State College Rolls Along!

The North Carolina State College of Agriculture and Engineering, having a physical plant of 47 buildings, reached approximately 11,000 persons annually in the pre-war years through its regular residence courses, extension classes, correspondence courses, and special short courses. More than 23,000 men and women were trained here for war work during World War II. The plant now has expanded to embrace 54 buildings, including two new dormitories under construction.

State College is one of the Land-Grant colleges established under the provisions of the Morrill Act, passed by Congress on June 2, 1892. The first session of the College was that of 1889-1890.

The name, the North Carolina College of Agriculture and Mechanic Arts, was used in the establishment of the institution, but the name was changed by the General Assembly in 1917 to its present form.

In its session of 1931, the General Assembly passed an act of which the following is the first section: "That the University of North Carolina, the North Carolina State College of

Agriculture and Engineering, and the North Carolina College for Women are hereby consolidated and merged into 'the University of North Carolina'."

The State College Campus, embracing 125 acres, lies within the limits of Raleigh, the State Capital. The College is located a mile and a quarter west of the Capitol on Hilbsoro Street and U. S. Highway No. 1. Adjoining the campus to the west are 456 additional acres including the College orchards, gardens, poultry plant and farms, and the Central State Agricultural Experiment Station.

The institution has acquired 1,387 more acres about one mile west of the campus. This tract of land is maintained as livestock farms by the Department of Animal Husbandry and Dairying.

State College has as its main purposes resident teaching, extension teaching, and research. Regarded as one of the leading technological institutions in the nation, State College is advancing the economic development and increasing the living standards of the people of North Carolina through technical education and research.

The College's main divisions include the School of Agriculture and Forestry, the School of Engineering, the School of Textiles, the Division of Teacher Education, the Graduate Division, the Basic Division, and the Summer School. The Department of Military Science and Tactics, providing ROTC training for the students, consistently has received an annual rating of "excellent" from the War Department.

The pre-war enrollment was 2,600. It now has sky-rocketed to 4,902, an all time record.

The birthplace of Andrew Johnson, 17th president of the United States, is located on the campus.



Names In State College Grid History

From the days of the leather nose guard, the flying wedge and the five-point TD, North Carolina State College has served as Alma Mater to a host of pigskin greats. Reviewing the local record of the nation's most popular collegiate sport, the names of many former stars are paraded: The first of all A and M elevens was coached by Perrin Busbee of Raleigh and played but one game, that on March 12, 1892, when Charles B. Williams, captain and halfback, led the Red and White to a two-touchdown win over Morson and Denson Academy of Raleigh. Other leaders in the football '90's, when squads were small and coaches played on the team (when they could make it), included: Joel Whitaker (1893); Dr. J. S. McKee, coach of the 1898 team which tied Carolina 11-11 after losing three weeks earlier, 34-0, to the same team; William Person, fullback; Zolly Mosby Bowdon, guard; L. O. Lougee, lefthalf; John McKinnon, right end; John Ramsey, left end; J. P. Turner, left tackle; Butch Caserly, halfback; J. H. Bunn, right guard; Sam Bryson, utility; Ned Wood, util-

After the turn of the century: "Babe" and "Curley" Wilson, halfbacks; O. Max Gardner, center and captain (1909); Frank M. Thompson, captain (1907); J. L. Von Glahn, right guard (1907-08); J. O. Sadler (1908); John B. Bray, center and captain, (1909);

The undefeated 1910 team included: Harry Hartsell, captain; D. A. Robertson, D. B. Floyd, Tal H. Stafford, and Bray.

Riddick Field was named for Professor W. C. Riddick in 1912, as a tribute by the students to "the father of athletics at State."

Leading the 1913 South Atlantic Champs were: W. T. Hurt, captain; J. H. Sullivan, W. W. Riddick, and C. E. Van Brocklin: stars during the next six years included: J. E. McDougal, C. C. Cooke, S. L. Homewood (captain, 1917); R. N. Gurley, A. W. McMurray, W. D. Wagoner, J. H. Ripple, W. T. Whitaker, and H. C. Weathers, captain, (1920). Wagoner was chosen all-southern guard and Ripple made a tackle post on one of Walter Camp's first all-American clubs. Wagoner, now Gulfford County agricultural agent, is father of John and Fred Wagoner, identical twims who play guard and tackle respectively for the present powerful Wolfback.

(Tubby) Logan, center and captain, 1926; Bill Metta, all-state center; Dave Floyd, tackle; Jakie Jordan, end; Fred Vaughan, all-southerm guard, 1925; John Lepo, captain and end, 1929; Mac Stout, all-state guard; Johnny Johnson, quarterback; Gus Wright, fullback; Herman Gardner, tackle; Jim May, guard; Floyd Dellinger, halfback, all 1929;


