

Preamble

Whereas, the objects for which this Fraternity is formed are to develop the ideas of Brotherhood, Scholarship, and Service to promote the general welfare of all concerned and to organize the members of this chapter in accordance with its certificate of incorporation filed in the office of the Recorder of Deeds of the District of Columbia on the 29th day of April 1920.

The Constitution

ARTICLE I--NAME add OBJECT

- sec. 1 This Fraternity shall be known as PHI BETA SIGMA Fraternity, Inc. Its objects shall be to advance the ideals of Brotherhood and Service; promote Education and Scholarship; develop an appreciation of our culture and to foster such programs as may be indicated by these objects.

ARTICLE II--MEMBERSHIP

- sec. 1 Membership in this Fraternity shall be limited to college men who have completed at least one grade period in a recognized college or university, except where such requirement conflicts with the rules and regulations of the college or university at which the chapter of this Fraternity operates, and they shall be eligible for membership in this Fraternity upon meeting such other requirements and qualifications as the By-Laws of this Fraternity may require, except that membership or non-membership in a particular race or belonging to a particular national origin shall not be a requirement for membership in this Fraternity.
- sec. 2 No person who is, or has been a member of another intercollegiate fraternity other than an honorary or professional fraternity, shall be eligible for membership in this Fraternity.

ARTICLE III--STRUCTURE

- sec. 1 This Chapter shall be composed of undergraduate students.
- sec. 2 The supreme governing body of the Chapter shall be

an executive board consisting of the President, Vice-President, Secretary, and Treasurer.

ARTICLE IV--POWERS

- sec. 1 The chapter shall have the power to make its own constitution and by-laws, provided said constitution and by-laws shall not conflict with the National Constitution and By-Laws; to suspend and restore members in accordance with the By -Laws of this Fraternity and to recommend to the Executive Committee the expulsion of members in the accordance with the By-Laws of this Fraternity.
- sec. 2 The Executive Committee shall have the authority to act for and on behalf of the GeneralBoard on any matter submitted to it by the President between meetings of the General Board, provided that the Executive Committee shall not act on any matter submitted to it by the President where the General Board has previously acted upon such matter or has made a decision with respect to such matter; and provided that further action taken by the Executive Committee shall be communicated to each member of the General Board not a member of the Executive Committee; within (5) days of such action requiring that he advise the President within ten days of the post mark date of such notice if he objects to such action. Both the notice and the reply must be sent by certified mail return receipt request. Where at least two-thirds(2/3) of the members of the General Board to whom such notice is sent object of such action, implementation of such action shall be stayed until the next regular General Board meeting unless the President shall call a special meeting of the General Board to act upon the matter.
- sec. 3 The Executive Committee consists of the President, Vice-President, Secretary, and Treasure.
- sec. 4 The officers of this Chapter shall have such powers as are specifically set forth in this Constitution and By-Laws.

ARTICLE V--PROGRAMS

- sec. 1 The programs of this Fraternity shall be Bigger and Better Business, Education, and Social Action.
- sec. 2 The Bigger and Better Business Program shall include the promotion and fostering of ideas for the effective organization, improvement, and expansion of business and the dissemination and propagation of information for the advancement of sound business principles and practices.
- sec. 3 The Education Program shall include programs of academic, economic, industrial, and business education.
- sec. 4 The Social Action Program shall include a direct action program and a program of cooperation with such other social action organizations as the General Board shall from time to time determine by resolution.

- sec. 5 The establishment of the specific programs set forth in Section 1 above shall not preclude the establishment by the General Board of other specific programs, provided that any such specific program shall not extend beyond the next following meeting of the General Board unless specifically approved by such next following assembly of the General Board.

ARTICLE VI--OFFICERS, ELECTIONS, and QUALIFICATIONS

- sec. 1 The appointed officers of this Chapter shall be appointed by the President with the approval of the General Board. The President, with the approval of the General Board, has the authority to create appointed positions for the benefit of the Chapter.
- sec. 2 The elected officers of this Chapter shall consist of a President, Vice-President, Secretary, and Treasurer.
- sec. 3 All appointed officers shall be appointed for one term, but there shall be no limit as to the number of their successive appointments. An appointed officer may be removed from office by the President for misfeasance, malfeasance, or nonfeasance in office. Upon such removal of an appointed officer the President shall notify all members of the General Board of his action setting forth the reasons for such removal.
- sec. 4 The term of office of an elected officer shall begin with the election and installation of such officer and shall end with the election and installation of his successor at the next meeting of the General Board for elections, provided that the incumbent of such office has not been removed from office prior to such next meeting of the General Board.

