## SELF KNOWLEDGE SYMPOSIUM

## Constitution

Article I :	<u>Name &amp; Purpo</u> Section 1 Section 2	This organization shall be known as the Self Knowledge Symposium. The purpose(s) of this group shall (will) be to discuss and analyze points of interests concerning career planning.
Article II;	Membership Section 1 Section 2	Membership shall be open to all regularly enrolled students who are interested in the aforementioned purpose. Selection of members will be
		based soley on an expressed interest in the groups activities.
Article III:	<u>Officers</u> Section 1	The elective officers of the group shall consist of a president, vice president, treasurer, and secretary.
	Section 2	The officers shall be elected by the groups members to serve a term of one year beginning in the Fall of that year.
Article IV:	<u>Dues</u> Section 1	Dues will constitute monies collected at meetings from the members by the treasurer.
	Section 2	Use of monies collected will be for the expressed use of the group and its endeavors, and will be used in the manner approved by a concensus of the current group members.
Article V:	Amending the Section 1	<u>Constitution and By-laws</u> Amendments to the constitution or by- laws shall be presented by members of the group in writing and read at a regular meeting but shall not be voted upon until the next regular meeting, and then only after informing each member of the proposed amendments. A majority of 2/3 of the members present and voting shall be required.
	Section 2	All amendments to this constitution or by-laws shall be subject to the approval of the Student Government.

Section 3 Any article of this constitution or part thereof that is in direct violation of the Student Government constitution or by-laws shall be null and void and declared unconstitutional by the President of Student Government. Any differences of opinion between the group and the President of Student Government shall be brought before the Legislature, whose decision shall be final.

Article VI: Meetings

Section 1

The group shall meet as determined each semester by its members.

Article VII: <u>Committees</u> Section 1 The group shall make provisions needed

for forming any standing or special committees should the need arise.
