

**CONSTITUTION
NORTH CAROLINA STATE UNIVERSITY
CAMPUS RECREATION**

Article 1.	Name	Men's Ultimate Club
	Section I.	This organization shall be known as the NCSU Men's Ultimate Club at NCSU.
Article 2.	Purpose	
	Section I.	The purpose of this club will be: A. to promote and encourage of the growth of the sport of Ultimate. B. to help improve the skills of the club's members through practice, instruction, and competition.
Article 3.	Membership	
	Section I.	The membership of the club will be limited to full time students and graduate students of NCSU who are interested in the sport of Ultimate.
	Section II.	Tryouts A. Tryouts shall be held during the beginning of the fall semester each year. B. The final team roster will be decided upon by the team captains after a series of tryout dates of whose length is decided upon by the captains. C. Tryouts for individuals may be held in the event that they were unable to attend the scheduled tryout dates or if they are a transfer student from another school.
	Section II.	All members shall: A. comply with all university policies and procedures for club sports as defined in the Club Sports Handbook B. comply with all club rules as defined by this constitution C. behave in a manner so as to bring respect to the Men's Ultimate Club, the Campus Recreation Office, and North Carolina State University.

Article 4. Officers

Section I.

The officers of this club will be chosen at the end of each spring semester for the following year by the active members of the club.

Section II.

The officers will be President, Vice President, Secretary, and Treasurer.

Article 5. Duties of Officers

Section I.

The President will:

- A. enforce all provisions of this constitution.
- B. be responsible for reporting to the club sports assistant director in the Campus Recreation Office for all matters pertaining to the club.
- C. preside over all club officer meetings.
- D. be responsible for the presidential responsibilities as defined in the Club Sports Handbook.

Section II.

The Vice President will:

- A. preside at all club officer meetings when the president is unable to attend.
- B. be responsible for the vice presidential responsibilities as defined in the Club Sports Handbook.
- C. assist the president in the creation of the yearly budget.

Section III.

The Secretary will:

- A. be responsible for maintaining monthly attendance reports for the club.
- B. be responsible for the secretarial responsibilities as defined in the Club Sports Handbook.

Section IV.

The Treasurer will:

- A. keep accurate records of all club accounts as well collect all team dues.
- B. be responsible for the duties of treasurer as defined in the Club Sports Handbook.

Article 6. Elections

- Section I. The officers will be elected by a majority vote of at least one half of the total membership.
- Section II. The officers will serve for the course of one school year and new officers will be chosen at the last team meeting of the spring semester of each year.
- Section III. Officers may be removed from office by a majority vote of at least two thirds of the total membership given that all members are informed of the reasons for impeachment.
- Section IV. Officers may succeed themselves as long as the members of the club continue to elect them.

Article 7. Team Captains

- Section I. Elections:
A. The team captains shall be decided upon at the end of each season by a vote by all active team members.
B. The three members receiving the most votes will be named captains for the following year.
C. In the event of a tie a second vote will be held between the tying members.
- Section II. Captains shall be responsible for:
A. preparing and presiding over all team practices.
B. coordinating tryouts and choosing team members at the completion of tryouts.
C. deciding what tournaments will be attended by the team throughout the course of the year.
D. finding a coach for the team for each year.

Article 8. Dues

- Section I. Club dues will be decided upon by the club officers before the start of the first team meeting. All members will also be required to pay Ultimate Players Association membership dues.

Article 9. Amending the Constitution and By-Laws

Section I. The constitution may be amended by a two thirds vote of the total membership of the club.

Section II. All amendments must be in accordance with university policies and are subject to approval by the Club Sports Assistant Director.

Article 10. By-Laws

Section I. Policies and procedures will be approved by a majority vote of at least one half of the total membership and the Club Sports Assistant Director.

Section II. Any member exhibiting unsportsmanlike conduct or conduct unbecoming of the club may be voted out of the club by a majority vote of at least one half of the total membership and approved by the Club Sports Assistant Director.

Ultimate Frisbee
Constitution

Article I Name and Purpose

Section 1 This organization shall be known as the Ultimate Frisbee team, or Jinx.

Section 2 The purposes of this club will be to teach the sport of Ultimate Frisbee to its members, to play the sport on a competitive level and to win the Collegiate National Championship.

Article II Membership

Section 1 Membership shall be open to all regularly enrolled students who are interested in the sport of Ultimate Frisbee.

Section 2 Members must be approved by the Ultimate Players Association for competition during the spring season.

Article III Officers

Section 1 The elective officers of this club shall be the President, Vice-President, and Treasurer.

Section 2 The officers shall be elected by the club members to serve a term of one year, beginning the first practice of each academic year.

Article IV Dues

Section 1 Dues will be \$20 per year.

Article V Amending the Constitution and By-laws

Section 1 Amendments to the constitution or by-laws shall be presented by members of the club in writing and read at a regular club meeting but shall not be voted upon until the next regular meeting, and then only after informing each member of the proposed amendments. A majority of 2/3 of the

members present and voting shall be required.

Article VI Meetings

Section 1 The club shall meet tri-weekly, except for weeks a tournament is scheduled. On weeks that a tournament is scheduled, the club shall meet bi-weekly.

Section 2 These two meetings shall be the same for bi-weekly meetings and tri-weekly meetings. Tuesday and Thursday from 6:00pm until 9:00pm at the lower intramural fields, or at another location determined by the club as an alternate.

Section 3 The third meeting of the tri-weekly schedule shall be either Saturday or Sunday at 11:00am on the lower intramural fields as determined by the club.

Article VII Committees

Section 1 The President, or in his absence the highest ranking officer present, shall be able to request a committee be formed of volunteers for the advancement of the club as a whole or to better serve the purposes of the club.

Section 2 Certain committees shall be made of non-volunteers, such as water committees, and cone committees. Duty on such committees shall be distributed evenly among the members of the club.
