Article I Name & Purpose

Section 1
 The representatives of the people of Michigan:

 The purposes of this state shall be to promote health, welfare, and safety through the exercise of every power to provide an atmosphere for basic learning and working life; to provide an atmosphere for learning the history of the state; to promote moral values for promoting these purposes; and to provide an atmosphere for promoting these purposes; and to provide an atmosphere for promoting these purposes (through)

Article II Membership

Section 1
Membership Qualifications: Membership shall be open to all eligible qualified members who are citizens of Michigan, have attained the age of majority, and possess the right of voting, namely, shall possess and enjoy their property in full, shall have the right to vote and shall have the right to hold office in Michigan. The number of members shall be determined by the people of Michigan.

Section 2
Qualification of Members: Every member of a political party shall be a citizen of Michigan. The right of membership shall be open to all who have the right to vote and possess and enjoy their property in full, shall have the right to vote and shall have the right to hold office in Michigan.

Article III Officers

Section 1
 There shall be elected the following officers: (a) for general membership:

- President**
- Secretary**
- Treasurer**

Section 3
 The officers shall be elected by the membership to serve a term of one year, with officers held over thereafter.

Article IV Rules

Article 1

There are five (5) directors to be elected annually. The directors will have the opportunity to submit and receive no-vote/no-ask questions through a vote at the annual meeting. A majority of 75% of the directors present and voting shall be required.

Article 4 Authorizing the Constitution and Bylaws**Article 4**

Members of the Association or the Board shall be permitted by a majority of the club to review and modify or repeal existing the Bylaws for such terms and for such purposes, and then only after obtaining such majority of the present membership. A majority of 75% of the members present and voting shall be required.

Article 10 Meetings**Article 1**

The club shall meet bi-monthly. Club business will also be transacted through out the year in telephone conferences or local events where they are required. Their duties and responsibilities are listed.

Article 12 Committee**Article 1**

There are committees that operate in the club for the benefit of the club. However, should the need arise for meeting in special emergency, the power to make these meet will be the governing officer of the club.
