One of the most improved men on current team and will be a thorn in opponents side. Studying Industrial Arts Education. Twenty years old. Extra point specialist, booted nine of 12 tries last season.



***WEBSTER, Alex**—210 pounds, 6-3. Junior. Kearny, New Jersey. One of the brightest backfield prospects in State history, "Big Alex" may be the key to the Wolfpack success in '51. Hardest running back ever to wear State uniform and can pass and kick when necessary. Averaged nearly 20 yards on each punt return last year and scored three touchdowns. Great high school record, named All-State (New Jersey) All-Metropolitan (Kearny) and All-County. Studying Rural and Industrial Recreation. Twenty years old. Will play left half in split-T.

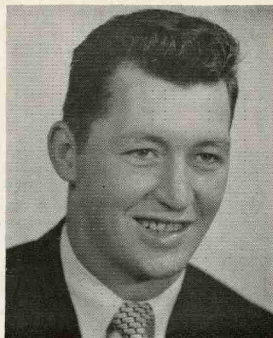
