Generation Pure NCSU Student Organization Constitution October 31, 2007

Article I: Name and Purpose

Section 1

This organization will be known as Generation Pure, reflecting the ambition of our cause to encourage and promote purity within our generation.

Section 2

The purpose of this club will be to promote awareness on issues of sex, dating, and relationships on our college campus. This will be done by means of education on such issues, as well as the equipping of students to speak out on the issues college students face in regards to purity within relationships.

Article II: Membership

Section 1

Membership will be open to all students, regularly enrolled at NCSU, who are interested in the goals and objectives of our club. This club is not restricted to any certain gender, race, academic major, or religious belief.

Section 2

Membership to the club will be based on attendance of meetings and events held by the club. Members should attend at least three meeting or events during the semester.

Article III: Officers

Section 1

The elective officers, along with expected duties, of this club will be the following:

President: responsible for the planning, organization, and follow through of events and club meetings.

Vice President: responsible for assisting the President as needed, and may assume the role of President if he/she is unable to fulfill that role.

Secretary: responsible for documents and records within the club, including meeting notes and event planning.

Treasurer: responsible for keeping any funds or assets that the group may possess, as well as documentation of spending and fundraising.

Section 2

Officers will be elected by the club members through nomination and majority vote. Officers will hold position of office for a one-year term, beginning in January. Offices may be renewed for consecutive years. In the event that one cannot fulfill a year position, club members may elect a new club member to fill that officers position.

Article IV: Dues

Section1

Members will be required to pay dues of \$2.00 for each semester.

Article V: Amending the Constitution and By-Laws

Section 1

Amendments to the constitution or by-laws should be presented by members of the club in writing and presented at a club meeting but will not be voted upon until the next regular meeting, and then only after informing each member of the proposed amendments. A majority of 2/3 of the members present and voting will be required.

Article VI: Meetings

Section 1

The club will meet at least once a month or as determined by the club members each semester.

Article VII: Committees

Section 1

The club will make provisions for necessary committees, both for the club and for special events, throughout the semester.
