Funds for African-American Visitations Day Luncheon

This is a follow-up to our recent conversation concerning our Fall Visitation Day for African-American students which will be held October 31, 1990 in the Ballroom of the Student Center from 9:00 a.m. until 2:00 p.m.

We have already identified approximately 800 students in North Carolina who have PSAT scores of 800 or better and 3.0 grade point averages or better. Our plan is to invite these students to spend a day at N.C. State. During the program we will cover admissions information, financial aid, and we will have a campus tour as well as a student panel for a question and answer session. This is a wonderful opportunity to recruit some of the best students North Carolina has to offer.

I am anticipating an approximate attendance of 350 and would like to have a luncheon in the Ballroom for these students and their parents. I have checked with University Dining on several menu plans and the total price will be about \$2,100. The Chancellor's office has traditionally paid for the students' lunch and given discount coupons for parents in the dining hall. We feel a luncheon in conjunction with the program will be more favorable. I am hereby requesting funds to support this effort.

RE: Recruited Student-Athletes

Enclosed is your June admissions status printout of all student-athletes for your sport for the 1990 Fall semester. Please let me know immediately if any recruited students that you know have made application are not appearing on your list.

By now all admitted students that are planning to attend the University should have a "Y" (will enter) status code. This code is very important since it triggers important information which is sent to the student. Please review your list and let me know if any students that you are certain are planning to attend are not yet a "Y" status. Likewise let me know if any of your recruits that are an "A" or "Y"status are in fact not planning to attend NCSU.

A reminder that the NCAA requires that all SAT/ACT scores must be received directly from the testing agency to be considered official for certification purposes. We cannot use "official" scores received directly form a student's high school for certification. Within the next two weeks I will provide you with a list of those student-athletes that must have official scores sent to NCSU before they can be certified as eligible to participate in intercollegiate sports. The NCAA does allow the athletic department to pay for official scores to be sent when a student is unable to do so however rigid guidelines must be followed.

I plan to meet with Dr. Hopfenberg soon to decide on the best way for us to handle the situation. As always, feel free to call if questions arise.

Re: Wording of contractual readmissions policy

The Admissions Committee would like to request what appears to be a minor alteration in the Contractual Readmissions Policy issued by your office on Dec 13, 1989. That document limits contractual readmission to students "who have not been enrolled at NCSU (excluding summer sessions and independent study) for a continuous three-year period ... ". The original wording proposed by the Admissions Committee was "After not being enrolled at NCSU as a degree candidate for a continuous three year period". The difference in "not being enrolled as a degree candidate" and "not being enrolled except for summer sessions and independent study" has major implications for this policy as originally envisioned by the Admissions Committee. implications arise from the fact that the policy established cannot be used by students who have taken Lifelong education courses while suspended. The Committee believes this limitation is a problem for two reasons.

First, the Committee's proposal was deliberately worded to allow students to use Lifelong Education courses as part of their appeal. The Admissions Committee wished specifically to have evidence of any academic work undertaken during the 3 year period. As the policy is now worded, students who take Lifelong Education courses cannot be readmitted under contract unless they sit out another three years.

Second, the Committee believes that the limitation contradicts the policy's intent to establish uniform treatment of former NCSU students and transfer students. The Committee reviews numerous appeals from transfer students who use Lifelong Education courses as evidence of their ability and motivation to be admitted to NCSU.

The Committee is aware that there is concern regarding the large numbers of students enrolling in Lifelong Education and in particular, the large number of suspended NCSU students doing so. We believe however that any restrictions regarding enrollment through that program should apply equally to <u>all</u> suspended students. We agree that advising from the students' curriculum would improve our suspended students chances of success. Would it not be possible to require an advisor's signature for suspended NCSU students wishing to take courses through Lifelong Ed?

I understand from Dr. Downs that the difference in the policy put forth by the Admissions Committee and that promulgated by your office may not have been intentional. The Admissions Committee will probably meet at least once this summer to hear petitions for readmission. It would be helpful if we might have some idea regarding how strictly the Contractual Readmissions Policy wording should be interpreted and whether a revision might be forthcoming. If there is a rationale for the wording as presently established, its disclosure to the Admissions Committeee would help us answer questions from advisors and suspended students.

I am writing to clarify my understanding of the admissions "special consideration" cases that are to be reviewed by the Admissions Committee under the Committee's new charge from Interim Chancellor Monteith. My understanding stems from discussions with you, Dr. Downs, Dr. Klein, Dr. Long and Dr. Monteith.

New freshmen requiring "special consideration" by the Admissions Committee would include:

- 1. Any student with an Admissions Index (AI) under 1.80 that has been recommended for admission by the Dean (or his/her designee) of the College or School in which admission is sought.
- 2. Any student with an A.I. under 1.80 with special talent (athletic, music, etc.) that is actively being recruited by the University. Students must be recommended by the Director of the program in which they are being recruited, the Dean (or his/her designee) of the College or School in which admission is sought or the Associate Provost with oversight of the Academic Skills Program for students going into the University Transition Program.
- 3. Minority students with an A.I. between 1.65 and 1.79 who are candidates for the University Transition Program. These students must be recommended by the Associate Provost with oversight of the Academic Skills Program.

