Constitution

Article I. Name and Purpose

Section 1. This organization shall be known as the Ncsu Korean Student Association.

Section 2. The purposes of this club shall be promotion of the cooperation between Korean students and foreign students and participation in the international students' activities.

Article II. Membership

Section 1. Membership shall be open to all students who are interested in the activities of Korean Student Association.

Section 2. The student who is interested in this club shall be approved by the general meeting of this club.

Article III. Officers

Section 1. The elective officers of this club shall be the president and the secretary.

Section 2. The officers shall be elected by the club members to serve a term of one year, beginning Fall semester.

Article IV. Dues

Section 1. Dues for the club shall be \$5.00 per semester.

Article V. Amending the Constitution and By-laws

~~Section 1.~~ Amending to the constitution or by-laws shall be presented by members of the club in writing and read at a regular meeting but shall not be voted upon until the next regular meeting, and then only after informing each member of the proposed amendments. A majority of $\frac{2}{3}$ of the members present and voting shall be required.

Section 2. All amendments to this constitution or by-laws shall be subject to the approval of the Student Government.

Section 3. Any article of this constitution or part thereof that is in direct violation of the Student Constitution or By-laws shall be null and void and declared unconstitutional by the President of Student Government. Any differences of opinion between the club and the President of the Student Government shall be brought before the Legislature, whose decision shall be final.

Article VI. Meetings

Section 1. The club shall meet as determined by the club membership each semester.

Article VII. Committees

Section 1. The ^{Club} shall make provision for forming any special committees when needed.

Article VIII. Section 1. The activities of this club shall be included as following;

1. Academic meeting (Ph., D., M.S. and any thesis which is published by the member.)
2. Participation in the International activities.
3. etc.

CONSTITUTION

Article I. Name and Purpose

- Section 1. This organization shall be known as the NCSU Korean Student Association.
- Section 2. The purposes of this club shall be promotion of the cooperation between Korean students and foreign students and participation in the international students' activities.

Article II. Membership

- Section 1. Membership shall be open to all students who are interested in the activities of the Korean Student Association.
- Section 2. The student who is interested in this club shall be approved by the general meeting of this club.

Article III. Officers

- Section 1. The elective officers of this club shall be the president, two executive directors, the treasurer, and the social programmer.
- Section 2. The president shall be elected by the members to serve a term of one year, from July 1 to June 30 of the following year, and the remainder of the officers are chosen by the elected president.

Article IV. Dues

- Section 1. Dues for the club shall be \$10.00 per semester.

Article V. Amending the Constitution and By-Laws

- Section 1. Amending to the constitution or by-laws shall be presented by members of the club in writing and read at a regular meeting but shall not be voted upon until the next regular meeting, and then only after informing each member of the proposed amendments. A majority of 2/3 of the members present and voting shall be required.
- Section 2. All amendments to this constitution or by-laws shall be subject to the approval of the Student Government.
- Section 3. Any article of this constitution or part thereof that is in direct violation of the Student Government Constitution or By-laws shall be null and void

Section 3. and declared unconstitutional by the President of
(Cont.) Student Government. Any differences of opinion
between the club and the President of the Student
Government shall be brought before the Legislature,
whose decision shall be final.

Article VI. Meetings

Section 1. The club shall meet as determined by the club
membership each semester.

Article VII. Committees

Section 1. The club shall make provision for forming any
special committees when needed.

Article VIII. Activities

Section 1. The activities of this club shall be included as
follows.
