

QUESTIONS YOU MAY HAVE ABOUT AΩE:

Q: What is RUSH?

A: RUSH is the period of time, usually 10-14 days, in which interested female engineers attend the events organized by AΩE in order to meet the active members and learn what AΩE is all about. Past events have included: Picnics, Movie Night, Scavenger Hunts, Build-A-Sundae and Putt-Putt.

Q: Do I have to go to all of the events?

A: Attendance at every event is not mandatory but is encouraged.

Q: How long does the Membership Education Development last?

A: After rush, if an individual is invited to become a Candidate of AΩE, the Development period is approximately eight weeks.

Q: How much does it cost?

A: Fees for the Membership Education Development semester are approximately \$70 and Active Sister fees are approximately \$150.

Q: What do I have to do during the candidacy period?

A: Basically, you get to know AΩE. This includes:

- *Half hour interviews with sisters
- *Organizing a Membership Development Book
- *Weekly meetings and Candidate projects
- *Social functions and a trip one weekend
- *Spirit Week

Q: When does Membership Education Development officially start? How will we know?

A: If the individual is chosen by AΩE to become a candidate for membership, she will be notified by a formal letter inviting her to do so. Dates of the following activities and events will be explained at that time.

Q: Are there any "stupid" rules we have to follow as Candidates?

A: Nothing that will cause bodily harm or emotional disturbance. We take AΩE seriously while still having fun.

Q: How is AΩE different from other sororities on campus?

A: AΩE is special. We are both a professional and social sorority. Since we are a fairly small sorority, we all know each other and have become close friends. As far as we are concerned, we are very lucky to be so diverse.

CHAPTER CONSTITUTION

Article I

Section 1 This organization shall be known as the Gamma Chapter of Alpha Omega Epsilon.

Section 2 The purpose of this organization shall be to promote professionalism, leadership and friendship among its members. By sharing in academic, social, and professional experiences, strong bonds are formed and leadership and professionalism are strengthened.

Article II

Section 1 Membership will be granted only to women currently enrolled in the College of Engineering at North Carolina State University, with the exception of the charter members.

Section 2 All women engineering students wishing to become a member of Alpha Omega Epsilon must complete a pledging period of of eight weeks, during which they will be required to meet certain criteria. Upon meeting these requirements, they will be initiated as sister of Alpha Omega Epsilon.

Article III

Section 1 The elective officers of this organization will be President, Vice President, Treasurer, and Scribe.

Section 2 These officers will be elected by fully initiated and active members.

Section 3 All officers must be enrolled in the College of Engineering at the time they are elected.

Article IV

Section 1 Dues shall be determined by the chapter, in accordance with the needs assessed by the majority of voting members present at the time new officers are elected. Furthermore, national dues are to paid at the onset of each semester by all active members.

Section 2 Fines which are proposed and approved by a 2/3 majority of the quorum will be assessed on persons as deemed necessary.

Article V

Section 1 This organization shall meet weekly, with the exception of days that fall on university or national holidays.

Article VI

Section 1 This organization shall have the following standing committees: projects committee, rush committee, budget committee, by-laws committee, and social committee. Each shall have a chairperson nominated by the members of said committee.

Section 2 A new committee may be added by a 2/3 majority vote of the quorum.

Section 3 Each person must serve on at least one committee per semester.

ALPHA OMEGA EPSILON

CONSTITUTION

ARTICLE I - NAME

The name of this organization shall be Alpha Omega Epsilon, hereafter referred to as the Organization.

ARTICLE II - AFFILIATION

All Active Chapters and Alumnae will abide by all rules and guidelines written within this document. All Active Chapters and Alumnae will work with the Alpha Omega Epsilon National Executive Board to promote the ideals and objectives of Alpha Omega Epsilon.

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Membership shall consist of five distinct status': Membership Candidate, Active, Alumna, Associate and Honorary member. Qualifications for membership shall be as provided in the Bylaws.

The power to elect candidates shall abide with the Active chapters.

Any Active member may propose membership for any qualified person at any active meeting for which prior notice has been given to all voting members of the chapter of the intent to vote on prospective members. The membership proposal may be made orally and must be supported by at least one other voting member of the chapter. The proposal may be voted on immediately by a membership election vote.