ARTICLE VII--REMOVAL of OFFICERS and SUSPENSION or EXPULSION of MEMBERS

- sec.] The General Board may remove any officer of the Chapter for misfeasance, malfeasance, or nonfeasance in office, or for conduct tending to hold the Chapter up to ridicule or contempt, or tending to bring discredit upon the Fraternity; provided that written charges against such officer shall be served upon him by registered mail at his last known address. Such officer shall be given thirty days from the date of service of such written charges to file and answer with the General Board by sending a copy of such answer by registered mail to the President. Such officer must appear before the General Board in person to answer such charges, and no officer shall be removed from office unless a two-thirds vote of the membership of the General Board is obtained.
- sec. 2 Any member of this Chapter may be suspended or expelled upon charges preferred against him. These charges must be presented in writing. Such member will then appear before the General Board to answer such charges. A two-thirds vote of the membership of the General Board must be obtained for the suspension or expulsion to take effect.

ARTICLE VIII--MEETINGS

- sec. 1 This Chapter shall hold meetings once each week except that it need not hold meeting during the months of the summer recess of the university. There shall be no meetings also during other long breaks such as Christmas Holiday and Spring Break.

ARTICLE IX-- ZETA PHI BETA SORORITY

- sec. 1 The founders of this Fraternity having assisted in the organization and establishment of Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, and having fostered a close relationship with said sorority; the promotion of a spirit of cooperation at all levels is hereby declared to be the official policy of the Fraternity.

ARTICLE X--AMENDMENTS

- sec. 1 This Constitution may be amended at any meeting of the General Board by a two-thirds majority, provided that proposed amendment does not go against the principles of the Fraternity.

BY-LAWS

- 1 A quorum shall consist of at least 2/3 of the active members of the Chapter.
- 2 Roberts Rules of Order shall be the parliamentary authority on all questions of parliamentary procedure arising at meetings of the General Board, unless such questions are specifically covered in this Constitution and By-Laws.
- 3 This Chapter reserves the authority to produce its own By-Laws as seen benefiting the Chapter.

General Board

- 1 The General Board shall be the administrative body of the Fraternity. It shall approve the budgets presented by all standing committees and special commissions; it shall determine the bank in which the funds of the Fraternity are to be deposited; it shall approve all expenditures being made by the Fraternity; it may authorize any elected officer, appointed officer, or other person to negotiate for the Fraternity, but no such contract shall be effective

until it shall have been approved by General Board.

- 2 The President, with the consent of the General Board, shall appoint an auditor who shall regularly audit the books, records and accounts of the Treasurer and such other matters as deemed important by the President and General Board. He shall make his report to the President and General Board.

Officers

- 1 The President shall be the chief executive officer of the Fraternity. He shall appoint all persons and committees not otherwise provided for in this Constitution and By-Laws; he shall preside at all meetings of the General Board; he shall sign all drafts prior to transmittal to the Treasurer for payment; he shall, together with the Treasurer, sign all checks for payment of drafts against the Treasury, and he shall do all other things generally done by the office of the President. All proposals or actions performed by the President are done with the approval of the General Board.
- 2 The Vice-President is the assistant executive officer of the Fraternity. He shall assist the President in decision making if deemed necessary. He shall take over the responsibilities of president in times of absence of the President. He shall also head the Social Committee.
- 3 The Treasurer shall be the custodian of all funds from any committees and General Board and shall give a receipt therefore; he shall deposit such funds in such bank as is approved by the General Board; he shall disburse funds by check only, and only upon a draft signed by the President and approved by the General Board. He shall make a monthly report to the President of receipts and disbursements.
- 4 The Secretary is responsible of the business (past and present) by the upkeep of records. He shall take minutes at all meetings and relay this information to the General Board. He shall also be the Historian of the Fraternity.

Membership

- 1 No person shall be eligible for membership in an undergraduate Chapter unless he shall be in attendance at a recognized college or university pursuing a baccalaureate degree, and who shall at the time of his initiation have general scholastic average of "C" or its equivalent.
- 2 Every member shall be required to pay to his Chapter, in addition to any sum determined by his Chapter for Chapter purposes, such sum as is fixed by the General Board and

approved by the Conclave as annual Fraternity dues, and such further sum as shall have been determined by the Region as annual regional dues.

