Article I

Name

The name of this organization is the Agricultural Institute Club of the College of Agriculture and Life Sciences at N.C. State University.

Article II

Purpose

The purpose of the Agricultural Institute Club is to:

1. Promote leadership qualities among its members
2. Promote scholarship and companionship
3. Aid in the scientific and technical advancement of agriculture
4. Support the School and its development

Article III

Officers

The officers shall consist of a President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, Parliamentarian, Reporter, and an Agriculture and Life Council Representative. The officers shall be elected during the next to last meeting of the academic year and installed at the last meeting. The term is one year.

Article IV

Membership Requirements

Students enrolled at N.C. State University are eligible for Club membership.

Article V

Motto

Article VI

Activities

The Club will sponsor activities to promote the purpose of the Club defined in Article II.

Article VII

Meetings

The dates and times of meetings will be decided by the officers and announced in advance of the academic term.

Article VIII

Awards

Club members, faculty, and other supporters of the Club will be recognized for outstanding service to the Club at an annual Agricultural Institute Club Awards Banquet.

Article IX

Amendments

The Constitution can be amended with a two-thirds vote of the membership.

CONSTITUTION

Agricultural Institute Club

ARTICLE I

Name

The name of this Student Organization at NC State University shall be Agricultural Institute Club.

ARTICLE II

Purposes

The purposes of this organization shall be:

- A. To promote scholarship, leadership, friendship, and community sprits among members.
- B. To encourage and foster high ethical standards of professional positions held by agricultural students.
- C. To promote the profession of agriculture.
- D. To aid in the scientific and technological advancement of agriculture.
- E. To render service and to cooperate with the student bodies and the administrations of the College of Agriculture and Life Sciences and NC State University in meeting mutual objectives.

ARTICLE III

Membership

Students enrolled at NC State University are eligible for membership. An annual membership fee of \$15 is required.

ARTICLE IV

Officers

The officers of this organization shall be elected by the membership at the next to last meeting during the spring semester to serve a term of one year beginning May 15. Officers must have a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or higher. Offices and the duties of officers shall be as follows:

- A. President: Lead meetings, appoint committees, and oversee activities.
- B. Vice President: Support the President in his / her duties and fill in for the President as needed.
- C. Secretary: Record minutes at every meeting and present them at the next meeting.
- D. Parliamentarian: Ensure that the Constitution and By-Laws are followed.
- E. Treasurer: Maintain the financial records.
- F. Reporter: Advertise meetings and fundraisers.
- G. Agri-Life Representative: Represent this organization at Agri-Life Council meetings.
- H. Alternate Agri-Life Representative: Support the Agri-Life Representative in his / her duties.

ARTICLE V

Meetings

Meetings are biweekly on Wednesdays beginning with the first Wednesday of each semester unless scheduled differently by the officers.

ARTICLE VI

Committees

Committees consisting of officers and / or regular members shall be appointed by the President as needed and must be headed by an officer.

ARTICLE VII

Motto

The motto of this organization shall be, "Let Education Pull the Plow."

ARTICLE VIII

Amendments to Constitution

The Constitution of this organization may be amended by a 2/3 vote of the membership provided that the officers have approved the proposed amendment by a 2/3 vote. Amendments must be presented at one meeting and voted on at the next regular meeting.
