

CONSTITUTION OF THE NORTH CAROLINA STATE
COLLEGIATE 4-H CLUB

ARTICLE 1.

Name: The name of this organization shall be the North Carolina State Collegiate 4-H Club.

ARTICLE 2.

Purpose: The purpose of this club shall be (1) to promote the ideals set forth by the 4-H Club, (2) to meet weekly to discuss business and to foster fellowship among members, (3) to know Extension work and workers, (4) to develop leadership, (5) to encourage participation in other campus functions, (6) to encourage new students to become active members of the Collegiate 4-H Club, and (7) to provide fellowship with other Collegiate 4-H Clubs.

ARTICLE 3.

Motto: The motto of this club shall be "To Make the Best Better."

ARTICLE 4.

Membership: Section 1. Any previous 4-H Club member now attending State College is entitled to be a member of this club. Section 2. New members shall be initiated into the club at the beginning of the first semester of the school year.

ARTICLE 5.

Officers: Section 1. The officers of this club shall be a president, vice president, secretary, treasurer, and historian-reporter. Section 2. These officers shall be elected annually by members of the club at the close of the school year. The new term of office begins with the fall semester, following semester, of the regular school year. Retiring officers shall have priority in attending to club business during the summer months.

ARTICLE 7.

ARTICLE 8.

Amendments: Amendments to this constitution may be made by a three-fourths vote of the club.

ARTICLE 9.

Meetings: Section 1. Weekly meetings shall be held on Wednesdays at 6:15 during the regular school year.
Section 2. On the second meeting of each month a program shall be presented.

ARTICLE 10.

Standing Committees and Purposes: (1) Membership - to encourage new students to become members and to encourage attendance and participation by members. (2) Deputation - to make arrangements for joint social functions with other Collegiate 4-H Clubs. (3) Church Sunday - to present an inspirational church service each year in relation to 4-H Church Sunday. (4) Nominations - to prepare and recommend a slate of officers in the spring of each year.

CONSTITUTION OF THE NORTH CAROLINA STATE COLLEGIATE 4-H CLUB

ARTICLE 1.

Name: The name of this organization shall be the North Carolina State Collegiate 4-H Club.

ARTICLE 2.

ARTICLE 3.

Constitution of the North Carolina State University. Collegiate 4-H Club

Article I: Name, Location and Affiliation

Section 1: This organization shall be known as the North Carolina State University Collegiate 4-H Club.

Section 2: The organization shall be located on the campus of North Carolina State University in Raleigh, North Carolina.

Section 3: The activities of this organization shall be carried out in association with the North Carolina Cooperative Extension Service.

• Article II: Purpose

Section 1: The purpose of this club shall be:

- 1) to promote the ideals set forth by the 4-H Clubs
- 2) to further fellowship among members
- 3) to become more knowledgeable of the Cooperative Extension Service
- 4) to develop leadership skills
- 5) to encourage participation in other campus functions
- 6) to encourage new students to become active members of the Collegiate 4-H Club
- 7) to provide fellowship with other Collegiate 4-H Clubs
- 8) to conduct community service projects

• Article III: Motto

Section 1: The motto of this club shall be "To Make the Best Better."

Article IV: Membership

Section 1: Membership shall be open to all students who are interested in 4-H Club work.

Section 2: Any student attending an institution of higher learning in the Wake County area shall be eligible for membership.

Section 3: Honorary members shall be selected by standards set forth in the bylaws of the constitution.

Section 4: Honorary members are: Mr. Fred H. Wagoner, retired 4-H specialist and Ms. Macy Stell, State 4-H Staff Secretary.

Section 5: Alumni membership of this organization shall have all privileges of membership with the exception of a voting capacity. Any alumni member that participates in any club activity will have to incur his/her own expenses unless otherwise stipulated by the club.

Article V: Officers

Section 1: Officers of this club shall be a president, vice president, secretary, treasurer, reporter, historian, and the communications coordinator.

- Article VI: Charter Members

Section 1: Charter members of this club shall include: Charles H. McAdams, Henry Vanstory, W.E. Pollock, R.E. McDowell, G.M. Goforth, H.A. Reid, Tom Uzzell, J.R. Ferrell, W.D. Loftin, J.W. - Article VII: Amendments and Bylaws

Section 1: Amendments to the constitution or bylaws shall be presented by members of the club in writing and read at a regular meeting but shall not be voted upon until the next regular meeting. A majority of 2/3 of the members present and voting shall be required for passage.

Section 2: All amendments to this constitution or bylaws shall be subject to the approval of the NCSU Student Government.

Section 3: Any article of this constitution or part thereof that is in direct violation of the Student Government Constitution or Bylaws shall be null and void and declared unconstitutional by the President of Student Government. Any differences of opinion between the club and the President of the Student Government shall be brought before the Student Legislature, whose decision shall be final.

- Article VIII: Meetings

Section 1: Semi-monthly meetings shall be determined at the beginning of each semester.

Section 2: Emergency meetings may be called by the president.

Article IX: Procedures

Section 1: The most recent edition of Robert's Rules of Order shall be the authority on all

points of parliamentary procedure not otherwise specified in the constitution or in the bylaws of the North Carolina State University Collegiate 4-H Club.

- Article X: Ratification

Section 1: This constitution shall be ratified by a 2/3 majority vote.

Section 2: Immediately upon ratification, this constitution shall go into effect.

Section 3: This constitution is ratified as of April 1976 and amended February 1986 and March 1994.

Bylaws

All nominations for officers must be made from the floor at the appointed business meeting. These nominations will be left open until the appointed election date.

1. Officers will be elected by a simple majority by secret ballot.
2. Officers elected in the spring semester for the upcoming school year shall be president, vice president, secretary, treasurer, and the communications coordinator. These officers shall be installed at the annual spring picnic or banquet. The reporter and historian shall be elected from the incoming freshman class at the designated meeting during the fall semester which shall be no later than the third meeting of the semester.
3. Standing committees will include Service, Finance, and Canoes.
4. Other committees may be established by the president as deemed necessary.
5. Honorary members can be nominated at any regular business meeting and voted upon at the next meeting. These shall be elected by unanimous acclamation. Honorary membership is lifetime.
6. The L.R. Harrill Collegiate 4-H award for outstanding upperclassmen and outstanding freshman shall be selected by secret ballot of the membership each spring. Awards shall be given at the annual spring banquet or picnic.
7. The Executive Board shall consist of all present officers and the advisor.
8. The club advisor shall be nominated by the executive committee and approved by the club.
