### THE GATOR BOWL

On New Year's Day 1946 a new era in top-notch sports events dawned on Jacksonville with the birth of the "GATOR ROWL," a football classic than been the dream of Jacksonville citizency for many years, and a project that is destined to quickly take its place as a stellar event of annual importance to the griditon people of the nation.

The Gator Bowl is the outcome of the birth of an idea to give our city, community and the entire Southeastern section of the country an attraction each New Year's Day that will be second to none in the years to come.

The Gator Bowl came into being early in December 1945 when a small group of prominent and enthusiastic football-minded citizens met and decided to stage their first annual game on January 1, 1946. The idea spread like wild-fire and within ten days the "pioneers" were joined by a hundred more of their fellow citizens eager to help.

Officers were elected . . . press and radio were contacted . . . two great football machines were booked . . . tickets were sold . . . arrangements were made . . . and with the coming of the New Year the "baby" of all bowl games celebrated its birth with the Wake Forest "Deacons" defeating the University of South Carolina "Gamecocks" in a thrilling battle 26-14.

Ten thousand spectators thrilled to the spectacle that was highlighted by the half time appearance of the Jacksonville Naval Air Station band, and all were loud to acclaim the successful launching of the good ship "Gator Bowl."

Members of the Gator Bowl executive committee were invited to attend the Atlanta Touchdown Club Jamboree, and were publicly acclaimed for their efforts in staging the successful initial game.

A dream come true, arrangements were immediately started for the holding of the 1947 event. Additional sponsor memberships were made available to the public.

Dear Mr. Robinson:

I am very glad that you are planning bigger things for the next Getor Bowl game and it is a pleasure for me to make a statement in regard to the first Gator Bowl game.

"It was a distinct honor and pleasure for the Wake Forest College football team to be selected as a participant in the first Gator Bowl game played at Jacksonville, Florida, on January 1, 1946. Our opponent was the University of South Carolina and we had a fire game with their team.

We found the officials of the Gator Bowl to be most cooperative in every respect. The traveling arrangements and the hotel accommodations were the best we have ever experienced. The weather was ideal for football, and we found it to be about the same that we experienced during November in North Carolina.

I believe that the Gator Bowl has a great future and we would be glad to play in it at any time we were selected as one of the participating teams. I heartily recommend this bowl game to any college team without any reservations whatever."







### THE SOONERS IN SHORTS

### Brief Sketches of Oklahoma's 1946 Squad Members

#### CENTERS

Max Fischer ... looked good at both center and fullback in summer practice ... 24 ... 6.4 ... 174 ... married ... sub center at Oklahoma 1941 before going to the air corps ... a fine center at Norman high school in 1938-39-40 ... punts well ... fast for a big man.

John Rapaez . . . a 220-pound boy who played center at Kalamazoo, Mich, Central high school . . intercepted 17 forward passes for Jackson-ville last year but never scored . . enlisted in marines and fought in Marshalls and Gilbert Is-lands campaigns . . at 6-3 and 220 Rapaez is the runt of his family . . has five brothers who range from 230 to 280 pounds.

Alonzo Tillman . . . "Pete" a Mangum, Okla boy who pla: ed one year at Southwestern of Weatherford then strayed away to Marquette . . saw action in six campaigns during his 33 months in the air corps . . . 23 . . . 6 feet . . . 200 . . . married.

#### GUARDS

Plato Andros. . 42 months in Coast Guard, much of it around Iceland and Greenland in what was known early in the war as "Torpedo Junction". . 24 . . 6 feet . . . 225 . . majoring in pharmiacy . surprised the football squad by passing chemistry 1 . . refused two attractive "pro" offers this summer to return to OU

"I worked too hard on that chem to throw it away for 'pro' ball," he laughs . . . sub tackle behind Rogers Eason on OU team of 1941.

Norman McNabb ... a former Norman high school tackle (1939-40-41-42) who has never played in college, enlisting in the marine corps ... during 38 months of war he saw a world of action as a marine corporal in the Marshalls and Marianas campaigns ... in 1944 played for Pat Hanley's Fourth Marine division team ... 22 years old ... 6 feet 1/5 inch ... 200 pounds ... business administration.

