### SCHOLASTIC HONOR SOCIETY FOR FRESHMEN

In recognition of your having achieved a Quality Point Average of 3.5 or better, during your first semester or first two semesters, you are hereby invited to join the North Carolina State University Chapter of Alpha Lambda Delta. This national freshman honor society was founded at the University of Illinois in 1924 as an honor society for women. Phi Eta Sigma, founded there in 1923, then did not admit women. For over half a century Alpha Lambda Delta provided honors and scholarships for women when they could obtain such help from few other organizations. The NCSU Chapter, the first in North Carolina, was founded in 1970 by Miss Carolyn Jessup, then NCSU's Dean of Women, and Dr. Doris King, Professor of History. A few years ago, as the result of a new federal law, both Phi Eta Sigma and Alpha Lambda Delta opened their doors to both men and women students. Since that time there have been some attempts to merge the two organizations at the national level, but until such merger is accomplished, both organizations plan to continue operation at NCSU. Alpha Lambda Delta now has over 200 chapters and offers fourteen graduate scholarships of \$3,000 each annually. The NCSU Chapter in the past has sponsored speakers, donated \$200 in books to the D. H. Hill Library, given presents to patients at Dorothea Dix Hospital, carried out other worthwhile projects, and planned picnics and cook-outs. You can be an active member during the 1985-1986 year and help plan activities for that year. After one year you continue membership inactively but are still eligible for graduate scholarships.

This year's Initiation Fee, \$20.00, pays for national and local dues. provides you with a membership certificate and a gold-colored ALD Key. You may order an additional piece of jewelry for an additional fee, a plain pin (\$6), a jeweled pin (\$11), or an enameled key (\$9). If you decide to join Alpha Lambda Delta, bring a check or cash (preferably a check) to the second floor lobby of Harris Building Monday, February 25 2:00-5:00 P.M., or Tuesday, February 26 1:00-5:00 P.M. Chapter officers there will accept your fee and answer your questions. No fees accepted after February 26. You may telephone the Chapter President, Rajesh Maingi at 847-1601 or the Faculty Adviser, Dr. Doris King at 737-2483 or 787-4917. You must take part in the Initiation Ceremony in order to become a member. It will be held in the South Lounge, second floor, in the Student Center at 5:30 P.M. on Tuesday April 16. The Banquet, which you are expected to attend, will be held in the adjacent ballroom at 6:30 P.M., and a Business Meeting, to elect new Chapter Officers, will be held following the Banquet. Women are expected to wear short semi-formal or church dresses; men are asked to wear suits or jacket-slacks combinations. This letter will serve as your only formal notification of the time and place of the Initiation Ceremony. Please keep it for future reference.
