



New Director



ROY B. CLOGSTON

On July 7, 1948 the North Carolina State College Athletic Council selected Roy Bennett Clogston of Canton, N. Y. as director of athletics. The former director of athletics at St. Lawrence University assumed his duties on the West Raleigh campus on August 1.

Mr. Clogston, who prefers to be called Roy, is a graduate of Springfield College, Springfield, Mass. He is 44-years old and unmarried. At Springfield he was a star lineman on the football squad and played both track and lacrosse. He stands 6 feet 3 inches and tips the scales at 214-pounds.

Clogston's educational background is extensive. He completed work on a Physical Education degree in 1928 at Springfield and accepted a post at Middlebury (Mass.) College as assistant director of physical education. After two years at Middlebury he returned to Springfield and completed work on a Bachelor of Science Degree in 1931. The following year, 1932, he attended New York University where he received his Masters Degree. At present he is completing work on a Doctors Degree from NYU.

Clogston became director of athletics at St. Lawrence University in 1932 and held that post until his entrance into the Navy in 1942 where he attained the rank of commander. During World War II Clogston served as rehabilitation officer on Guam and other bases in the South Pacific. On Guam he made the acquaintance of Backfield Coach Walter (Babe) Wood, who was also serving in the Navy program.

Following his discharge from the Navy in 1945, Clogston returned to St. Lawrence University as head football coach and director of athletics. He had marked success at St. Lawrence with his football team, employing a box-T-formation. Clogston is a member of the Lions Club, Elks Club, and of the National Collegiate Athletic Association committee for Physical Education, Health and Recreation.





Coach Beattie Feathers begins his fifth year as head coach of the Wolfpack today and as usual his opponent is Wallace Wade's Duke University Blue Devils. Its a tough assignment for both Feathers and his entire new staff of assistants as well as the 40 man State squad which you see below on the field.

The State team was hit hard by ineligibility in August when End Bill Stanton of Rowland, Tackle Jim Rees of Shelby, Ohio and Fullback Leslie (Footsy) Palmer of Cedar Grove, W. Va., were declared out of competition for 1948 because of the completion of their three years of playing eligibility. All three of these men would have been starters in the game today. Their loss has weakened the State squad immeasurably.

But we are now breaking out the crying towel for the Wolfpack. Duke may be superior in a number of ways. Their experience in both the line and back field is probably equal to State's in very way, but the Wolfpack is a determined team. Their spirit will not be inferior in any way.

Feathers staff, making its debut today, includes Line Coach Al Rotella, a newcomer to the coaching game from Paterson, N. J. Rotella gained valuable experience at the University of Tennessee as an all-star tackle. He has won his way into the hearts of his line-men. He is a young coach, only 27-years old, but he has instilled in the hearts of his players a determination to play their best.

Backfield Coach Walter Slater is another youngster in this coaching game. He hails from Providence, R.I. and last season was one of the most promising backs in professional football as a regular member of the Pittsburgh Steelers. Slater has to 'know-how' and is great at passing along his personal experiences to the men under his tutelage. Slater is 28-years old. Slater is also a University of Tennessee graduate.

End Coach Charles W. Ramey is former athletic director at Ashland (Ky.) Senior

High. He has had marked success as a prep school mentor at Portsmouth and Wilmington, Ohio and at Ashland. In the Kentucky high school in 1942 he won the state title and was named "High School Coach of the Year." Ramey is married, has two children and is regarded as a top end coach. He is a graduate of the University of Cincinnati.

We're justly proud of the Wolfpack squad, which State will field today. Guard Charlie Musser of Frankfort, W. Va. is a big cog in the forward wall. He's one of the leading linemen in the South and along with teammate Bernie Watts of Girard, Ohio offers one of the best guard combinations to be found in this hot-bed of football. Both men are shooting for All-Southern honors this year and possible a crack at mythical All-American team which will be selected later. Other top-notchers are Center Hal Saunders of Statesville, Blocking Back Bob Bowlby of Paterson, N. J. and Tailback Gwyn Fletcher of Winston-Salem.

Riddick Stadium will be the scene of three other top-notch grid encounters this season. Oct. 9 finds Davidson College's Wildcats as visitors to our turf for a night encounter. The other two home clashes are with the University of Virginia on Nov. 6 in a big home coming occasion and Villanova College on Nov. 27. Tickets are still available for all games at the State athletic office in the Riddick Stadium Field House, but they're going fast, so we suggest you latch on to yours while the supply lasts.