Section 3 - Obligations of Membership

Section 4 - Expulsion

Expulsion of a member shall be as provided in the Bylaws. A member may be expelled for violating the oath of membership, for dishonorable or improper conduct, for disloyalty to the Organization or for actions that are harmful to the Organization.

ARTICLE IV - THE NATIONAL EXECUTIVE BOARD (NEB)

Section 1 - Membership

National Executive Board (NEB) Officers to the Organization shall be:

- a. President
- b. Vice-President
- c. Secretary
- d. Treasurer
- e. Interchapter Relations

Section 2 - Eligibility

To be a candidate for an office of the NEB, the member must meet the following qualifications:

- a. Be an Alumnae member who has served at least one year on a National Committee, as a National Committee Chairperson or as a Chapter Alumnae Advisor.
- b. A candidate for President must have served at least one year as a National Executive Board Officer.

Section 3 - Term of Office

The term of each NEB office is two fiscal years with a maximum of three terms.

Section 4 - Jurisdiction and Duties

The duties of the NEB are as follows:

- a. Make laws for governing the Organization and guiding its members in the attainment of the ideals and objectives of the Organization.
- b. Conduct all business by majority vote.
- c. Perpetuate the Organization and plan for its expansion.
- d. Fix and assess initiation fees for each member being initiated into the Organization, a charter fee for each new active chapter, and yearly active member fees.

The duties of the NEB Officers are outlined below:

President

- a. The President must know and uphold the National Constitution.
- b. She presides at the Organization conventions and at meetings of the NEB and she must notify the Vice President in advance if she cannot attend.
- c. She is the meeting mediator and remains impartial during all meeting discussions.
- d. She presides over all National Ceremonies.
- e. She is responsible for maintaining all short and long term goals of the Organization.

- f. She signs charter and membership certificates.
- g. She provides general supervision over the activities of the NEB officers.
- h. She cares for matters of discipline and extremes.
- i. She votes on all chapter and NEB legislation, but her vote is counted only in the event of a tie.
- j. She oversees the Judiciary Committee and the Election Committee.
- k. She maintains and submits necessary forms to maintain the legal status of the NEB, such as Incorporation and Tax Exemption.

Vice-President

- a. The Vice-President presides over the meetings after being notified by the President that she cannot attend.
- b. She is responsible for coordinating and directing the Expansion Committee and other special committees.
- c. She assists the President with all ceremonies.
- d. She is responsible for the props and equipment for all ceremonies.
- e. She votes on all chapter and NEB legislation.

Secretary

- a. The Secretary votes on all chapter and NEB legislation.
- b. She signs charter certificates.
- c. She acts as the NEB contact and member of the Alumni Relations, Newsletter, and A&E History Committee.
- d. She supervises the activities of the Active Chapters and activities of the Chapter Alumnae Advisors.
- e. She defines and oversees all administrative procedures.
- f. She defines and oversees all Risk Management responsibilities at the National level.

Treasurer

- a. The Treasurer votes on all chapter and NEB legislation.
- b. She acts as the NEB contact and member of the Financial Activities committee.
- c. She performs all financial transactions for the NEB, including receiving all income and payment of all debts.
- d. She is responsible for maintaining the National Budget.
- e. She is responsible for the approval of any reimbursement for an NEB expense over a predetermined amount set in the National Bylaws.
- f. She records and accounts for all income and debt for legal and tax purposes.

Interchapter Relations

- a. The Interchapter Relations votes on all chapter and NEB legislation.
- b. She assigns alumnae advisors to each chapter. She helps chapters maintain standard procedures.
- c. She collects and maintains data on each chapter. She acts as a link between the active chapters and the NEB.
- d. She keeps in direct contact with all chapter alumnae advisors.

Section 5 - Replacement of Officers

In the case where the NEB President office is vacant, the Vice-President will immediately fill the position.

All other NEB positions found to be vacant shall be filled immediately by appointment by the NEB. The acting officer will complete the remaining office term.

