



Fraternities and Sororities wishing to take advantage of privileges, resources, programs and advisement offered by the Department of Greek Life must seek recognition by the Department. The Department of Greek Life will only grant recognition to fraternities and sororities who abide by the Recognition Guidelines. Not all Greek Letter organizations may wish to be affiliated with/recognized by the Department. In that case, those fraternities and sororities need only to seek recognition as a registered student organization at North Carolina State University.

- 1. Register with the Student Organization Resource Center (SOURCE) as a student organization and maintain good standing. Doing so grants your fraternity or sorority privileges. Said privileges include the use of meeting and program space, on-campus solicitation and fund-raising opportunities, the right to apply to the Student Senate for the use of student fees, and the ability to link a student organization's homepage to the University's web. You can contact the SOURCE at: 1202 Talley Student Center or http://www.ncsu.edu/sorc/. A copy of your yearly registration/renewal must be submitted to Greek Life by September 1st each year.
 - a. Established fraternities or sororities with less than four (4) enrolled NC State students may be granted one courtesy registration by SOURCE as they re-build their membership, at the request of the Department of Greek Life. Requests will not be made for those fraternities or sororities whose Chapter GPA falls below a 2.0, or whose members are on Academic Warnino/Suspension.
 - b. Colonizations/Revitalizations/Interest Groups need to establish four (4) or more enrolled NC State students or have the full support of a governing council partnered with a national organization before they are eligible to register.
- Comply with the Department of Greek Life Membership Guidelines. Two versions of the guidelines exist. One version is applicable to chapters that conduct their membership process via recruitment, the other to those who conduct intake. Copies of the guidelines are available online.
- 3. Submit and maintain up to date contact information for chapter officers and advisors using the Department <u>Chapter Officer Roster</u> and <u>Chapter Advisor Roster</u> forms. Forms should be submitted no later than 2 weeks after the first day of classes each semester. If elections are held mid-semester, forms should be completed for new officers within one week of elections. Forms can be downloaded from the Department website.
- 4. Submit and maintain an up to date membership roster with the Department. New members must be added in accordance with the Membership Guidelines timeframe. All members to be removed from the roster must be submitted to the Department on the appropriate form no later than November 15th for fall semester and April 15th for spring semester. Members may only be added or removed using the Department Membership Roster Addition/Deletion form or the Verification of Candidates/Aspirants form located in the Membership Guidelines packet.
- Maintain good standing with your National/International Organization.
- 6. Be recognized by a governing council and maintain good standing. NPC groups must be recognized by the Panhellenic Association. NIC and FLA groups must be recognized by the Interfraternity Council. NPHC groups must be recognized by the NPHC of NC State. Membership to the Collaborative Greek Council is open to all fraternities and sororities regardless of national affiliation, should the local organization meet the council requirements for membership.
- 7. Participate in the NC State Standards Program for Fraternities and Sororities.

Any group who fails to comply with the Recognition Guidelines will lose recognition by the Department of Greek Life. In order to regain recognition, chapters may have steps to complete in addition to the seven above.
