## Constitution

Article I	Name and Purpose	
	Section 1	This organization shall be known as the Middle East and North African Student Organization (MENASA).
	Section 2	The purpose of this organization will be to expose Middle Eastern and North African society and culture to the NC State campus community, and to unite the Middle East and North African population on campus.
Article II	Membership	on campas.
	Section 1	Membership shall be open to all regularly enrolled students who are interested in learning about Middle Eastern and North African culture.
	Section 2	Registered members who receive benefits are fee paying members, but all students are welcome to attend events.
Article III	Officers	
	Section 1	The elective officers for this organization will have no set titles. The executive board will consist of no more than seven students. The board will be held responsible for making executive decisions and delegating tasks for the better of the organization.
	Section 2	If more than seven dedicated students show interest joining the executive board, the steering committee will establish an application with which to select executive board members.
Article IV	<u>Dues</u>	
	Section 1	There will be a \$5 membership fee that would guarantee discount, benefits, and secure a spot to participate in/attend events.

Article V

Amending the Constitution and by-laws

Section 1

Amendments to the constitution or by-laws shall be presented by members of the club in writing and read at a regular meeting but shall not be voted upon until the next regular meeting, and then only after informing each member for the proposed amendments. A majority of 2/3 for the members present and voting shall be required.

Meeting dates for the semester shall be determined and announced at the first meeting of each semester.