Crescent Club

- 1 Every Chapter shall establish a Crescent Club.
- 2 The purpose of the Crescent Club shall be stimulate interest in men who aspire to membership in PHI BETA SIGMA Fraternity, Inc., and to orient them in the ideals and history of the Fraternity.
- 3 Membership in the Crescent Club shall not imply and obligation of the member to join the Chapter nor an obligation of the Chapter to initiate the member.
- 4 A man seeking membership in the Crescent Club shall make application for membership on forms provided by the Chapter.
- 5 An application for membership in the Crescent Club shall not be admitted to membership unless his application shall have been approved by a three-fourths majority vote of the Chapter.

Standing Committees

- 1 The standing committees of this Chapter consists of:
 - a. Budget Committee

This committee shall be composed of the President and three other members appointed by the President. This committee shall review the proposed budgets of all officers submitted to the General Board for approval, and make a report to the General Board at the meeting at which such budgets are to be acted upon by the General Board.
 - b. Publicity Committee

This committee shall be headed by an appointed chairman appointed by the President; other members (no specific number) shall be appointed by the President. This committee shall be responsible for dissemination of news regarding this Chapter during the year.
 - c. Service Committee

This committee shall be headed by an appointed chairman appointed by the President; other members shall also be appointed by the President. This committee shall make arrangements for the availability to perform projects of service for the community and university.

d. Social Committee

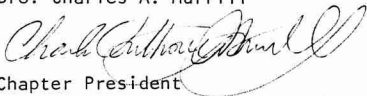
This committee shall be headed by the Vice-President with other appointed by the President. This committee is responsible for the giving of social functions and the like for proceeds for the Chapter.

Amendments

- 1 These By-Laws may be amended by a two-thirds majority vote of the members present and voting at the meeting of the General Board.

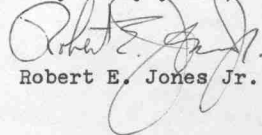

CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS

XI CHAPTER.
PHI BETA SIGMA FRATERNITY, Raleigh, North Carolina

WHEREAS: There reside on the campus of North Carolina State University in the city of Raleigh, North Carolina students interested in the principles of the Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity, and who because of their qualifications are eligible to become members thereof:

BE IT RESOLVED: That in order to perpetuate those high ideals and principles of our Fraternity, to keep more closely in touch with its activities, to promote scholarship and brotherhood, and to render a greater service financially and morally to the welfare of the community in which we live: We do hereby join ourselves together into a chapter, of Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity in accordance with the following articles and by-laws.

Article I.

Name

The name of this chapter shall be XI Chapter (to be assigned by national office), North Carolina State University, Raleigh, North Carolina.

Article II.

Membership

The membership of XI Chapter shall consist of persons who are bonafide undergraduate members of Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity, and who have not been expelled or dismissed from another said chapter because of a violation of the rules or the principles upon which our fraternity was founded. A member must be of good character and meet the financial requirements as are herein provided.

This chapter shall not be dissolved so long as there are five (5) regular qualified members willing to maintain its existence.

Article III.

Officers and term of office

The officers of XI Chapter shall consist of a President, Vice-President, Recording Secretary, Corresponding Secretary, Treasurer, and Chaplain who shall hold office for a term of one year or until their successors are duly elected.

Article IV.

Election of officers

The election of officers for XI Chapter shall be held on the last regular meeting in December of each year.

The election shall be by ballot, except that when it is not possible to have the regular ballot as ordinarily used, then the same shall be by a standing vote.

Article V.

Qualifications of officers

No person shall be eligible to hold the office of President, Vice-President, Corresponding Secretary, or Treasurer until he shall have been a member of said chapter for one year prior to such election unless approval from the Regional Director is obtained.

Article VI.

Duties of officers

The President shall preside over all meetings, shall appoint all committee except the executive committee, shall be chairman of the executive committee, shall represent the chapter in all public affairs locally or as otherwise designated, shall countersign all disbursement orders, shall call all special meetings, and shall perform all other necessary acts in keeping with his office.

The Vice-President shall execute the duties of the President during his absence, and such other duties as are usually devolved upon such office.

The Corresponding Secretary shall handle all the correspondence of the chapter.

The Recording Secretary shall keep an accurate record of all funds paid the Treasurer, and shall sign all disbursement orders and the proceedings of each meeting.