Section 6 - Impeachment of NEB Officers

Any NEB officer may be impeached for failing to comply to the Constitution or for negligent performance of duties. The impeaching procedure shall be initiated by any Active Chapter, or any NEB Officer. The impeaching chapter or officer shall take the vote of the Active Chapters and NEB officers regarding removal of the negligent officer. The vote shall be a three fourths majority of the NEB officers and the active Chapters (one vote per chapter). The vote shall be verified by two National Executive Committee Chairpersons and the result forwarded to the NEB. The Organization shall recognize the result of the vote and shall declare the officer removed. The results shall be published in the next NEB newsletter.

Section 7 - Election of NEB

The NEB officers shall be elected every two years at regular conventions of Alpha Omega Epsilon by a majority vote. They shall be installed at the close of the convention at which they are elected, in accordance with the Ritual. They shall hold office until the installation of their successors. The following procedures are used:

I. Nominations

The Election Committee will select at least one qualified alumna candidate for each NEB office/chair. The committee shall present the nominees to the present NEB three months prior to convention. Additional candidates may be nominated by petition by any alumna member for any office of the NEB, provided that the following requirements have been met:

- a. The alumna member is qualified for the position; see Article IV, Section 2.
- b. The alumna member has given written consent to be placed on the ballot.
- c. Both the petition and the written consent are submitted to the Election Committee Chairperson three months prior to convention.

No member may be nominated for more than one position.

11. Voting

2 The list of nominees and an absentee ballot will be sent by the Election Committee to all
3 A&E Alumnae. Every Alumna is eligible to vote for National Officers. Voting will occur during
4 the National Convention, but absentee ballots will be counted if they are received by the
5 National Election Committee Chairperson no later than 2 weeks before the convention date.

6
7 Each voting member may write on the ballot the name of any qualified alumna whom she
8 chooses, even though that alumna member was not nominated.

9
10 A majority vote elects a candidate to the designated position.

11
12 The election results will be published in the next National Newsletter published after the
13 election occurred.

14 Section 8 - Ritual

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16
17 The official ritual of the Organization shall be secret and shall include the procedures for
18 initiation of candidates, installation of chapters, opening and closing of NEB, convention and
19 Active chapter meetings, installation of officers and all other ceremonial procedures of the
20 Organization.

21 Section 9 - Installation of Chapters

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24 The installation of Active Chapters shall be under the direction of the National Expansion
25 Committee.

26 Section 10 - Newsletter

27
28 The NEB shall publish a newsletter as specified in the Bylaws. The editor, who shall be
29 designated the National Newsletter Editor, shall be appointed by and serve at the discretion
30 of the NEB.

31 Section 11 - Chapter Alumnae Advisor

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33
34 A Chapter Alumnae Advisor will be appointed by the NEB Interchapter Relations and
35 approved by each Active Chapter. Each Chapter Alumnae Advisor will hold the office for at
36 least one year.

37
38 The duties of the Chapter Alumnae Advisor shall be:

- 39
40 a. To maintain close contact and communicate regularly with the Active chapter.
41 b. To act as an liaison between the NEB and the Active Chapter.
42 c. To verify that the Active Chapter is complying with the Constitution.
43 d. To report to the NEB Interchapter Relations.
44 e. To act as an advisor to the Active Chapter.
45 f. To initiate the probation proceedings of the Active chapter that fails to comply
46 with the Constitution; Article II, Section 9 of the National Bylaws.

ARTICLE V - CONVENTIONS

National meetings of Alpha Omega Epsilon shall be held at least once every two years in the City of Chicago, in the State of Illinois. The NEB may adopt a resolution changing the time and place for any regular or special meeting of the Organization and the President shall give notice thereof in writing to all members at least three months prior to such meeting.

Each Active Chapter shall be represented by one approved delegate. The Chapter delegate shall not be absent from any business session of the convention unless excused by the NEB President. Unexcused absences shall be punishable as defined under the National Bylaws Article I, Section 5, number 4.

Expenses of the NEB members shall be paid to the extent as provided in the Bylaws.

No member of the NEB shall be absent from any business session of the convention unless excused by the President. Unexcused absentees shall not receive expense allowances from the Organization.

For the transaction of business, a majority vote will be used.

