In all likelihood, the local organization will investigate local issues, pertaining to the larger community of Wake County, along with national concerns

	Section 1	Membership will be open to all regularly enrolled students who have an interest in the activities and projects of the club
	Section 2	Means of selection of members: the club will select the method by which membership in the organization shall be approved
Article III	Officers	
	Section 1	The elective officers for this organization shall be the President, the Vice President, the Secretary, and the Treasurer
	Section 2	The officers shall be elected by the club members to serve a term of one year, beginning in the month of October and ending the following October
Article IV	Dues	
	Section 1	Dues for the organization shall be in the form of special assessments voted on by a majority of the club members present and voting
Article V	<u>Amending the</u> <u>Constitution and</u> <u>by-laws</u>	
	Section 1	Amendments to the Constitution or by-laws shall be

		presented by members of the organization at a regular meeting but shall not be voted upon until the next regular meeting, and then only after informing members of the proposed amendments. A majority of 2/3 of the members present and voting will be required
Article VI	<u>Meetings</u>	
	Section 1	The club shall meet as determined by the club membership each semester

	Section 1	The organization shall make provision for any standing committees needed and/or for forming any special committees when needed
