

THE STATE OF TEXAS, COUNTY OF DALLAS

BY-LAWS

ARTICLE I **NAME AND PURPOSE**

Section 1 This organization shall be known as the **State Bar of Texas**. (These by-laws shall be known as **BY-LAWS**.)

Section 2 The purpose of this organization shall be to bring about the betterment of the state, and the betterment of the Nation through bringing in the best law, which is a betterment of the world over.

ARTICLE II **MEMBERSHIP**

Section 1 Membership shall be restricted to full-time attorneys, admitted students, judicial candidates and laymen interested in good government and better taxation under responsible leadership and shall have the following rights, duties and powers: (1) membership, (2) voting, (3) office and (4) the right to hold office.

Section 2 Membership shall have to be approved by a committee made up of the membership committee and advised by a committee made up of the Executive Committee. At least half of the total membership shall be present for action.

Section 3 Persons being considered for any committee shall be placed on a non-voting preliminary ballot during which the membership, officers and student members will have the opportunity to:

- (1) Their acceptance or rejection for membership, but that they are not the voting vote;
- (2) Their will to have the vote through their meeting and vote as well as physical election;
- (3) Their articles should read, "I have met and I am here."

Each year membership will be a turning point in the life of the organization.

ARTICLE III **OFFICIAL MEETINGS**

Regular meetings shall be held twice a month on a day, time and place required by a majority vote of the membership.

ARTICLE 10 OFFICERS AND DIRECTORS

The officers and directors of this club shall be:

- Treasurer** Shall preside over all meetings, approve all activities and financial expenditures. Approved the club. etc.
- Vice President** Shall accept approval of all club activities and be prepared to accept the responsibilities of the President in his/her absence.
- Secretary** Shall keep a record of the membership, meetings, etc. etc.
- Member** Shall keep track of all financial expenditures as well as all members.

ARTICLE 11 MEMBERSHIP CONTRACT

The following conditions of this club shall be:

- Membership** Shall have obtained a membership of \$1000.00, includes the membership in the city of Denver, includes the necessary dues and all other aspects of the weekly meetings.
- Senior Member** Shall have obtained highest percentage of the activities including the membership; includes the membership during the course of the business.
- All Member Officers** Shall the dues received at Article 11.

ARTICLE 12 OFFICERS

This organization will abide by the written law of the state of Denver.

Shall not prohibit membership, collection and other future investments.

ARTICLE 13 OFFICERS

The officers shall be elected to a one-month majority vote of the members present and voting. Officers shall have a term of one year beginning on the date of the meeting. There shall be no limit on the total number of terms he or she may hold. The officers shall be held in a state, time and place as stipulated in a majority vote of the meeting members.

ARTICLE 101. TERM OF TERM.

This shall remain an annual conference for sufficient duration the term of the conference shall terminate when special laws enacted to be then pending expire and continue thereafter. Following that time in 1960.

In addition, such member will pay \$1000.00 into the State Treasury of each year with a low bank interest rate. (These fees are for the purchase and maintenance of such equipment and to off set the cost of other means for protection or collection.)

Any member not meeting these requirements will be suspended from the club until they are met.

ARTICLE 102. MEMBERSHIP AND VOTING.

Section 1. Members of the Corporation or Service shall be admitted by members of the club as authorized and set in a regular meeting. No shall not be voted upon until the next regular meeting and then only after receiving notification of the proposed admission of majority of members of the board present and voting shall be elected.

Section 2. All members of this Corporation or Service shall be subject to the approval of the State Government and will have the following:

Section 3.
