Statement of Principles

Which Guide the Relationships of the Seven Tennessee Valley States Land-Grant Colleges, USDA, and TVA in the Use of TVA Fertilizers for Agricultural Research, Education, and Development

The Tennessee Valley Authority, in carrying out its obligations relative to fertilizer manufacture and distribution during the past twenty years, has produced, tested, introduced and distributed thousands of tons of experimental fertilizer of varying types and concentrations. During all this period and through all these processes TVA has been closely responsive to the counsel and experience of the U. S. Department of Agriculture and the Land-Grant Colleges in the Valley States. TVA and the colleges have cooperated in programs of research and education in the economic uses of fertilizer in whole-farm readjustments in the acceptance of new fertilizer materials by practical farmers. These endeavors have been quite satisfactory in their relationships and definitely productive in their results.

After this twenty-year period of activity, it seems desirable to examine these relationships and carefully evaluate the present situation in order to make suggestions for future procedure. The interested parties, having made this study and after due deliberation, agree upon the following principles as guides in effectuating new or continuing programs:

- It is recognized by the interested parties that fertilizer
 manufactured by TVA pursuant to its statutory responsibilities
 can and should be used as an experimental material within the
 framework of tested and proved methods and procedures that will
 enrich agricultural research and make agricultural education
 more effective to the end that a more productive and more
 profitable agriculture be attained.
- It has been recognized from the beginning of TVA--and it is still so recognized--that these fertilizers can best be tested and used in the improvement of agriculture through and in cooperation with research and educational programs conducted by the Land-Grant Colleges.
- 3. The Land-Grant Colleges again recognize that the most successful job can be done in the field of research and education by working cooperatively with TVA, organized farm groups, and other governmental and private agencies designed to improve agriculture.

- 4. It is now concluded that in view of the success in the past the same procedure, should be continued with any changes needed for its improvement.
- 5. Therefore, any opportunity for using TVA fertilizers more effectively through cooperative relationships and procedures will continue to be pursued to the end that the entire TVA-USDA-Land-Grant College cooperative program be improved, adjusted, and extended for the good of all parties involved and with a view to the best service possible to the people.

Dear Chancellor Bostian:

First let me express my personal pleasure that you were selected chairman for the next annual Valley Iand-Grant College-TVA Conference. I look forward to working with you in developing plans for the next conference as I have enjoyed working with your predecessors, Presidents Aderhold, Draughon, and Newman.

If I correctly understood the sense of the meeting with reference to plans for next year, we agreed tentatively on the following:

- To hold the meetings around October 1, 1956, at Asheville, North Carolina.
- 2. To have the dates finally selected for the meeting coordinated with the plans of the Southern Land-Grant College Association, which would precede or follow the land-grant college-TVA meeting. You indicated that you could get in touch with the chairman or president of this association to check on the feasibility of having both meetings in Asheville.
- 5. To include some time for inspection of the Waynesville and Parkers Branch Projects.

The only comment I heard which raised any questions about these tentative plans related to whether or not the presidents would want to be away from their offices for a period long enough to attend both meetings and to take time to inspect the research projects near Asheville. Do you have any opinions on this matter?

Inasmuch as we have found from previous experience that unanticipated changes occur in the plans of both the colleges and the TVA, we

probably can let these tentative plans stand until sometime around June 1, 1956, when we can make a check on dates and begin to plan the agenda. If this arrangement is satisfactory, we will be in touch with you about the first of June if not before.

Since returning I have obtained additional information about the five requests for Extension Workers to accompany twenty-eight 4-H boys and girls to the National 4-H Club Congress. These five requests are being returned with the hope that you will consider all of them justified. Among these twenty-eight boys and girls are eight or ten winners of national awards. It is necessary that they go from one place to another in the city of Chicago, and it is also essential that the entire group be properly chaperoned. Coltrane The Budget Bureau Raleigh, North Carolina Dear Mr. Coltrane: We are sending you a considerable number of requests for members of our staff to attend meetings in Atlanta, December 26-31. A letter from Dr. Colvard is attached which provides information in addition to that which I submit for your consideration. You will note that we propose to have one representative of the Botany Department, two from Genetics, and fifteen from Plant Pathology to attend these meetings. First of all, it should be noted that these are the annual meetings of the American Association for the Advancement of Science and a large number of different professional societies are meeting at the same time. The number of representatives of Plant Pathology desiring to go to this meeting will appear to be unusually large. You will note that we propose to pay full expenses for only one individual, the head of the department, and that all of the others will either travel in State cars or be limited to reimbursement for round-trip coach fare. There will be the usual limit of \$4.00 per day for subsistence. You will recall that the School of Agriculture has a policy of sending the largest possible number of individuals to one scientific meeting each year by having the individual pay a share of the cost as opposed to sending a smaller number with full expenses paid. These individuals are to be commended for a willingness to use their Christmas vacation and to pay a good portion of their expenses. We are keeping in mind your recent memorandum warning us that travel funds should be used very carefully. You will note that expenses for these individuals will be paid from a number of different Budgets, including Extension, Miscellaneous Gifts, Tobacco, and others. YOU WILL FIND ATTACHED A GROUP OF OUT-OF-STATE TRAVEL REQUESTS FOR MEMBERS OF THE PLANT PATHOLOGY STAFF WHO WISH TO ATTEND THE ANNUAL MEETING OF THE AMERICAN PHYTOPATHOLOGICAL SOCIETY IN ATLANTA, GEORGIA, DURING THE CHRISTMAS HOLIDAYS.

ON FIRST EXAMINATION IT IS APPARENT THAT THERE IS A CON-SIDERABLE NUMBER OF STAFF NEMBERS FROM THIS DEPARTMENT WHO WISH TO ATTEND THIS MEETING. HOWEVER, THERE ARE A NUMBER OF CIRCUMSTANCES WHICH SEEN TO JUSTIFY THESE REQUESTS. IN THE FIRST PLACE, ALL OF THESE MEN ARE TAKING THEIR ENTIRE CHRISTMAS HOLIDAY FOR THEIR OWN PROFESSIONAL IMPROVEMENT. IN THE SECOND PLACE, THE MEETINGS ARE BEING HELD AT A POINT NOT FAR FROM RALLIGH, WHICH MEANS THAT STAFF MEMBERS CAN GO THIS YEAR WHEREAS THE MEETINGS MAY BE HELD IN OTHER PARTS OF THE UNITED STATES MAKING IT ALMOST IMPOSSIBLE FOR THEM TO ATTEND EVERY YEAR. A THIRD CONSIDERATION IS THE FACT THAT VERY FEW MEMBERS OF THE PLANT PATHOLOGY STAFF DO VERY MUCH TRAVELING. A CAREFUL EXAMINATION OF THEIR INDIVIDUAL REQUESTS REVEALS THAT THEY HAVE NOT SPENT A GREAT DEAL OF TIME AND FUNDS FOR OUT-OF-STATE TRAVEL PURPOSES. A FOURTH CONSIDERATION IS THE FACT THAT MUCH OF THE WORK IN PLANT PATHOLOGY INVOLVES REGIONAL AND INTER-REGIONAL COOPERA-TION.

THEREFORE, SINCE THE TOTAL COST OF THESE REQUESTS IS NOT GREAT, I WOULD LIKE TO RECOMMEND APPROVAL OF THE APPLICATIONS WHICH ARE ATTACHED.
