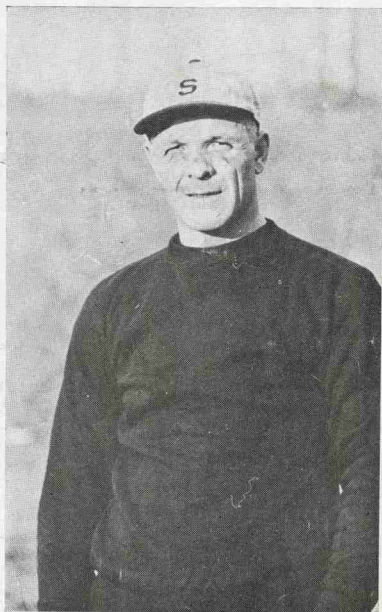

About twenty-five years ago there graduated from State College a young man who ranked high in his class and who held the admiration and esteem of his fellow classmates. Just a little over one year ago, trustees of the Greater University met to name a dean of administration at State College to succeed Dr. E. C. Brooks, resigned because of ill health. After careful consideration the trustees selected the young man, who had graduated 25 years ago, to fill the place left vacant by Dr. Brooks. The new administrative dean, Colonel John William Harrelson, had ideas as to how this institution could be made a more desirable place, and he set about in a quiet way to carry out his plans. Almost immediately, the effects of his innovations were felt. Freshmen were segregated, a student-activities building was set aside, a higher standard was instituted, and many campus improvements were ordered. More mature than the 1909 graduate, but still youthful in appearance, Colonel Harrelson has not ceased his tireless efforts to make State College a school to which the people of the State of North Carolina can point with pride. Col. Harrelson is Chairman of the Athletic Council.

## TODAY'S GAME

Annually, one of the best football games played in North Carolina is that between Duke University and State College. Today we see these two schools meet for the 12th time and the battle, no doubt, will be as exciting and as keenly contested as the 11 already on the record books.

Today's game has much to do with the final standings of the Big Five and Southern Conference. A victory for Duke would simplify championship matters as both the titles would go to the Blue Devils. They have not been beaten this year by a Big Five or a Southern Conference foe.

But, should State take the game, then the State title would be shared by Carolina, Duke, and State, and the Southern Conference title by the same three with Duke added.

The stage for today's game is not any different from that of the last five years, as the Duke aggregation again—and perhaps rightfully so—enters the game as topheavy favorite. Duke's crushing 25-0 win over Carolina last week placed the Blue Devils at the top among Southern teams. Previous to that victory, Duke had scored victories over Wake Forest, South Carolina, Clemson, Washington and Lee, Tennessee and Davidson. In two other games, the Blue Devils were defeated first by Georgia Tech, 6-0, and then by Auburn, 7-0.

State has played one less game this year than Duke. It has victories over Davidson, South Carolina, Wake Forest, Manhattan, Richmond, and V. P. I. The team lost to Georgia and Carolina.

Although for the past five years, State has entered its game with Duke favored to take a sound thrashing, the Techs have always succeeded in making the game more than interesting for the Blue Devils. This the Techs are expected to do again today.

In 1931, Duke was given a big edge over State, but led by Bob McQuage, then a sophomore, State scored a 14-0 victory.

Then came 1932 and again Duke was expected to take the team from Raleigh. This time it was red haired Red McAdams who shattered Duke's dream of a victory over State and the Techs took the game,

6-0. Duke never got past mid-field in this particular game.

Duke was favored again in 1933. The Blue Devils won, but they had to score in the last few minutes to win, 7-0.

Last year, the Duke team, led by its great back, Ace Parker, found State more to its liking and for the first time in history, scored a decisive win over the West Raleigh school. The score was 32-0.

The greatest of all the battles was the one in 1927 which is still considered, even unto this day, as the best football game ever played in this state.

The game today brings together some of the South's best players. Beginning with the backs, Duke offers Ace Parker, Honey Hackney, Jule Ward, Jack Alexander and Stumpy Gardner. Against these, State offers Howard Bardes, "Jumping Joe" Ryneska, Cowboy Robinson, Eddie Berlinski, Joe Schwerdt, Charlie Gadd, Jake Mahoney, Pete Kuzma, Ren Hoek, Phil Davis and Eddie Entwistle.