Paul Burris . "Buddy" . . . 34 months with the army engineers in the Pacific, Rhineland and Central European theaters . . 23 . 5-11 . . . 210 . . . played end and tackle at Muslogee Central high school.

Stanley West . . . a 19-year-old guard from Enid high school (1941-42-43) who just returned from two years in the navy, seeing action in the Philippines campaigns . . . 6-1 . . . 235.

#### TACKLES

Bill Morris . . . a reserve end and tackle in 1941 and 1942 . from Oklahoma City and Northeast high school . . 6-3 . . . 210 . . majoring in accounting . . . a platoon sergeant who was 31 months with the marines and fought in the battles of Iwo Jima and Okinawa.

Earl Hale... a 224-pound Texan who played six-man footbul at Markham, Tex. high school, before enlisting in service... as an infantry sergeant, Hale saw lots of fighting in Europe winning a Purple Heart, Silver Star, Bronze Star and Combat Infantry medal ... 23 years old ... 6-2 married ... majoring in geology.

#### ENDS

Jim Tyree . . . just back from service . . . . played at left end for Coach Dewey "Snorter" Luster's Oklahoma teams of 1941 and 1942 . . . . good blocker and tackler . . 6-2 and 195 . . . married . from Oklahoma City Capitol Hill high school . . made second all-Big Six conference team in 1942.

Merle Dinkins . . . nicknames "Red" and "Five Thumbs" . . from Blackwell, Okla . . . all-Big Six end in 1944 . . played on Oklaho-ma's wartime teams of 1943 and 1944 then went to the Navy from which he has lately been discharged . . 6-1½ . . . 185.

Warren Giese . . . played at Rufus King high school, Milwaukee, Wis. . 21 . 6 feet ½ inch . . 190 . . during service played with Milwaukee state, Michigan college, Miami Naval Training center and Jacksonville, Fla. Naval Air station . . placed sixth in broad jump at 22 feet 8 inches at National Collegiate track and field meet of 1942.

Jim Owens . . . played two years in backfield and one at end with Oklahoma City Classen high school in 1942-43-44 . . . discharged from navy . . . 19 . . . 6-3 . . . 200.

#### QUARTERBACKS

Jack Mitchell . . . lives at Ponca City, aldropping the grew up and went to high school at Arkansas City, Kan., just across Oklahoma's northern border . 22 . . 6 feet . . 185 . . an infantry lieutenant, Mitchell spent three years in the war, fighting in the campaigns of Northeern France, Belgium and Northern Germany.

Dave Wallace . . as a freshman at Oklaloma in 1941, he tossed a touchdown pass against the varsity in the Boomer-Sooner game 23. 6 feet . . 175. . from Oklahoma City where he attended Classen high school and played football . . smashed his knee three days before his first varsity game in 1942, underwent an operation for removal of cartilage . a PPC, he blocked and tackled with the infantry nearly three years, fighting in the Ardennes, Rhineland and Central European campaigns.

#### HALFBACKS

Joe Golding . . . Oklahoma's sensational sophomore wingback of 1941 who hasn't played any football for five years . . . won a battle-field commission to lieutenant during more than four months combat in Battle of the Bulge . . . nicked in knee and leg by Nazi shrapnel but

lost no combat time . . . won Silver Star, Bronze Star and cluster . . 6 . . . 185 . . "junior" . . . at Eufaula high school in 1939 set national record by scoring all of his team's 71 points as Euraula snanked Hailevyille 71-0.

Leroy Neher... as a sophomore from Al'us, Nebre rame into prominence at the close of the 1942 season as a fancy-running wingback... answered to the name of "Train Whis:le' leber because of his authentic imitation of 01 97 whistling through Altus... 22... 5-11... 187... just back from 33 months with the marrines.

Durrell Royal ... little fellow ... 5-10 ... 163 ... 21. freshman ... as a carrier boy for the Hollis, Okha Daily News, he developed an uneanny accuracy at hitting front porches ... his football pass is a copy of this throw ... in 1642 led Hollis to an all-victorious season ... rade all-state team ... has played no college football although he was a reserve with Third Army Air Force team ... married ... has baby eith.

