

Constitution for Hope for the Homeless
May 31, 1998

Article 1: Name and Purpose

Section 1: This organization shall be known as Hope for the Homeless.

Section 2: Mission statement:

The purpose of this organization is as follows:

1. To provide those living on the streets with food, warm clothes, blankets, and compassion.
2. To work cooperatively with other agencies and groups to provide help and support for the homeless.
3. To attempt to instill in those we serve a sense of hope.
4. To provide members, students, and the community with a greater understanding of the plight of the homeless.

Article II. Membership

Section 1. Membership shall be open to all regularly enrolled students and faculty who are interested in learning, raising public awareness, and aiding the homeless.

Article III. Officers

Section 1. The elective officers of this club shall be the President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, and Historian. Any two or more offices may be held by the same individual, but no officer may act in more than one capacity where action of two or more officers is required.

Section 2. The officers shall serve a term of one year, with elections being held on the first meeting in April.

Article IV. Dues

Section 1. Dues for the organization will be \$3 per year per member.

Article V. Meetings

Section 1. The organization shall meet twice each month regularly, more often if deemed necessary.

Section 2. The officers shall meet weekly.

Article VI. Duties

Section 1. The President shall be responsible in representing the organization and being responsible for the actions of the organization and its members.

Section 2. The Vice President shall be responsible for acting in place of the President in his/her absence and the coordination of the Food Salvage Program.

Section 3. The Secretary shall keep minutes of all meetings and shall report them to the members at the following meeting.

Section 4. The Treasurer shall be responsible for keeping record of all finances and presenting a report at every meeting.

Section 5. The Historian shall be responsible for documenting events and compiling a comprehensive report at the end of his/her term.

Article VII. Amending the Constitution and By-laws.

Section 1. This Constitution may be amended and new by-laws adopted by the affirmative vote of a majority of officers.

CONSTITUTION FOR CAMPUS HELP

Article I: Name and Purpose

Section 1: This organization shall be known as Campus H.E.L.P. (Homeless Emergency Love Project).

Section 2: Mission statement:

The purpose of this club is as follows:

1. To provide those living in the street with food, warm clothes, and blankets
2. To work in concert with other agencies and groups to provide help and support for the homeless.
3. To attempt to instill in those we serve a sense of hope and determination.

Article II: Membership

Section 1: Membership shall be open to all regularly enrolled students and faculty who are interested in raising public awareness and aiding the homeless.

Article III: Officers

Section 1: The elective officers of this club shall be the President, Vice President, Secretary, and Treasurer. Any two or more offices may be held by the same individual, but no officer may act in more than one capacity where action of two or more officers is required. The officers may create one or more committees and appoint directors to serve on each such committee.

Section 2: The officers shall serve a term of one year, beginning in March of each Spring semester.

Article IV: Dues

Section 1: Dues for the club will be \$5.00 per year per member.

Article V: Amending the Constitution and By-laws

Section 1: This Constitution may be amended and new by-laws may be adopted by the affirmative vote of a majority of the officers.

Article VI: Meetings

Section 1: The club will meet twice each month regularly, and more often if deemed necessary.

Article VII: Minutes

Section 1: The Secretary shall keep minutes of all meetings and shall report them to the members at the following meeting.