In passing may we note also that Riddick Stadium has a 'new look' today and if you feel that its to your advantage as a fan thanks are due State's new athletic director Roy B. Clogston, who took over the post at the head of the Wolfpack's athletic program on Aug. 1. Clogston is a native of Ballston Lake, N. Y. and a graduate of Springfield College (Mass.) He's a welcome addition to the staff and we all wish him luck in his new post.

About Duke

And so today we start another football season . . .

What it will bring in the way of victories and defeats for Duke and N. C. State no one can tell . . . We do know, however, that there will be spills and thrills, gladness and heart-ache, surprise and disappointment . . . all of which go with the annual fall madness . . .

On the Duke team today you see several boys who may be well up on the list when the final game with North Carolina rolls around. The Blue Devils are not strong in reserves and have some spots where there are no standouts but in several places Coach Wallace Wade can field boys who are good as they are in the land.

One of them is Captain Al DeRogatis, a second All-American choice in 1946 who was out most of last season due to a knee injury. The condition of that knee is not known and only time can tell whether it will permit him to play for the Blue Devils this fall. This fellow, one of the biggest boys ever to play for Duke, is a true All-American performer and, at top speed, one of the finest tackles in the history of football.

Another great is Louis Allen, the other Duke tackle. He was slowed down by an injury last season but when he is in the best physical shape, he cannot be beaten. Old timers compare Allen in all-around play to All-American Fred Crawford of the 1933 Blue Devils.

A third is Fred Folger, Jr., the brilliant tailback who last year ranked third in the nation in punting and was one of the top men in returning intercepted passes. His work in early practices at Duke was terrific until he was slowed down by an old ankle injury which

cropped out during the second week of drills this fall. He can carry the mail with the best of them when in top shape, can throw, can kick and can defend.

A fourth is Bill Davis, last of three brothers who have all starred for Duke. Davis plays guard for the Blue Devils and he should be set for his greatest season this fall. He's a great running guard, is husky and fast and will really crack 'em when they get in his way.

As a whole, this Duke team is a young team without great experience. Only three of the players today—DeRogatis, Allen and Quarterback John Montgomery played much in 1946. The experience they gained last season should help but compared to other squads on the Duke schedule, the Blue Devils are younger and less experienced.

It is a big team in size but most football teams in these days are loaded with larger men than was the case several years back.

This series of football games between Duke and N. C. State is a great one. It has furnished as many thrills perhaps as any of the football rivalries in the south. It has been a series full of the unexpected. It has been one of great upsets and of close scores.

Today's game should be no exception to that rule. This looks like a ding-dong battle between two teams which, as far as can be told in advance, are fairly well evenly matched.

Don't forget that Duke and Tennessee and Wade and Neyland resume their battling in Duke stadium at Durham next Saturday afternoon at 2:30 o'clock. BETTER ORDER THOSE TICKETS TONIGHT!

Do you know...



Football is the oldest of modern sports, with records showing that the ancient Greeks used a "kicked ball" in their game of "harpaston." It became so popular in medieval England that Edward II forbade it on the grounds that it "caused too much noise and excitement."



The longest run in football was made by Wyllys Terry of Yale in 1884: 115 yards! The field at that time was 110 yards long, and Terry was five yards behind his own goal when he received the ball. Since, runs of over 100 yards have been reported, but none equals Terry's sprint.



Although the Michigan teams of 1901, '02, '03, '04, and '05 had the reputation of being "point a minute" teams, they never actually achieved this perfection. Since 1914, however, five teams have actually scored one or more points for each minute played during the season. These teams were Phillips, '22; Missouri Mines, '14; Georgia Tech, '18; and Henry Kendall, both in '19 and '20.

The first "football suits" were worn by Navy in 1879, according to Walter Camp, famous football authority. They were sleeveless jackets of canvas laced in front and drawn tight to fit the body. Such suits offered little handhold for tackling, and it is recorded that one team actually greased itself to foil tacklers. The suits proved so slippery that the opposing team protested, and "greased suits" were banned.







State College...

An Historical Sketch

North Carolina State College, the center of technological research and education in the South, began its 60th year of service with the opening of the current academic year.

