Constitution of **Omega Phi Alpha**

North Carolina State University Colony September 6, 2006

Article I- Name and Purpose

Section 1

This organization shall be the North Carolina State University colony of Omega Phi Alpha- National Service Sorority until an official chapter charter status has been achieved.

Section 2

The purpose and goals of this sorority shall be to assemble its members in the fellowship of Omega Phi Alpha, to develop friendship, leadership and cooperation by promoting service to the university-community, to the community-at-large, to the members of the sorority and to the nations of the world.

Article II- Membership

Section 1

To be eligible for active membership, a student must be enrolled at North Carolina State University.

Section 2

Once a pledge, or new member, has fulfilled all requirements set by the local and national by-laws, they may attain active status.

Article III- Officers

Section 1

The elective officers for this club shall be President, Vice President/Service Chair, Secretary, Treasurer, Membership Director, Historian, and Sisterhood Chair.

Section 2

The officers shall be elected by the club members and will serve a term of one year beginning the first meeting of the fall semester.

Article IV- Dues

Section 1

Members shall pay \$40.00 for the National office for becoming a colony. The members shall set how much to give as local dues. Local and National dues are to be paid each semester.

Article V- Amending the Constitution and by-laws

Section 1

Amendments to the constitution or by-laws shall be presented by members of the club in writing and read at a regular meeting, but shall not be voted upon until two weeks after

being submitted to the local secretary and only after each active member has received a copy of the proposed amendments. A majority of 2/3 of the members present and voting shall be required.

Article VI- Meetings

Section 1

This colony of Omega Phi Alpha shall meet once a week.

Article VII- Committees

Section 1

Committees shall be formed when needed and will be headed by one of the elective officers.