Of these Ace Parker and Howard Bardes have been out standing this season. Parker and Bardes will compete today for the title of North Carolina's best kicker. Neither has been outkicked thus far.

State's line is believed to be the best the school has ever had. It is paced by Steve Sabol, North Carolina's great center and a first rate candidate for All-American honors. Captain Barnes Worth, right guard; Vince Farrar, right tackle; Mac Cara, left end, and Connie Mae Berry, right end, are some of the other stars in State's line.

Duke offers a fine guard in Captain Jim Johnston, and a top notch tackle in Gus Durner. Jack Henninger, center; West, end, and Caldwell, guard, are others State will have trouble with.

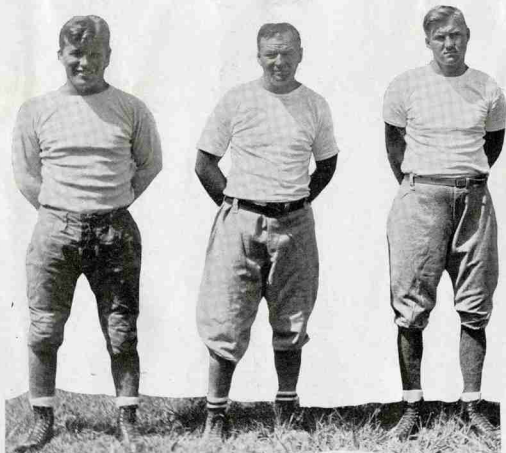

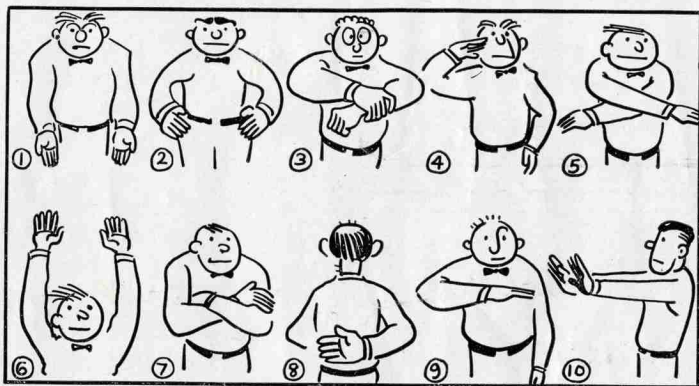

## OFFICIALS' SIGNALS

WHEN THE umpire jerks his thumb back over his shoulder, you know that the runner is out. That baseball signal is probably the most familiar gesture in sport.

But do you know the football signals? Probably not, because they are, as far as spectators are concerned, comparatively new. Study them as they are sketched in the accompanying panel, and they will increase your enjoyment of the game. The signals illustrated here are the most commonly accepted signals now in use.

FIG. 1—Pushing movement of hands to front, with arms hanging downward: Signal for penalty for crawling, pushing or helping the ball-carrier.

FIG. 2—Hands on hips: Signals penalty for off-side or for illegal kick-off formation.

FIG. 3—Grasping of one wrist: Signals penalty for holding.

FIG. 4—Military salute: Indicates penalty for unnecessary roughness.

FIG. 5—Shifting of hands in horizontal plane: Signals penalty has been refused, an incomplete pass, missed goal, or that the play is to be re-played.

FIG. 6—Both arms extended above head: A score; if the palms of the hands are brought together, a safety is indicated. If the hands are shifted in a vertical plane above the head: time out.

FIG. 7—Folded arms: Flying block or tackle.

FIG. 8—Waving hand behind back: Signals penalty for illegal forward pass.

FIG. 9—Horizontal arc of either hand: Signal-player illegally in motion.

FIG. 10—Pushing hands forward from shoulder with hands vertical: Signals penalty for interference with forward pass, also a pass which touches a player ineligible to receive it.

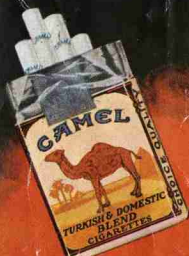
