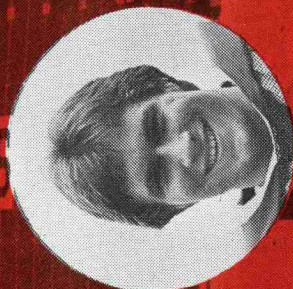

THE OUTLOOK

Good balance among 38 returning lettermen and excellent leadership at the all-important quarterback position gives solid indication that the Wolfpack will again be a contender for both conference and national honors, even though the schedule is one of the toughest in the school's history.

The Pack, which has played in three straight post-season bowls and last year finished 9th and 11th nationally in the final AP and UPI polls, will be led offensively at quarterback by all-America candidate Dave Buckey, as fine a passer, option man and field general as there is in the nation.

BUCKEY IS PROVEN LEADER

Buckey, who has led State to 12 victories and one tie in the 15 games that he has started the past three seasons, completed 105 of 162 passes during 1974 for 8 touchdowns, 1,481 yards and a glittering 65% accuracy.

For his career, the talented senior from Akron, Ohio, has amassed a total of 3,255 yards, accounted for 24 TD's and has thrown for a remarkable 59% accuracy in connecting on 190 of 323 aerials.

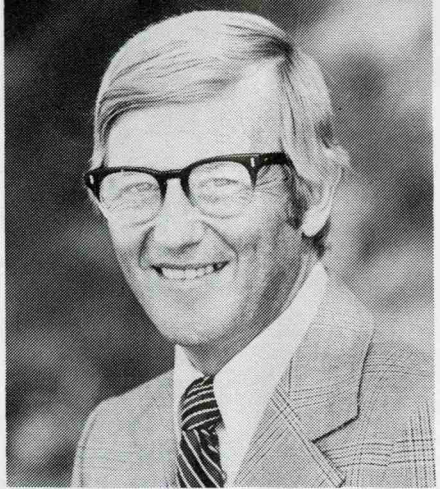
The Wolfpack, which has averaged 31 points and 400-plus yards on offense the past three campaigns, should again be explosive with such performers returning as receivers Don Buckey, Elijah Marshall and Pat Hovance, runners Tommy London, Johnny Evans, Timmy Johnson, Buster Ray and Richard Carter, and linemen Ed Callaway, Tom Serfass, Mike Fagan and Bill Druschel.

DEFENSE APPEARS STRONG

Defensively, State should be at its strongest in years. Ralph Stringer and Eddie Poole, a pair of superior athletes with bonafide all-America potential, top a list of six returning starters. Other stand-outs include Jeff Easter, Clarence Cotton and Ron Banther at the ends, Jim Henderson and Tom Prongay at tackle, Tom Higgins at guard, Jack Hall and Bill Cherry at linebacker, and Rich Wheeler, Darryl Jackson and Mike Miller in the secondary.

Overall, the Pack looks for another winning season despite a schedule that includes such powerhouses as Florida, Michigan State, Indiana, South Carolina and Penn State, in addition to the usual tough opposition in the Atlantic Coast Conference.

COACH LOU HOLTZ SAYS:



"We do not seem to have glaring weaknesses on either offense or defense, but the people at skill positions must stay healthy and produce if we are to have a good football team.

"In view of our schedule, we must be stronger than we've been in the past. We have some players with ability who can be outstanding, such as Dave and Don Buckey, Ralph Stringer, Eddie Poole, Johnny Evans, Pat Hovance and Tom Serfass, to name a few.

"I don't want to be real optimistic, but if some of our young people come through for us, we can be competitive.

"That's saying a lot, considering the schedule we will play. But I feel this squad will acquit itself well."