Transfer students requiring "special consideration" by the Admissions Committee would include any student with a cumulative college grade point average under 2.00 that is recommended by the Admissions Director and the Dean (or his/her designee) of the College or School in which admission is sought.

Further, as we agreed, freshmen with an A.I. of 1.8 - 1.99 will not be considered "special consideration" cases for review by the Admissions Committee but rather will be subject to administrative review. Administrative review involves a recommendation by the Dean (or his/her designee) of the College/School in which admission is sought or, if appropriate, by the Associate Provost with oversight of the Academic Skills Program before admission can be granted.

RE: Updated Admissions Policy for Recruited Student-Athletes

This memorandum serves as an addendum to my memo of September 8, 1989 addressing University Admissions Policy and Guidelines for Recruited Student-Athletes.

I have attached a copy of the recently approved admissions policy concerning all students requiring "special consideration" for admission. Number two under "new freshmen" may apply in some cases to student-athletes being actively recruited for your sport. The effects of the change in policy are: 1) The admissions index (AI) is now used to determine students requiring special consideration as opposed to minimum SAT scores and/or high school grade point averages; 2) The Admissions Committee will now review all cases previously reviewed by the Provost, Associate Provost, and Director of Admissions. I have enclosed a sample of GPA/SAT combinations with corresponding AI's for illustration purposes.

Please be reminded that in addition to the Admission Index, a student's high school curriculum is a factor in the admissions decision and all students must meet the UNC system's minimum high school course requirements which have been detailed in several previous memos. Also be reminded that the University will not be considering any student-athletes who do not qualify under the NCAA's Proposition 48.

These AI's are examples only and may not fit individual situations since different weight is given to SAT-V and SAT-M scores plus the rank. This chart is solely to give an idea of approximate AI ranges given certain grades and test scores. (Note: the difference in AI for men and women occurs because women tend to achieve at a higher level than predicted at NCSU.) For illustration purposes SAT Verbal and Math scores have been divided equally.

Transfer students requiring "special consideration" by the Admissions Committee would include any student with a cumulative college grade point average under 2.00 that is recommended by the Admissions Director and the Dean (or his/her designee) of the College or School in which admission is sought.





RE: University Admissions Policy and Guidelines for Recruited

Student-Athletes

The following update on admissions policies and procedures for recruited student-athletes is provided for your information as we begin a new admissions cycle. Please note that the UNC-System Minimum Admissions Requirements for high school course preparation go into full effect in the 1990 fall semester. The minimum course requirements were detailed to you in a memo dated May 30, 1989, and are summarized in a UNC-System brochure to be distributed at our fall meeting on September 12, 1989. It has been made clear that there will be no athletic exceptions to the Minimum Admissions Requirements.

The Admissions Office recognizes and supports the important role intercollegiate athletics plays in the life of the University and is anxious to be of assistance to you to insure we are enrolling students that have a reasonable chance of completing their degree. As has been the case in the past, my door is always open and you are welcome to call or drop by to discuss either specific cases you are interested in or admission policies and procedures in general.

The following is an updated summary on the University policy for recruited student-athletes as specified in memos from Anna Keller to Chancellor Poulton and Athletic Director Mr. Valvano on July 24, 1987.

The NCSU Policy on Intercollegiate Athletics was issued by Chancellor Poulton and published in the Official Bulletin of April 29, 1987.

In accordance with the section dealing with the admission, eligibility, and academic progress of athletes please note:

- National letters of intent should not be signed until after an admissions review has been made and communicated to the Director of Athletics and appropriate coach.
  - a. The attached Admissions Office Scholarship Athlete Information Form should be completed by the prospective athlete or the coach and forms for marginal candidates

should be submitted to the Director of Admissions for review before the letter of intent is signed. The Director will review the preliminary information promptly and return one copy for the AD's file and one copy to the coach.

- The decision about admissibility will be made by the 2. Director of Admissions.
  - a. If the student-athlete meets the regular competitive requirements for admissions, he/she will be accepted in routine processing.
  - If the student athlete falls below the regular competitive requirements for admission and has below a 2.5 high school grade point average and below 800 SAT, the Director of Admissions will make the decision based on his/her credentials and the noncognitive variables which indicated a reasonable chance of success for graduation at NCSU. A letter from the Director of Athletics supporting the admission of the student may be requested by the Director of Admissions.
  - If the student-athlete is a NCAA non-qualifier (either under a 2.0 GPA on 11 core subjects or under 700 SAT or 15 ACT) then a letter from the Athletic Director supporting the admission of the student must be submitted before consideration is given. All non-qualifiers will be reviewed by the Provost, Assistant Provost and Director of Admission. (It is very doubtful that a non-qualifier will be offered admission)
  - If the student-athlete meets the NCAA requirements of a 2.0 high school grade point average on 11 required core subjects and 700 SATs but the admissions index is lower than 1.60, the admissions decision will be made by the Provost, Assistant Provost and the Director of Admissions.
  - The Director of Admissions should be consulted about e. credentials for foreign student athletes. The NCAA Guide to International Students should be used as a reference.
- Upon recommendation of the Admissions Office and the Director of Academic Skills Program, accepted freshman student-athletes with certain admissions criteria will be required to participate in the University Transition Program beginning in the 2nd summer session.

