**CONSTITUTION**

**Article I. Name and Purpose**

**Section 1.** This organization shall be known as the Trucking Association of Collegiate Students, hereafter referred to as TACS.

**Section 2.** The purpose of this organization shall be:

- a. To represent the graduate student body in the College of Textiles.
- b. To provide a forum for graduate student opinion.
- c. To render graduate student opinion in all matters of mutual interest of graduate faculty and students.
- d. To promote professional conduct and fellowship among graduate students.

**Article II. Membership**

**Section 1.** Membership shall be conferred with the enrollment in the following graduate programs in the College of Textiles:

- a. Master of Textiles
- b. Master of Science in Textile Apparel Management
- c. Master of Science in Textile Engineering, Chemistry, and Science
- d. M.S. in Fiber and Process Science
- e. M.S. in Textile Technology Management

**Article III. Officers and Club Administration**

**Section 1.** The elected officers of this organization shall be:

- a. President
- b. Vice President
- c. Secretary/Treasurer
- d. Social Director

**Section 2. Election of Officers**

Officers shall be elected by secret ballot by the members of the organization at each annual meeting hereinafter provided. Officers shall be elected by the plurality of the vote cast.

**Section 3. Term of Officers**

Officers shall be elected during August and the term of office shall begin at the end of the Spring semester. Any vacancies caused by the early termination of an officer shall be filled by presidential appointment, at the request of the organization, by a special election.

**Section 4. Duties of the Officers**

- a. The President shall call and preside over TACIS meetings and appoint TACIS as University and College of Trinity members.
- b. The President shall also appoint representatives to each committee and organization as considered appropriate under authority. Such representatives will be subject to approval by a majority of TACIS members present at the writing they are assigned.
- c. The Vice President shall preside over TACIS meetings at the request in absence of the President and, at the President's request, substitute for the President at University and College of Trinity functions.
- d. The Secretary-Treasurer shall take and maintain the records of TACIS meetings and keep the financial records of TACIS.
- e. The Social Director shall be responsible for organizing all social functions set by TACIS.

**Section 5. TACIS Representatives**

There will be one representative from one district or more by members of the TACIS Council. The representatives and alternate will be elected by a large majority and will be approved by majority vote at a TACIS meeting. The TACIS representatives shall participate in one TACIS convention per year and may attend events of other member TACIS meetings in order for TACIS to receive an annual report from the TACIS. The TACIS representative will be an elected officer under their own President of TACIS.

**Article IV. Constitution**

**Section 1.** The organization shall make provision for the formation of any special committees when needed.

**Article V. Meetings of the Committee**

**Section 1.** Attendance to the Committee shall be provided by members of the organization in writing and shall be read and voted upon at a regular meeting. A majority of two thirds of the members present and voting shall be required for approval.

**Section 2.** All proceedings to the Committee shall be subject to the approval of the Board of Governors.

**Section 3.** Any article of this Constitution as per Article III is an direct violation of the Student Government's constitution shall be null and void and declared unconstitutional by the President of Student Government. Any alteration of system between the organization and the President of Student Government shall be brought before the appropriate legislative body. Where decisions shall be final.

**TENTH ASSOCIATION OF GRADUATE STUDENTS  
SOUTH CAROLINA STATE UNIVERSITY**

**CONSTITUTION**

**Article I. Name and Purpose**

**Section 1.** This organization shall be known as the Tenth Association of Graduate Students hereinafter referred to as Tenth.

**Section 2.** The purpose of this organization shall be:

- a. To represent the graduate student body in the School of Tenth;
- b. To provide a forum for graduate student opinions;
- c. To voice graduate student opinions in all matters of mutual interest to graduate faculty and students;
- d. To promote professional interests and fellowship among graduate students.

**Article II. Membership**

**Section 1.** Membership shall be restricted with the exception in the following graduate programs of the School of Tenth:

- a. Master of Science in Tenth;
- b. Master of Science in Tenth Chemistry;
- c. Master of Tenth;
- d. PhD. in Polar and High-pressure Science.

**Article III. Officers**

**Section 1.** The elected officers of this organization shall be:

- a. President
- b. Vice-President
- c. Secretary-Treasurer
- d. Social Director

**Section 2. Election of Officers.**

Officers shall be elected by secret ballot by the members of the organization to serve a term not exceeding one year. Elections shall be determined by the plurality of votes cast.

**Section 3. Elections shall be held during the Spring Semester and their term of office shall begin at the end of the Spring Semester. Any vacancy created by the early termination of an officer shall be filled by presidential appointment or, at the request of the organization, by a special election.**

**Section 4. Duties of the Officers.**

- a. The President shall maintain the rosters, constitutions and bylaws from each of the four houses listed in Article II, Section 1 to serve as members of the Student Council subject to approval by a majority of their members present at the meeting they are announced.
- b. The President shall also maintain rosters, constitutions to each organization and organize activities as requested, approve late where necessary. Such constitutions will be subject to approval by a majority of their members present at the meeting they are announced.
- c. The President shall call and preside over their meetings and represent UOJ at University and other of Terrestrial Functions.
- d. The Vice-President shall preside over UOJ meetings at the request of members of the President and, at the President's request, substitute for him at University and other of Terrestrial Functions.
- e. The Secretary-Treasurer shall take and maintain the minutes of their meetings and keep the financial records of UOJ.
- f. The Special Director shall be responsible for supervising all special functions held by UOJ.

