



Richard L. Dickey, N. C. State's All-America forward is playing his last, and what may well be his best of four outstanding years of basketball. Dickey has scored a total of 1,184 points during three seasons of play. "Dick" stands 6-1 and weighs 180 pounds. His home town is Alexandria, Ind.





Jere Bunting is one of William and Mary's smallest, but certainly one of their best players. He stands just five-feet, 10 inches, but as a defensive guard and long scoring set-shot artist there are few in the Southern Conference any better. In 1948 he was named the most valuable player in the Southern Conference basketball tournament at Durham. Bunting is co-captain of the team.

William and Mary Indians

Anyone who hasn't heard of William and Mary's **Chester Geirmack** hasn't been keeping up with the cage game. Last year the national scoring title was won by him with a total of 740 points for an average above 20 points per game. Chet plays center for the Tribe and stands six-feet, four inches. He's a deadly hook shot and can hit long set shots with the best on the W. & M. squad. Geirmack is co-captain of the Indians along with Guard Jere Bunting.



Sam Ranzino, the "sharpest shot in college basketball" was last season's high point maker with 381. Sam is a Junior, studies Industrial Recreation, and wants to play pro ball after the 1951 season. He is six feet one inch tall, weighs close to 200 pounds, and is from Gary, Ind.



Paul Horvath, six foot seven inch, 205-pound Junior from Chicago is a center and scored 301 points last season. Paul is studying Industrial Recreation, is a member of the honor society of 30 & 3. He is married and has a small daughter.




