RICHARD H. (Dick) TYLER . . . Junior . . . 6-3 . . . 180 lbs. . . . Newburgh, N. Y. Lightning reflexes and a potent jump shot are a pair of attributes that go toward making this lad a leading contender for starting honors this season. Last year Tyler was used as both forward and guard, but this season Dick likely will concentrate on the frontline of State's offense. Dick can steal the ball with the best in the league and is often used by Coach Case for that purpose. He is improving his ball-handling, which was one weak spot last year and Tyler may become one of the stars of the 1953 club. Began cage career at Newburgh under Coach George Masterson where he broke all records for scoring. Last year, Tyler's first on the Wolfpack varsity, he scored 130 points in 32 games for a 4.1 average. He'll likely improve on that mark this year. Studying Textiles at State and plans a career in this field after graduation. Enrolled in Quartermaster branch of R.O.T.C. program. Married and has one child, a boy, one-year. Son of Mr. and Mrs. William J. Tyler, Williams Lane Park, Route 4, Newburgh, N. Y. 21-years old.