Chancellor J. W. Harrelson, the present chief administrative officer of the institution, has led the College to its greatest period of usefulness. The College and its allied agencies reach many thousands of North Carolina citizens annually with their varied functions in agriculture, architecture, engineering, teacher education, and textiles.

Establishment of the institution was due largely to the militant efforts of Col. Leonidas L. Polk, hard-hitting editor of *The Progressive Farmer*, the *Watauga Club*, and the provisions of the Morrill Act of 1862. From its humble beginning, the college has marched straight ahead to take a position of leadership among the institutions of technology in the United States.

State College has grown from its one building in 1889 to a physical plant valued in excess of \$10,000,000 today, with a building program of over \$6,000,000 now in progress. The enrollment has advanced from 72 students—who reported to President Alexander Q. Holladay during the first academic year—to over 5,000 today.

The teaching faculty has jumped from President Holladay's original staff of 20 to approximately 441 now. Over 750 persons are now employed on the campus.

Many agricultural, engineering, industrial, and textile leaders have joined hands to enlarge the facilities and strengthen the faculty of State College through the foundations. They have organized and are supporting the Agricultural Foundation, the Engineering Foundation, the Textile Foundation, and the Dairy Foundation. These organizations are supplementing State funds in paying the salaries of many top-ranking scientists, engineers, textile authorities, and other leading educators and research men at the College.

As a result of the foundation work, State College now has several eminent faculty and staff members that it would not have been able to obtain other wise.

Adjoining the campus to the west are 456 acres including the college orchards, gardens, poultry plant and farms, and the Central State Agricultural Experiment Station. About one mile west of the campus, the institution has acquired 1,300 acres which are maintained as livestock farms by the Department of Animal Husbandry and Dairying.

The college's main divisions include the School of Agriculture and Forestry, the School of Engineering, the School of Textiles, the School of Education, the School of Architecture and Landscape Design, the Graduate Division, the Basic Division, and the Summer School. The Department of Military Science and Tactics, providing ROTC training for the students, consistently has received an annual rating of "excellent" from the War Department.

Principal landmarks on the campus include Holladay Hall, the school's first building; the birthplace of Andrew Johnson, 17th president of the United States; Memorial Tower, impressive monument to the State College alumni who served in World War I; the home of the chancellor; Pullen Hall, named in honor of R. Stanhope Pullen, who donated the land for the original campus; a memorial to the 13 original colonies; and other sites of interest.

State College has more than 25,000 living alumni, many of whom are nationally known for their accomplishments in industry, science, military progress, agriculture, education, and political life. More than 6,000 alumni of the school—most of whom were officers—served in the armed forces during World War II. Over 300 of the service men died in battle during the progress of the war.

The institution is delighted to welcome its many friends to this athletic contest today and hopes that they will have a pleasant time while they are on the campus.

COACH WALLACE WADE



Wallace Wade, Head Football Coach at Duke University has one of the finest coaching records of all-time.

Wade's lifetime record—covering 25 years of coaching—is 185 victories, 43 defeats and ten ties. His 13-year record at Duke is 93 victories, 27 defeats and five ties. Of those 27 defeats, 18 have been by the margin of one touchdown or less. The consistency in his record can be illustrated in a comparison of his eight years at Alabama and his first eight years at Duke. At Alabama, he won 61, lost 13, and tied three. At Duke, over that period, he won 61, lost 15, and tied three.

Highest honor that can be attained by a football coach came to Wade in the winter of 1947 when he was named to the National Collegiate Athletic Association football rules committee representing the Third District. He succeeded W. A. Alexander of Georgia Tech.

The NCAA football rules committee is the boss outfit of collegiate football, making all the rules and the interpretations.

Wade matriculated at Brown University in Providence, R. I., electing to follow his brother there. He worked to defray part of his college expenses and stories are told of how he walked several miles to football practice in order to save the nickels provided the players for transportation.

He played guard on the Brown team for three years and was a member of the eleven which played against Washington State in the Rose Bowl game of 1916. He therefore has the distinction of appearing in this historic post-season classic, once a player and five times as a coach.

He accepted his first coaching position at the Fitzgerald and Clark preparatory school in Tullahoma, Tennessee, and there produced outstanding teams in a variety of athletics. His football teams won 15 games and lost three during his two-year tenure.

In 1921, he moved to Vanderbilt as assistant to Dan McGugin, remaining at that post for two years. Vanderbilt teams were undefeated and twice tied over this two-year span.
