# WOLFPACK OUTLOOK

A bigger, stronger and quicker team is expected by basketball coach Norman Sloan as he foresees his fourth North Carolina State University basketball team for the 1969-70 season.

"We will be stronger on the boards, with the addition of six-nine Paul Coder from our freshman team, and we will have more quickness and depth than a year ago," says Sloan, a 1951 graduate of State.

The Wolfpack did not have a big, big man last year, relying upon a balanced-sized lineup with slender 6-6 Van Williford bearing the brunt of the board work and scoring. Williford, who gained both all-Atlantic Coast Conference and all-District III honors, averaged 21.6 points and 10.0 rebounds per game as the Wolfpack won 15 and lost 10 games overall. The Pack tied for third in the ACC standings with an 8-6 mark.

The Pack has six lettermen back, while losing three.

Returning with Williford as probable starters are 6-6 forward Rick Anheuser, co-captain with Williford, and either Jim Risinger or Al Heartley at guard. Coder, who led the freshman team in scoring with a 24.1 average and a 12.6 rebound average, is counted on to start at center, enabling Williford to move to forward, a more natural position for him.

Another sophomore who is likely to break into the first five is Ed Leftwich, a "tall" 6-5. Leftwich, who has untapped potential, played guard and forward while scoring 18.4 points on last year's freshman team.

Anheuser, as spectacular as an uncontested layup, was around when you needed him most with a key basket or rebound last year, when he was third in team scoring (9.0) and second in rebounding (5.8). He is a poised, talented player.

"We'll have the size and speed to compete at a fast tempo this time. As a necessity, we've had to play control ball in the past to keep ourselves in the games. It won't be that way now," says Sloan with an obvious delight that the Wolfpack can run like the Everett Case-coached teams he used to play for in the late '40's.

"We plan on our sophomores playing a lot, with Coder and Leftwich regulars. I think we can also get good reserve play from Renaldo Lovisa. Rennie (6-8) is just maturing as a basketball player," adds Sloan. "Coder and Leftwich are exceptional prospects and I'll be awfully disappointed if they aren't a big help to us this year."

Risinger and Heartley, two quick backcourt lettermen, reserve Joe Dunning, and Leftwich, will be the contenders for the two starting guard spots.

The Pack will have good depth up front with rugged Dan Wells, 6-6, who started and played well at the end of last year, and Doug Tilley, 6-7, available. Wells and Tilley scored 75 and 73 points respectively as sophomores.

Losses are 1968-69 co-captains Dick Braucher at guard and Joe Serdich at forward. Nelson Isley, a letterman guard last year, has withdrawn from State.

Another area where Sloan feels the Wolfpack will definitely be better is on defense.

"We have some boys who are better equipped to play defense," says Sloan.

"I think we'll be improved, and will be in a six team race for the ACC title," adds Sloan.


