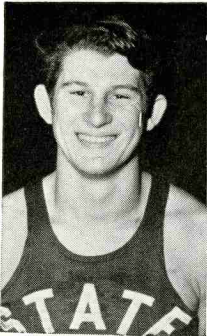

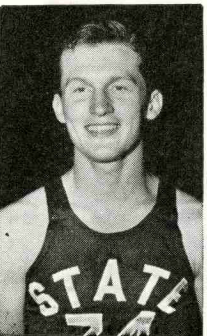
#77 SAM RANZINO, Gary, Ind.

Sam's one-handed push shot is one of best in game . . . senior this season and captain of the 1950-51 squad . . . Will be featured in number of national magazines this winter . . . won team free-throw trophy last year with 72 percent accuracy . . . Earned three previous monograms . . . All-Southern too.



#84 PAUL HORVATH, Chicago, Ill.

6'7" Center . . . Playing his fourth season with the Wolfpack, Paul has always contributed his share to the scoring . . . Hit 365 pts. last season and has been above 300 each season at State . . . Fine rebound man . . . Good clutch performer . . . Named All-Dixie Classic tournament center last year and has been All-State each season . . . Can go with the best when he hustles . . . 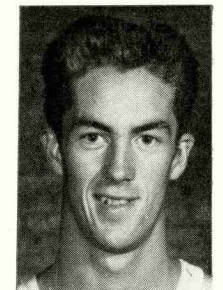
#75 LEE TERRELL, South Orange, N. J.

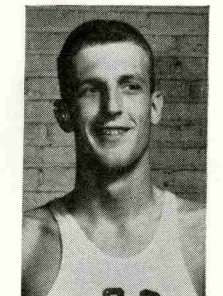
#81 BOB COOK, Columbus, Ind.

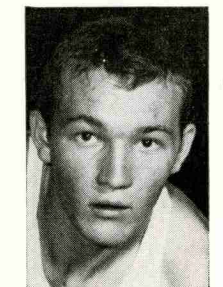
#73 PAUL BRANDENBERG, Port Richmond, New York

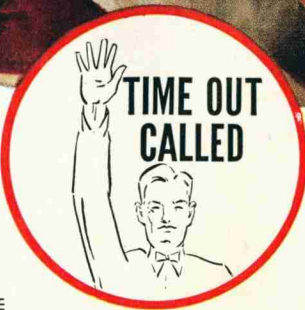