The Treasurer shall be custodian of all the funds turned over by the Recording Secretary and shall disburse the same on written order of the Recording Secretary and the same countersigned by the President. He shall also render an annual report to the Chapter and make such other reports concerning the money in his care as authorized by the executive committee.

The Chaplain shall have charge of all the devotional activities of the Chapter, and such other duties as may be devolved upon his office.

Article VII Committees

There shall be four standing committees, but the President may appoint such other committees as may be found necessary from time to time.

The standing committees shall consist of an Executive Committee, Membership Committee, and Constitution and By-Laws Committee.

Article VIII Committee duties

The Executive Committee shall have charge of the administrative affairs of the Chapter, and shall consist of current elected officers plus the immediate past President.

The Membership Committee shall receive and recommend all applications for membership to be finally determined by the Chapter.

The Program Committee shall recommend and supervise the execution of a yearly program of activities approved by the Chapter and shall have charge of all entertainment and social functions.

The Constitution and By-Laws Committee shall receive, recommend, and advise all proposed changes and amendments in the constitution and by-laws which shall become a part of the organic laws of the Chapter.

Article IX Time and place of meetings

XI Chapter of North Carolina State University, Raleigh, North Carolina, shall meet the first Wednesday evening in each month at 8:00 p.m. in Raleigh, North Carolina, or such other place as may be designated from time to time by a majority of the members assembled. Except that there shall be no meetings during the months of June, July, and August.

Article X Quorum

Five duly qualified members assembled at any regular meeting shall constitute a quorum.

Article XI Dues and application for membership and budget

Joining fee for any new candidate who has not been initiated in Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity shall be in keeping with the appropriate revisions of National Constitution revised and adopted at the 65th Anniversary Conclave, December 26 - 30, 1979, Washington, DC, and subsequent changes by that body.

Applications for membership shall be submitted to the Membership Committee, who shall present the candidate's name at the first regular meeting after the application or applications may have been received by the said committee; the same shall be voted on by the members assembled at the regular meeting and must receive a majority vote of the members present.

Each applicant, upon notification of his acceptance as a candidate to be initiated in XI Chapter shall appear at the first regular meeting, or special meeting which may be called by the President with the advice and consent of the Executive Committee for such initiation.

The annual dues per member shall be regulated according to the annual budget adopted each year by the aforesaid Chapter, which shall be prorated on the basis of eight months for the year. The same may be paid in two or four installments as shall be recorded in the minutes from time to time. Any member who allows six-eighths of his annual dues to become in arrears shall be automatically suspended.

Article XIII
Program

Section 1. The programs of this Fraternity shall be Bigger and Better Business, Education, and Social Action.

Section 2. The Bigger and Better Business Program shall include the promotion and fostering of ideas for the effective organization, improvement and expansion of business and the dissemination and propagation of information for the advancement of sound business principles and practices.

Section 3. The Education Program shall include programs of academic, economic, industrial and business education.

Section 4. The Social Action Program shall include a direct action program and a program of cooperation with other social action organizations.

Article XIII - Attendance

Any member who shall absent himself from five consecutive meetings without a good cause shall be dropped from the membership roll. Such delinquent member may be reinstated by tendering to the Membership Committee all arrears which may have accrued by reason of his absence from the meetings, unless such candidate shall have fully complied with Article ~~XII~~, Paragraph Four of said constitution and by-laws for one year; then in such event, the said member who absented himself shall plead openly to XI Chapter anew his fidelity and faithfulness to said Chapter.

Article XIV
Conclave

XI Chapter shall send a delegate each year to the Fraternity Conclave, whose expenses shall be defrayed by the Chapter. Should special circumstances preclude the sending of a delegate to the conclave, a petition for special consideration shall be made to the National President.

Article XV
Amendments

All amendments and changes to the constitution and by-laws shall be submitted at a regular meeting thirty days prior to the meeting at which said proposed changes or amendments shall be voted on. The adoption of which shall be subject to a two-thirds vote of the members present.

Article XVI
Governed by Roberts Rules of Order.
And constitution and by-laws of Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity,

Any thing not herein provided for shall be governed by the Constitution and By-Laws of Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity as Revised and Adopted by the 65th Anniversary Conclave, Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity, Inc., December 26 - 30, 1979, Washington, DC and Robert's Rules of Parliamentary Procedures.
