Dear Leland:

I am glad to send you a summary of salaries currently in effect at North Carolina State College.

With very few exceptions, all of which are going to be corrected in the near future, there are minimum salary scales for the various ranks. For nine month appointments these are \$3,300, \$4,400, \$5,500, and \$6,600 for instructors through to professors. For those on twelve month appointments, minimum salaries are increased by 20 per cent.

We do not have a systematic method of making promotions from instructor through higher ranks. Generally speaking an instructor can expect promotion after three or four years if his graduate program has been completed and he has those qualifications indicating that he will make a permanent staff member. Generally, assistant professors are not promoted with less than three years' experience in that rank.

It does not appear likely that Neita and I shall be making a trip to the southwest any time in the foreseeable future. Your invitation sounds very tempting, and we would certainly want to see you and the Halversons if we were in your part of the country.

Am Happy to inform you that your institution has been selected to receive one of the new two-year Burlington Industries Foundation scholarships which has a value of \$1000 payable \$500 a year for the Junior and Senior years of the student chosen for the scholarship. Dear Mr. Campbell:

Please follow these instructions for issuing basketball tickets for the 1955-56 season:

1. Keep an accurate record of all complimentary tickets which are to be issued only upon the signed request of the Athletic Director or myself. Complimentary tickets for members of our coaching staffs are to be in sections 7, 8, 15 and 16, with the exception of one or two tickets for Mrs. Stephens, who is to be provided one or two tickets in a center section.
2. Withhold from season ticket sales one hundred tickets from Sections 7, 8, 15 and 16 for sale on an individual game basis for conventions and conferences which will be meeting on the campus.
3. Before issuing season tickets for sale in 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, and 14, make these reservations of tickets:
 - a) Send to me four adjacent tickets in each of the six sections, a total of twenty-four tickets. These will be used very sparingly as complimentary tickets and those not needed for this purpose will be returned to you for sale at individual games.
 - b) Complimentary tickets for Dr. H. A. Fisher and alumni members of the Athletic Council are to be provided from the above sections.
 - c) Withhold from sale as season tickets six tickets in Section 12 as specified by the Athletic Director to be used on an individual game basis by him and the Chairman of the Athletic Council when space is not available for special guests in the guest box. These tickets will be returned to you for sale when not needed.
4. Season tickets for members of the faculty will be in Sections 7, 15, and 16.

Dear Professor Glenn:

I am glad that you have written to me about the method used in allocating tickets to members of the faculty. I wish more members of the faculty would avail themselves of this privilege so that we might better know how they are feeling about our policies.

We have long since abandoned any hope of distributing tickets to the public, students, alumni, faculty and other groups in a way that will be pleasing to all. We are endeavoring to please the majority.

I concur fully with your suggestion that members of the faculty be acquainted ahead of time with the availability of tickets for them and I shall insist that we do that for next year. If it is necessary to reserve a few seats for members of the Athletic Council and for a few members of the administrative staff who cannot possibly be present when tickets are being distributed, we shall notify the faculty that tickets will not be available to them in certain rows of the reserved sections.

It is possible that tickets will be distributed by mail next year on a "lot basis." I have asked the Faculty Athletic Committee to consider this annual problem again and seek to learn the sentiment of the majority of our faculty. Your letter is, therefore, being forwarded to Dr. H. A. Fisher, Chairman of our Faculty Committee on Athletics and of the Athletic Council.
