CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS FOR KAPPA LAMBDA CHAPTER, OMEGA PSI PHI FRATERNITY, INC.

PREAMBLE

We, the members of the KAPPA LAMEDA CHAPTER of the OMEGA PSI PHI FRATERNITY, believe that men of similar ideas of fellowship should bind themselves together in order to form a more perfect union among college men, to promote the principles of manhood, scholarship, uplift, and perservance, to further brotherly love and fraternal spirit within the organization to protect the sanctity of the home and the chastity of women, do enact and establish this Constitution and accompanying By-Laws for the government of its members.

CHAPTER I

ARTICLE I

Name, Symbol, and Territory

- Section 1. The name of the organization shall be KAPPA LAMEDA CHAPTER, OMEGA PSI PHI FRATERNITY, INC.
- Section 2. The symbol of the Chapter shall be the Greek Letters, KAPPA LAMBDA.
- Section 3. KAPPA LAMEDA Chapter of the Sixth District of Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc. covers undergraduates at North Carolina State University in Raleigh, North Carolina.

ARTICLE II

Purpose

- Section 1. The purpose of this Chapter of the Omega Psi Phi Fraternity shall be to bring about the union of college men of similar high ideals of scholarship and manhood in order:
 - a. To stimulate the attainment of ideals and ambitions of its members;
 - b. To disseminate and inculcate those ideals among those with whom its members come in contact;
 - To cooperate with other undergraduate chapters in the Sixth District fostering these ideas;
 - To occupy a progressive, helpful, and constructive place in the civic and political life of the university, community, and the Sixth District;
 - To prepare its members for greater usefulness in the causes of humanity, freedom, and dignity of the individual;
 - f. To aid down-troden humanity in its efforts to achieve higher social, economic, and intellectual status.

CHAPTER II ARTICLE I

Officers of the Chapter

- Section 1. Names of Officers: The Officers of the Chapter shall be Basileus, Vice Basileus, Keeper of Records and Seal, Keeper of Finance, Chaplain, Dean of Pledgees, Sergeant-at-Arms, and Chapter Reporter.
- Section 2. Term of Office: All officers of the Chapter shall be elected at each annual Chapter Meeting. The Basileus shall serve no more than two (2) consecutive terms. All Chapter officers may be retained in the same office no longer than two (2) successive terms.
- Section 3. Any officer can be impeached and removed by a 2/3 majority vote of Chapter members in good standing.
- Section 4. The officers named in Section 1, along with the outgoing Basileus and two elected members in good and regular standing with the Fraternity, shall make up the Executive Committee.
- Section 5. The supreme governing body of the Chapter shall be the regular stated meetings of the Chapter. In the interim of Chapter Meetings, the Executive Committee shall act in the best interest of the Chapter, subject to the Chapter Constitution and By-Laws. The Executive Committee shall have no authority to alter, change, or amend any action taken in a Chapter Meeting.

CHAPTER III ARTICLE I

Amendments to the Constitution

- Section 1. Amendments to this Constitution may be made by any Chapter member in good and regular standing.
- Section 2. This Constitution may be amended as follows:

Amendments to the proposed Constitution as herein provided shall be submitted to the Chapter, in writing, at a regular meeting, and acted on at the next regular meeting, and shall be considered adopted by a two-third vote of the members present.

CHAPTER IV ARTICLE I

Effective Date

Section 1. This Constitution shall become effective immediately after the regular meeting in which it was adopted.

BY-LAWS

CHAPTER I ARTICLE I

Annual Celebrations

Section 1. Achievement Week

A. KAPPA LAMBDA CHAPTER shall celebrate the Achievement Week with an appropriate program the week of November 17 in honor of achievements of Omega Men and all others.

CHAPTER II ARTICLE I

Officers and Duties

- Section 1. All officers shall be elected at the Annual Chapter Meeting each year.
- Section 2. The Basileus: The Basileus shall be the Chief Executive Officer of the Chapter, and shall preside over the Chapter Meetings.
- Section 3. The Keeper of Records and Seal: The Keeper of Records and Seal shall receive an annual honorarium not to exceed our annual Chapter dues.
 - 1. The KRS shall keep the records and minutes of the Chapter Meetings.
 - The KRS shall perform such duties as may be assigned to him by the Chapter Basileus, the District, and/or the National Offices.
- Section 4. The Keeper of Finance:
 - 1. The Keeper of Finance will issue checks upon a written voucher by the Basileus.
 - 2. The KF shall report to the Basileus the total number of brothers, and the total number of financial brothers. The same to be forwarded to the District and National Offices at the appropriate time.
- Section 5. The Vice Basileus: The Vice Basileus shall act in the absence of the Basileus.
- Section 6. The Dean of Pledgees: The Dean of Pledgees shall be responsible for the pledge program(as stated by the Nationals) for the Chapter.

CHAPTER III ARTICLE I

Finance

- Section 1. All Chapter, District, and National dues shall be paid or sent to the Chapter Officers through the Area Chapter Officers.
- Section 2. Dues will be sent to the National and District Offices no later than November 1.
