






Richard L. Dickey, N. C. State's All-America forward is playing his last, and what may well be his best of four outstanding years of basketball. Dickey has scored a total of 1,184 points during three seasons of play. "Dick" stands 6-1 and weighs 180 pounds. His home town is Alexandria, Ind.




Captain **Nemo Nearman**, 6-6 center for Carolina's White Phantoms is one of the leading scorers in Southern Conference play this year. A native of Charleston, W. Va., Nearman has averaged 12 points per game for some 23 contests this year. He is particularly good as a rebound star and is one of the most deadly free throw shots in the Southern Conference. Particularly fast for a 195-pounder, Nearman leads the fast break on occasions for the White Phantoms. Nemo is a senior.


Carolina Tar Heels




Forward **Hugo Kappler** is one of the real standouts on the Carolina squad. He was named to a second All-Dixie Classic tournament team berth and was a top scorer throughout the tourney. Kappler, who hails from Brooklyn, N. Y., stands 6-2 and weighs 180-pounds. Hugo has a great one-handed push shot and drives well for close-in lay-ups. In the clutch Kappler is a great competitor. He is a junior with another year of eligibility remaining after this season.




Sam Ranzino, the "sharpest shot in college basketball" was last season's high point maker with 381. Sam is a Junior, studies Industrial Recreation, and wants to play pro ball after the 1951 season. He is six feet one inch tall, weighs close to 200 pounds, and is from Gary, Ind.



Paul Horvath, six foot seven inch, 205-pound Junior from Chicago is a center and scored 301 points last season. Paul is studying Industrial Recreation, is a member of the honor society of 30 & 3. He is married and has a small daughter.



Joe Harand did an excellent job at guard during the latter part of last season. Particularly good on rebounds. Joe is from Tena-fly, N. J., stands six feet four inches and weighs 194 pounds.
