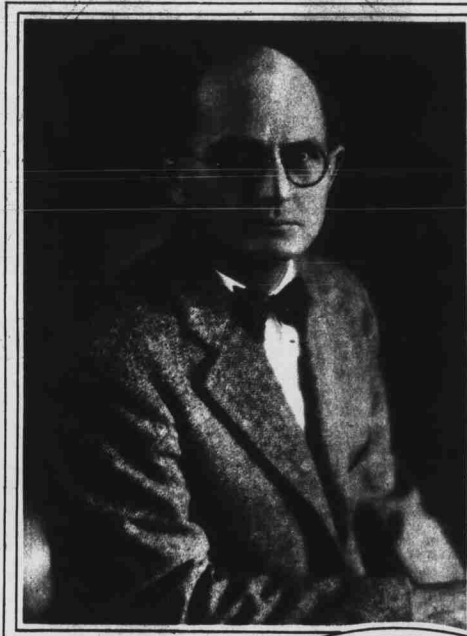

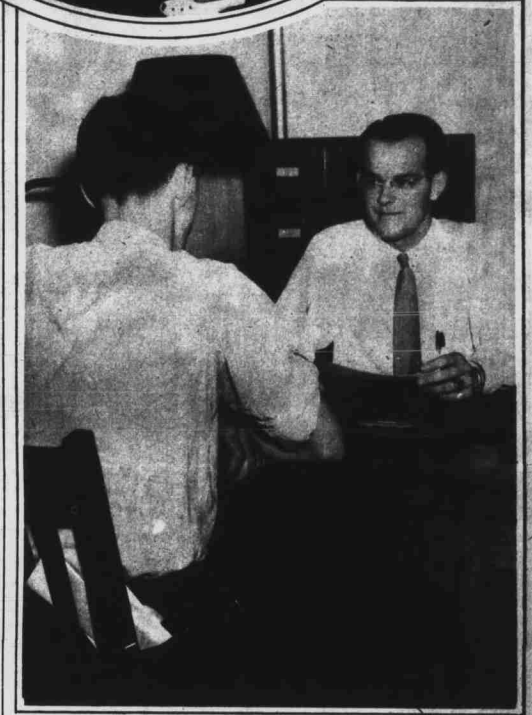

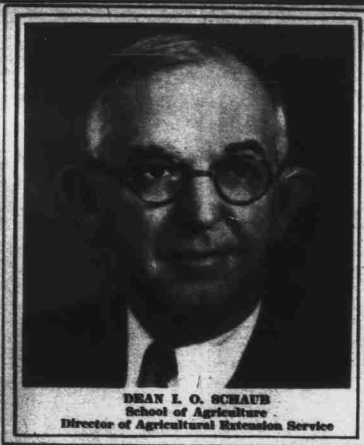
