This organization shall be known as the Italian Club, Section 1 or Il Circolo Italiano. The purpose of the Italian Club shall be to further Section 2 acquaint students with the Italian language and culture, and to expose the University at large to same. Article II. Name and Purpose

Section 1 The elective officers of this club shall be the President, Secretary, and Treasurer. Section 2 The officers shall be elected by the members to serve a

term of one year, beginning the Fall semester of each academic year.

Article IV. Dues

Article I.

Section I If needed, the amount of dues for the club shall be decided upon and voted on in any given meeting by a majority of the club members present.

- Article V. Amendments and By-Laws
 - Section I

Admendments to the Constitution or By-Laws shall be presented by members of the club in writing and read at a regular meeting but shall not be voted on until the next regular meeting, and then only after informing each member of the proposed amendments. A majority of 2/3rds of the members present and voting shall be required.

All amendments to this Constitution or to the By-Laws shall be subject to the approval of the Student Government. Any artical of this Constitution or part thereof that is in direct violation of the Student Government Constitution or By-Laws shall be null and void and declared unconstitutional by the President of Student Government. Any differences of opinion between the club and the President of Student Government shall be brought before the Legislature, whose decision shall be final.

Article VI. Meetings

Section 1

The club shall hold meetings as declared by the club members each semester.