ARTICLE VI - BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 1 - Membership

The Board of Directors of the Organization shall be defined by the Articles of Incorporation.

ARTICLE VII - REGION ORGANIZATION

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The Organization shall be divided into Regions, geographically determined by the NEB. The NEB will designate the region to which each Alumna and Active chapter is assigned

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5 Any institution may petition the Organization for a charter and provide a charter fee, as
6 provided in the National Bylaws. The NEB shall issue the charter as provided in Article II,
7 Section 7 of the National Bylaws.

11 The Active Chapters shall be designated in the Organization records by the letters of the
12 Greek alphabet in the order of their installation. The twenty-fifth chapter shall be known as
13 Alpha Alpha, the forty-ninth as Beta Alpha and so on.

17 The Active Chapters shall:

Section 4 - Active Chapter Executive Board

The officers of the Active Chapter Executive Board shall consist of the following:

- a. President
- b. Vice-President
- c. Membership Educator
- d. Treasurer
- e. Recording Secretary

The officers of the active chapter Executive Board shall:

- a. Have been active-active or active-coop a minimum of one school term, unless approved by the chapters Executive Board.
- b. Have been active-active or active-coop during the school term of the nominations for the active chapters Executive Board officers.
- c. Must maintain active-active status throughout the term of office.

The Chapter Executive Board shall have the following responsibilities and duties:

- a. The Executive Board shall be the governing body of the organization.
- b. All officers of the Executive Board must submit reports documenting her office at the end of the term for the new officer.
- c. The Executive Board has the responsibility to appoint and/or have elected the other offices.
- d. All officers elected or appointed must fulfill their designated duties while acting in the best interest of the Active organization.
- e. All officers elected or appointed must document their work, all specific dates and delegated responsibilities.
- f. Review and approve all committee and officer budgets.

The duties of the Executive Board Officers are detailed below:

President

- a. The President must know and uphold the National Constitution and Chapter Bylaws.
- b. She shall preside over all chapter meetings, and has the responsibility to notify the Vice President in advance if she cannot.
- c. She shall preside over all Executive Board meetings and is responsible for their scheduling.
- d. She shall be the mediator and shall remain impartial during all meeting discussions.
- e. She shall preside over all ceremonies.
- f. She has final approval over all appointments made by the other officers.
- g. She will be responsible for establishing and maintaining all long and short term goals.
- h. She will be responsible for verifying that reports are made to the NEB and the Chapter Alumnae Advisor.
- i. She will be responsible for ensuring that chapter records are reported to the NEB, as stated in National Bylaws.

2 Section 7 - Removal of Chapter Officers
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4 Any officer failing to fulfill the outlined responsibilities and duties may be removed from her
5 position by the Chapter, as defined in the Chapter Bylaws.
6

7 Section 8 - Chapter Voting Procedures
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9 All actives with the exception of active-passives have the right to vote on any chapter vote.
10 Any active will lose this right if they miss two consecutive active meetings.
11

12 An active may regain the right to vote by attending two consecutive meetings prior to the
13 meeting of the vote.
14

15 All votes will be counted by the Secretary and the President, with the exception of the
16 membership election vote.
17

18 During all votes, except the election to membership vote, the President shall cast her vote,
19 and her vote will only be counted in the event of a tie.
20

21 All votes and the results shall be recorded by the Recording Secretary.
22

23 Voting requirements, privileges and responsibilities are categorized into four categories:
24 Constitutional Vote, Quorum Vote, Meeting Vote, Officer and Membership Election Vote, as
25 defined in Article IX of this Constitution.
26

27 Section 9 - Meetings
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29 Meetings shall be governed by Robert's Rules of Order, Newly Revised.

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3 ARTICLE IX - VOTING PROCEDURES

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5 Section 1 - Convention Constitutional Vote

6 Amendments to the National Constitution and Bylaws will be enacted through the following
7 procedure:

- 8 a. Written presentation to the NEB, active chapters and alumnae at least 2
9 weeks prior to the convention;
10 b. Oral presentation to the convention quorum, at least one day prior to the vote;
11 c. Discussion of the amendment;
12 d. Voting will occur at the next day of convention.

