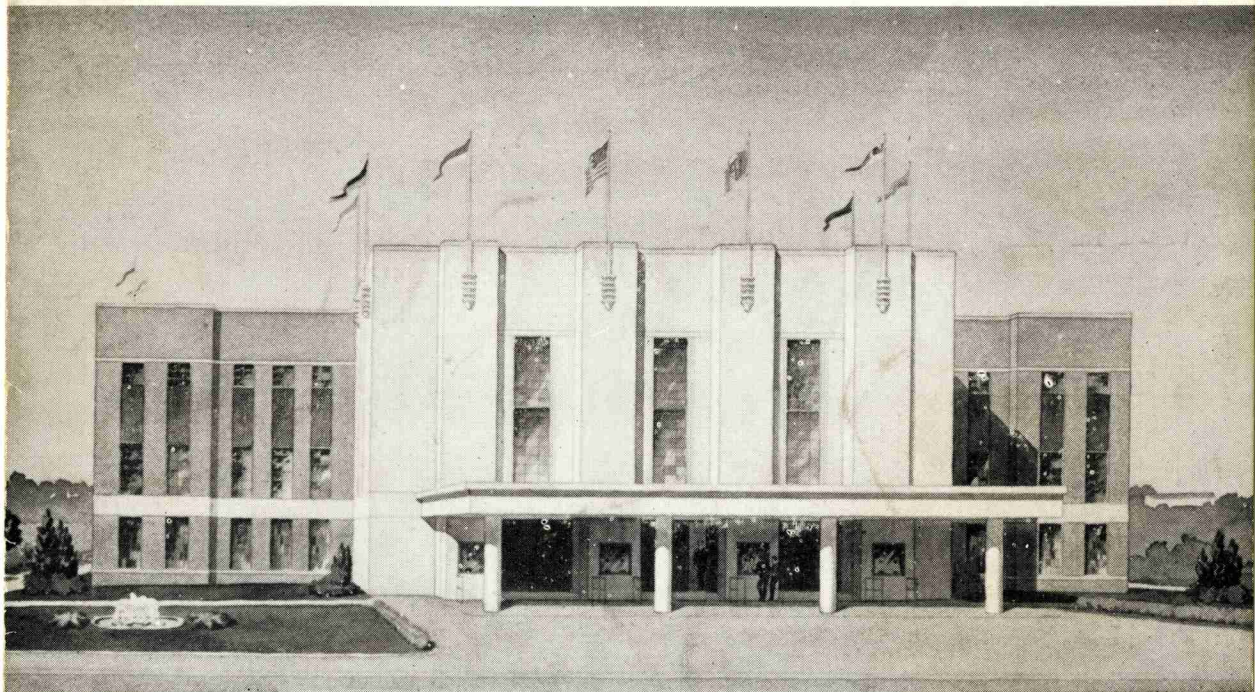

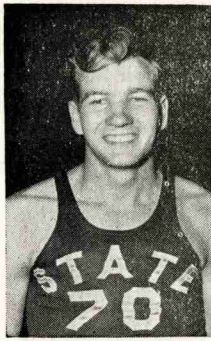

Richard L. Dickey, N. C. State's All-America forward is playing his last, and what may well be his best of four outstanding years of basketball. Dickey has scored a total of 1,184 points during three seasons of play. "Dick" stands 6-1 and weighs 180 pounds. His home town is Alexandria, Ind.



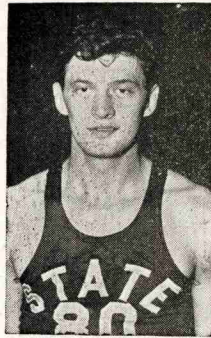
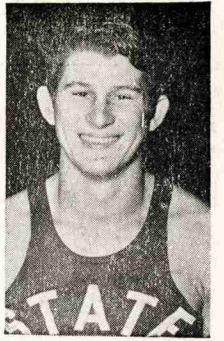
Forward **Stan Najeway** is the leading scorer for the Wake Forest team. He stands six-feet, four inches and can play at either forward or center. Najeway, a native of New York, is also deadly at the free throw line. As a defensive performer there are few better rebound men in the Southern Conference.

Demon Deacons

Guard **Jim Patton** is co-captain of the Wake Forest outfit. He has been a regular for the past three seasons and is rounding out one of the most illustrious cage careers ever to don the Black and Gold. Patton stands six-feet, five inches, and does a top job at his guard position, both as a rebound star and as a scorer.



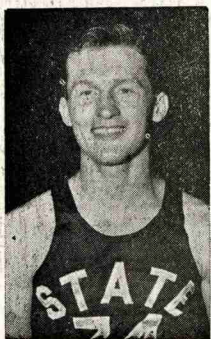
Sam Ranzino, the "sharpest shot in college basketball" was last season's high point maker with 381. Sam is a Junior, studies Industrial Recreation, and wants to play pro ball after the 1951 season. He is six feet one inch tall, weighs close to 200 pounds, and is from Gary, Ind.



Paul Horvath, six foot seven inch, 205-pound Junior from Chicago is a center and scored 301 points last season. Paul is studying Industrial Recreation, is a member of the honor society of 30 & 3. He is married and has a small daughter.



Joe Harand did an excellent job at guard during the latter part of last season. Particularly good on rebounds. Joe is from Tenaflly, N. J., stands six feet four inches and weighs 194 pounds.



Victor Bubas, Southern Conference All-Tournament guard, second team All-Southern last year. Vic is usually a high scorer with his long set shots. A Junior in Industrial Recreation, he plans a coaching career. Bubas is a six foot two inch, 188 pounder from Gary, Ind.

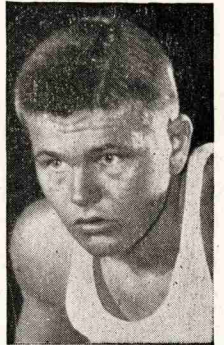

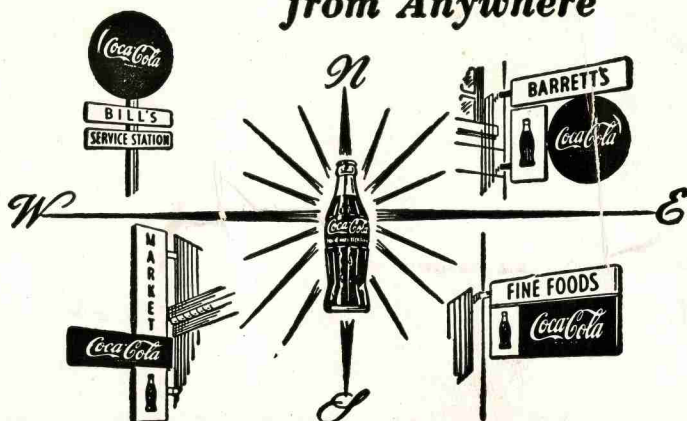
