Article I	Name and Purpose	
	Section 1	This organization will be know as the: Australian Rules Football Club.
	Section 2	 Purpose of the Australian Rules Football Club: A. A. Increase interest in the sport to North Carolina State University students, faculty, and staff. B. B. Create an open environment for learning rules of the game along with skills to play the game. C. C. Work in conjunction with other Australian Rules Football Clubs to play matches and introduce the sport to the United States.
Article II	Membership	
	Section 1	Membership shall be open to all currently enrolled North Carolina State male students and to all male faculty and staff who are interested in Australian Rules Football.
	Section 2	Membership shall be granted to the club after the person in question has shown interest in the sport and attends practice regularly, within reason (determined by the club officers).
	Section 3	Members of the club at NC State will not be charged membership dues. However, team dues may be charged for affiliation with larger organizations.
Article III	Officers	
	Section 1	Officers will be elected, by members of the club, at the first official meeting in August.
	Section 2	Elected officers will hold their position the full year unless they are unable to continue their duties or objection from a current member is voiced, in which case, a vote will be held by existing members, honoring the majority's vote.
	Section 3	 Officers will perform duties relevant to continuing the well being of the club and it's members as follows: A. A. Maintain good standing with the Campus Recreation office. B. B. Keep track of funds, using them for the advancement of the club.

- C. C. Consider suggestions made by current club members.
- D. D. Represent the club in a positive manner at all meetings and matches.

Article IV Practice and Meetings

Section 1 Practice will be held on the lower Miller Fields at a suitable space and time reserved through the Campus Recreation office.
 Section 2 In the event of inclement weather and the closing of Miller Fields, practice will be postponed or moved to another location, which will be decided on by club

officers. Club members will then be contacted and informed of the situation.

Section 3 Practice will be considered a meeting where general club news and events will be dealt with.

Section 4 Meetings separate from practice will be held only when needed, with time and place decided upon so the largest number of members can attend.

Article V Amendments to Constitution

Section 1