13
14 Amendments must be approved by a 3/4's majority vote by secret written ballot. The votes
15 will be counted and certified by the NEB President and Government Officer.

16
17 Section 2 - Constitutional Vote By Mail

18
19 Amendments to the National Constitution and Bylaws through the mail will be enacted
20 through the following procedure:

- 21 a. The NEB must decide unanimously that a Constitutional Vote by Mail is
22 necessary.
23 b. Written proposal to the NEB; active chapter; and alumna present at the preceding
24 year's convention.
25 c. Ballots will be included in the proposal with a deadline no sooner than 6 weeks
26 after the proposal is mailed.
27 d. Amendments must be approved by a 3/4's majority vote of the returned ballots.
28 e. Non-returned ballots will be counted as "Abstain." The votes will be counted and
29 certified by the NEB President and Judiciary Committee Chairperson.
30 f. Written notification of proposal results will be mailed to the NEB; active chapter;
31 and alumna present at the preceding year's convention within 1 month of the
32 results being tallied.
33 g. Only one Vote By Mail can occur during each fiscal year.

34
35 Section 3 - Chapter Constitutional Vote

36
37 Amendments to the Chapter Bylaws will be enacted through the following procedures:

- 38
39 a. Oral presentation to the chapter;
40 b. Written presentation to the chapter;
41 c. Discussion of the amendment at the chapter meeting;
42 d. Voting at the next chapter meeting;
43 e. Written presentation and approval by the National Judiciary Committee.

44
45 Amendments must be approved by 3/4's majority vote by secret written ballot. The votes will
46 be counted by the President, and her vote only counts in the case of a tie.

47
48 Section 4 - Quorum Vote

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50 A quorum vote is required for all National Constitution, National and Chapter Bylaw changes.

2 A quorum vote at National Convention is 2/3's of the registered chapter representatives,
3 NEB and alumnae.

4
5 A quorum vote for an Active Chapter requires 2/3's of the eligible Active Chapter
6 membership. All active-actives and active co-ops shall be notified at least one week prior to
7 any chapter quorum vote.

8
9 A quorum vote shall be called to the floor by any member and seconded according to
10 Robert's Rules of Order, Newly Revised.

11 12 Section 5 - Meeting Vote

13
14 A meeting vote may be brought up by any member and seconded according to Robert's
15 Rules of Order, Newly Revised, during any organization meeting.

16
17 After the vote is brought to the floor, there will be a time of discussion monitored by the
18 President.

19
20 When the President feels the topic has been sufficiently discussed, she will call for the vote
21 by vocal ballot (aye or nay). Majority vote passes the vote.

22 23 Section 6 - Chapter Officer Election Vote

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25 All election votes will be run by quorum vote requirements.

26
27 The nominations for the elections will be opened two meetings prior to the election and will
28 remain open through elections.

29
30 A majority vote elects a candidate to the designated position.

31 32 Section 7 - Membership Election Vote

33
34 A membership election vote is 90 percent secret majority vote by Active Chapter quorum.
35 The President counts the votes, but she does not vote.

36 37 Section 8 - Final Vote

38
39 A final vote occurs at the completion of the membership education process. A final vote is a
40 majority vote by secret ballot by the Active Chapter quorum. If 10 percent of the votes are
41 "no" votes, proceedings to withdraw an invitation to membership are initiated.

ARTICLE X - CONSTITUTIONAL BYLAWS

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The NEB shall adopt Constitutional Bylaws which will supplement, interpret and be in accord with the Constitution. The Constitutional Bylaws may be amended by a Convention Constitutional Vote, as specified in Article IX, Section 1 or by a Constitutional Vote By Mail, as specified in Article IX, Section 2 of the Constitution.

ARTICLE XI - AMENDMENTS

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This Constitution may be amended by a Convention Constitutional vote, or a Constitutional Vote By Mail as specified in Article IX, Section 1 and Section 2.

ARTICLE XII - HAZING, DRUG AND FIREARM POLICY

All members of all statuses must abide by the most current revision of the Sorority's Risk Management Policy adopted by the National Board.

Alpha Omega Epsilon does not condone the use or possession of firearms by any member during Organization function or within a Chapter House.