George Brewer . . Lubbock, Tex. high school . . came to OU to study law, enlist in the Naval ROTC and go out for sports . . . spent second semester last year at Texas Tech . . . no college experience.

Johnny Allsup . . . only 5-5½ tall . . . 160 pounds . . the Sooners call him "Super Mouse." . . 22 years old . . married . . business administration major . . played football and ran dashes on track team at Matador, Tex. high school and Hardin-Simmons university of Abilene, Tex . . . sub halfback last year at Jacksonville, Fla. NAS.

#### FULLBACKS

Myrle Greathouse . . sub blocking back of 1942 who was switched to end in Oklahoma's summer practice as Coach Jim Tatum began trying to bolster that position . . . 6 feet . . 190 pounds . . . played blocking back for Amarillo, Tex. high school's State champs of 1940 . Tex. married . . a marine corporal who fought at Cram, Okinawa and was in China . . . wounded in action.

A young lady examined my handsome new Gator Bowl tie clasp the other day. "What position did you play?" she asked.

"Right tackle," I responded, but I didn't tell her that I played it for the Wellford-Lyman-Tucapau Consolidated High School in 1926.

Every time that I look down at my handsome gold 'Gator with the football on his back pleasant memories crowd to my mind—memories of New Year's Day in one of America's loveliest cities; of succulent steaks, symbolic of Jacksonville's hospitality; of dogs in full cry after "Rusty"; and of a darn good football game.

If folks who attend Gator Bowl games in the future have as good a time as did we who inaugurated it in 1946, the Bowl is assured of success. The Western Conference can have its roses, as far as I am concerned. I'll take those Jax Beach shrimp any time.

It was my privilege to represent the University of South Carolina in matters pertaining to public relations at the first Gator Bowl game, and to chaperon a group of South Carolina newspapermen—not that Winchell, Finnefrock and Baker wouldn't provide chaperonage enough for any occasion.

I am now a publicity director emeritus, but if the Gamecocks ever go to the Gator Bowl again, I'll come out of retirement and hobble along. I'm proud of my charter membership in the Gator Bowl Sportswriters Association, as proud as any sports writer could be. And besides I have some unfinished business with some dogs—and some shrimp. Seriously, all of us who were connected with the University of South Carolina's participation in the Gator Bowl are among its most enthusiastic backers; we are exceedingly pleased that we had a part in launching it. We lost the game, but we put on a darn good show and nobody was too sad about it.

Football is a great game. There are many forces working for its destruction at present. But lovers of the game should have no worries about its future as long as games like the 1946 Gator Bowl can be played—games hard and clean, games characterized by real sportsmanship. May the Gator Bowl always stand for that kind of football.



# Fanning With Finney

Although it was arranged on short notice — just three weeks before it was played to be exact — Jacksonville's first annual Gator Bowl football game last New Year's Day proved to be an artistic success and the financial loss incurred was negligible.

The contest, played in weather that was clear and cool, resulted in a 26-14 victory for the Wake Forest Deacons over the lighter but scrappy Gamecocks of the University of South Carolina.

Coach D. C. (Peahead) Walker's Demon Deacons, a pre-game 13-point favorite, scored in the first quarter but the Gamecocks, tutored last season by John McMillan, retaliated with a second period touchdown and converted the extra point to hold a 7-6 lead at half time.

Wake Forest's power told in the last half, however, the Deacons driving 79 yards for a tally in the first four minutes of play, Fullback Richard (Rock) Brinkley plunging over from the two-yard stripe.

The Deacons added two more touchdowns in the last period but the plucky Gamecocks had one more thrill reserved for the approximately 10,000 spectators, Charley (Dutch) Brembs, speedy half-back from Pompton Plains, N. J., intercepting a pass by Herb Appenzoller, and racing 90 yards for his team's second marker.

Brembs placekicked the extra point just as he had done after Fullback Bobby Giles had smashed over from the one-foot line to culminate an 80-yard advance for South Carolina's first touchdown.

Brinkley and Tailback Nick Sacrinty sparked the Wake Forest offensive that rolled up 396 yards and 24 first downs as compared to South Carolina's 157 yards and seven first downs.

The Deacons moved 36 yards for their initial tally, N. Sacrinty accounting for the last two yards.

