Baseball Club

Article I. Name

Section I. This organization shall be known as the North Carolina State University Baseball Club.

Section II. All students are eligible to be in the club.

Article IV. Officers

Section I. The effective officers of this club shall be the President, Vice-President, Coordinator, Treasurer, and two elected representatives.

Section II. The officers shall be elected by the club members to serve a term of one year, beginning at the first day of the fall semester.

Article IV. Dues

Section I. Dues are determined by the executive council by how much the club needs to maintain a balanced budget.

Article V. Amending the Constitution and By-laws

- Section I. Amendments to the constitution or By-laws require a majority vote of at least one-half the membership.
- Section II. All amendments to the constitution or by-laws shall be subject to the approval of the Student Government.
- Section III. Any article of this constitution or part thereof that is in direct violation of the Student Government constitution or by-laws shall be null and void and declared unconstitutional by the President of Student Government. Any differences of opinion between the club and the President of the Student Government shall be brought before the Legislature, whose decision shall be final.

Article VI. Meetings

Section I. Meetings shall be the first Wednesday of every month through out the school year or other wise notified.

Article VII. Committees

- Section I. The executive council shall consist of the President, Vice President, Coordinator, Treasurer, two representatives from the club, and the Faculty Advisor.
 - Section II. The executive council will form committees when needed.
