### 1967 OUTLOOK

North Carolina State, Atlantic Coast Conference champions in three of the past four years, will rely upon a strong defensive unit to keep the Wolfpack in the ACC title race in 1967.

"I believe we have a chance to be better than good up front on defense and in our secondary," says head coach Earle Edwards. "We've got more problems and have further

to go on offense with nine lettermen missing."

#### Four All-ACC Losses

The Wolfpack must replace four all-ACC selections who helped set State's all-time total offense record in 1966 in Don DeArment and Gary Rowe at the halfbacks, tackle Bill

Gentry, and guard John Stec on offense.

State could utilize two types of backfields with power running the feature of the first unit and speed and quickness the make-up of the alternate group. Quarterback Jim Donnan, the Pack's total offense leader with 821 yards last year as an alternate with Charlie Noggle, represents the most experience in the backfield. At the end of the spring drills Tony Barchuk was the running back, while Bobby Hall was at wingback, and Settle Dockery was the fullback. The Pack should have a quick and speedy unit with Jack Klebe at quarterback, sophomore Charlie Bowers at fullback, and Leon Mason and Jimmy Lisk at halfback. This is probably the best depth the Wolfpack has had in the backfield since Edwards started here in 1954.

### End and Center Strong

While there are some shortcomings in the offensive line, it isn't at end or center where seniors Harry Martell and Don Donaldson man the wings and junior Carey Metts starts at center. But the Pack's problems are likely to come up front, where there is a lack of front-line experienced interior linemen. Lettermen Norman Cates and Flake Campbell, and sophomores Don Jordan and Robby Evans are the guards. Lloyd Spangler, injured in 1966, is expected to open at left tackle, while co-captain Steve Warren is one of the ACCs best blockers at right tackle.

All-America tackle Dennis Byrd heads a line that has good size and mobility, and Art McMahon and Greg Williams give the Pack good knowledge and speed in the secondary

on defense.

#### **Byrd Heads Defense**

Mark Capuano, Benny Lemmons, and Pete Sokalsky, all-ACC two years ago but out with a knee injury in 1966, are solid defensive ends. Trent Holland teams with Byrd to give the Wolfpack as strong a starting duo as there is in the ACC at defensive tackle. Ron Carpenter (6-6, 250) and Art Hudson (6-4, 280) are sophomores who have bright futures at defensive tackle.

Middle guard Terry Brookshire and linebacker Chuck Amato are two-time lettermen who give State good inside protection, but the second linebacker spot must be manned by

sophomores Mike Hilka and Steve Diacont.

The Wolfpack has potentially its best defensive secondary under Edwards, with Williams and McMahon at the safeties, and Bill Morrow and Fred Combs as cornerbacks. Gary Yount and Dick Idol are two outstanding sophomores in the secondary.