Freshmen entering the University subsequent to August 1, 1988 must meet the NCAA requirements of 2.0 high school grade point average and

700 SAT (no indexing). Student-athletes who do not meet the NCAA requirements would not be eligible to participate in athletics their first year at NCSU and should not be signed by the Athletic Department unless approved by the Provost, Assistant Provost and Director of Admissions.

Transfer students must meet the regular University requirements for admission and admissibility will be determined by the Director of Admissions. Eligibility to participate in athletics will be determined by the Athletic Director.

The Admissions Office gladly accepts its responsibility to process student-athlete applications as promptly and as efficiently as possible. Cooperation and communication are the real keys to a happy, comfortable relationship and the Admissions Office looks forward to contributing to the fulfillment of the important role that intercollegiate athletics plays at North Carolina State University.

Guidelines to use in the admissions process for recruited student-athletes include:

- The pre-admission information form for recruited student-athletes should be submitted for review and recommendation by the Director of Admissions for those student-athletes whose academic records make them marginal candidates for admission. When in doubt have the form reviewed.
- 2. Athletes being seriously recruited should be encouraged to submit an application as soon as possible. (An application is not a commitment it simply allows us to review and reach a decision early).
- A completed application for admission includes: 3.
  - A fully completed application form. (Note a special application is required for international students)
  - b. A \$35 application fee.
  - Receipt of official secondary school transcripts including a list of senior year courses, cumulative grade point average and class rank. For transfer students, we need official college transcripts from each and every college attended. Records and transcripts must be sent directly from the reporting institution to the Admissions Office.
  - d. Receipt of official SAT or ACT scores.
  - e. International Students must provide a Certificate of

Financial Responsibility and if already in the U.S., a Visa Clearance Form in addition to the above information. TOEFL Exam (minimum score 550) must be submitted for all non-native speakers of English.

- 4. All applications should have the sport the student plans to participate in clearly marked in the upper right hand corner.
- 5. A printout for each sport showing the status of all applications received will be automatically sent to each head coach monthly. A copy is attached along with instructions on how to interpret the information provided. Printouts can be provided more often on request.
- 6. Coaches should <u>not</u> contact the admissions records office and the evaluators <u>directly</u> to check on the status of applications. Contacts should be directed to the Director of Admissions and usually should be coordinated through the AD's officer per his instructions.
- A list of "walk-on" student-athletes should be provided to the Director of Admissions as those individuals are identified so our records can reflect their status.

The Athletic Department and individual coaches are responsible for information concerning NCAA eligibility requirements for student-athletes. The Admissions Office is responsible for assisting campus athletic department officials in the certification of admitted student-athletes. A completed NCAA Academic Courses form from a student-athlete's high school must be received before certification can take place.

It is important to constantly be award that the academic success of student-athletes from the time of first enrollment until graduation is paramount in the educational mission of the University.

If any recruited students have not yet applied it is imperative that we receive their applications immediately. At this late date I cannot guarantee that space will be available even for admissible scholarship student-athletes. Please advise immediately if you expect to have any scholarship athletes applying late.

Please review your list of student-athletes and let me know if any students with an accepted status of "A" or will enter status of "Y" have decided <u>not</u> to attend NCSU. Further, all "A" status students that have committed to attend should now be coded "Y" so let me know those students also. You may call or simply mark your list and return to me.

Be aware the NCAA requires that for certification all freshman student-athletes <u>must</u> have their official SAT/ACT scores sent to an institution directly from the testing agency. We can not accept "official" scores directly from a high school. I will soon provide you with a list of student-athletes that must have official scores sent to us before they can be certified and therefore eligible to participate in sports. The NCAA does allow the athletic department to pay for official scores to be sent when a student is unable to do so but rigid guidelines must be followed.

Admissions Index (AI) for 1988-89

The enclosed sample SAT/GPA chart is intended to be of help to you and your staff as you recruit student-athletes. It is imperative that you note the samples are just examples to give you a guide as to the potential admissibility of your recruits. Every admissions decision involves an evaluation of the level and difficulty of courses taken in high school and extracurricular involvement in addition to grades, SAT scores and class rank.

Note also that regular admission to the freshman class requires an AI of at least 2.0 and that any student with an AI under 2.0 requires special review by me. In severe cases Dr. Larry Clark and Dr. Nash Winstead may also be involved in reviewing a prospective student-athlete's application. Student-Athletes with an AI under 1.8 may be required to participate in the University Transition Program (UTP) if admitted.

As always please do not hesitate to call if you have any questions or wish to discuss specific cases.

(Note: the difference in AI for men and women occurs because women tend to achieve at a higher level than predicted.