It was Brinkley again who brought a successful finish to a Wake Forest march of 80 yards early in the fourth period. Dick Foreman, Deacon center, set up the last touchedwn when he partially blocked Giles' punt, Wake Forest

getting possession of the oval on the Gamecocks' 25. On the next play, Wingback Bob Smathers went wide around left end for the counter.

Bo Sacrinty kicked the extra point after the last two Wake Forest Tallies.

To Charles Hilty and Ray McCarthy goes a full measure of the credit for originating the idea of a bowl game for Jacksonville.

Along with Maurice Cherry and W. C. Ivey, they underwrote last year's contest but the comparatively small indebtedness they incurred was taken over by the Gator Bowl Association when it was formed on a permanent basis as a non-profit organization.

In one brief year the Gator Bowl Association has grown to such proportions that it was able to present, in Oldahoma and N. C. State, two of the country's leading football teams for its second annual game today.

President W. E. (Ted) Arnold and the other officers of the association are deeply grateful for the support they have received and hope you'll obtain a full measure of enjoyment from today's contest between Beattie Feathers' Wolfpack and Jim Tatum's Sooners.

Unlike last year's game, which brought together two teams that were members of the same conference and had met each other during the regular season, today's affair matches up clubs with excellent records (Oklahoma 7-3 and N. C. State 8-2) from different sections of the country.

Many sports writers have said that there are too many bowl games nowadays. Perhaps they are right. But the Gator Bowl is not one of those we can afford to do without. Keep it going! Keep it always dedicated to those high ideals of sportsmanship and pride in achievement which have made America great. You can't lose.

Some day we hope to come back to the Gator Bowl as participants. But until then we'll be on the sidelines cheering. There is a warm spot for you in every Gamecock heart.

The 1946 Gator Bowl game was a good game, certainly one of the best bowl contests in the nation. It was filled with brilliant running, with hard tackling and blocking, with spectacular passing, and it was characterized by as fine a level of sportsmanship as I have ever seen.

Wake Forest had the best team, the most powerful team, and the best team won. But the out-manned Gamecocks put up a fight which was quite in keeping with the symbolism of their name. They really gave the fans their money's worth.

The North Carolina State College of Agriculture and Engineering, having a physical plant of 47 buildings, reached approximately 11,000 persons annually in the pre-war years through its regular residence courses, extension classes, correspondence courses, and special short courses. More than 23,000 men and women were trained here for war work during World War II. The plant now has expanded to embrace 54 buildings, including two new dormitories under construction.

State College is one of the Land-Grant coll ses established under the provisions of the Morrian Act, passed by Congress on June 2, 1892. The first session of the College was that of 1889-1890.

The name, the North Carolina College of Agriculture and Mechanic Arts, was used in the establishment of the institution, but the name was changed by the General Assembly in 1917 to its present form.

In its session of 1931, the General Assembly passed an act of which the following is the first section: That the University of North Carolina, the North Carolina State College of Agriculture and Engineering, and the North Carolina College for Women are hereby consolidated and merged into 'the University of North Carolina'."

The State College Campus, embracing 125 acres, lies within the limits of Raleigh, the State Capital. The College is located a mile and a quarter west of the Capitol on Hillsboro Street and U. S. Highway No. 1. Adjoining the campus to the west are 456 additional acres including the College orchards, gardens, poultry plant and farms, and the Central State Agricultural Experiment Station.

The institution has acquired 1,387 more acres about one mile west of the campus. This tract of and is maintained as livestock farms by the Department of Animal Husbandry and Dairying.

State College has as its main purposes resident teaching, extension teaching, and research. Regarded as one of the leading technological institutions in the nation, State College is advancing the economic development and increasing the living standards of the people of North Carolina through technical education and research.

The College's main divisions include the School of Agriculture and Forestry, the School of Engineering, the School of Textiles, the Division of Teacher Education, the Graduate Division, the Basic Division, and the Summer School. The Department of Military Science and Tactics, providing ROTC training for the students, consistently has received an annual rating of "excellent" from the War Department.

The pre-war enrollment was 2,600. It now has sky-rocketed to 4,902, as an all time record.

The birthplace of Andrew Johnson, 17th president of the United States, is located on the campus.