**Article IV: Organization**

**Section 1.** The organization shall have provisions for the election of any special committees when needed.

**Article V: Conducting the Organization**

**Section 1.** Resolutions in the Organization shall be presented by members of the organization in writing and shall be read and voted upon at a regular meeting. A majority of two thirds of the members present and voting shall be required for approval.

**Section 2.** All resolutions by the Organization shall be in subject to the approval of the Student Government.

**Section 3.** Any article of this Constitution or part thereof that is in direct violation of the Student Government Constitution shall be null and void and declared unconstitutional by the members of Student Government. Any differences of opinion between the organization and the President of Student Government shall be brought before the appropriate legislative body, whose decision shall be final.

**GENERAL ADMINISTRATION OF UNIVERSITY AFFAIRS  
WHERE NECESSARY SHALL BE DETERMINED**

**CONFERENCE**

**Article 1. CONFERENCE**

**Section 1.** This organization shall be known as the **United Association of Graduate Students.**

**Section 2.** The purpose of this organization shall be:

- a. To represent graduate student body in the School of Medicine.
- b. To provide a forum for graduate students.
- c. To disseminate graduate methods to all members of school relevant to graduate faculty and students.
- d. To promote professional interest and fellowship among graduate students.

**Article 2. OFFICERS**

**Section 1.** Leadership shall be maintained with assistance in the graduate program of the School of Medicine.

**Article 3. OFFICERS**

**Section 1.** The executive officers of this organization shall be:

- a. President
- b. Vice-President and Chair and Address System representative in the Graduate Student Association and the Graduate Student Committee.
- c. Secretary-Treasurer
- d. Social Director
- e. M.S. in Medical Community Representative to U.S.A.
- f. M.S. in Medical Technology Representative to U.S.A.
- g. Master of Medical Technology Representative to U.S.A.

**Section 2.** Election of Officers.

Officers shall be elected by secret ballot by the members of the organization to serve a term not exceeding one year. Election shall be determined by the plurality of votes cast.



**Section 2.** Elections shall be held during the spring semester and shall consist of officers shall include the following 1953 members. Any vacancies created by the early withdrawal of an officer shall be filled by provisional appointments or, at the request of the organization, by a special election.

**Article IV. Officers**

**Section 1.** There for the organization shall be in the form of special appointments shall be by a majority of the organization without process and notice.

**Article V. Executive Officers and Committees**

**Section 1.** Applications to the constitution of by-laws shall be presented by members of the organization in writing and shall be read at a regular meeting but shall not be voted upon until the next regular meeting, and then only after said motion has been referred to the proposed committee. A majority of members of the committee present and voting shall be required for approval.

**Section 2.** All amendments to the constitution of by-laws shall be subject to the approval of the student government.

**Section 3.** Any article of this constitution or part thereof that in its direct violation of the Student Government Constitution of by-laws shall be null and void and declared unconstitutional by the President of Student Government. Any provisions of motion between the organization and the President of the Student Government shall be subject before the Legislature, whose decision shall be final.

**Article VI. Meetings**

**Section 1.** The organization shall meet as determined by its membership each semester.

**Article VII. Committees**

**Section 1.** The organization shall have authority to set standing committees named hereby for the purpose of special activities when needed.

Article VIII. By-Laws

- Section 1. The Secretary-Treasurer is responsible for advance notification of all meetings of this organization.
- Section 2. Representatives to the Graduate Student Association must attend every G.S.A. meeting. Representatives are responsible for providing alternate representatives from their program when they themselves cannot attend. Representatives are in charge of desk assignments for graduate students in their program.
- Section 3. The Social Director is chairperson of the committee whose duties include the set up of audio-visual aids, the preparation of refreshments and the introduction of guest speakers at all textile seminars; as well as the arrangement of other social events for the organization.
- Section 4. The first responsibility of new officers, with the guidance of the old officers, is to prepare an introductory brochure to the School of Textiles and Raleigh for all incoming graduate students.

CONSTITUTION

Article I. Name and Purpose

Section 1. This organization shall be known as the Triple Association of Graduate Students.

Section 2. The purpose of this organization shall be:

1. To represent graduate student body of the School of Textiles.
2. To provide a forum for graduate opinion.
3. To raise graduate opinion in all matters of mutual interest to graduate faculty and students.
4. To promote professional interest and fellowship among graduate students.

Article II. Membership

Section 1. Membership shall be restricted only to members in the graduate program of the School of Textiles.

Article III. Officers

Section 1. The elective officers of this organization shall be:

1. President
2. Vice-President
3. Secretary
4. Treasurer
5. Social Director
6. Textile Technology representative to campus graduate association
7. Textile Chemistry representative to campus graduate association

Section 2. Term of Officers

Officers shall be elected by secret ballot by the members of the organization in each a term not exceeding one year.

Section 3. Sessions shall be held during the spring semester and term of office shall begin the following fall semester.

Special sessions will be held upon the extra retirement of any officer.

**Article IV: Staff**

**Section 1:** Open for the organization shall be in the form of special assignments used as to a majority of the organization members present and voting.

**Article V: Meeting of the Committee on By-Laws**

**Section 1:** Amendments to the Constitution or By-Laws shall be presented by members of the organization in writing and shall be read at a regular meeting but shall not be read again until the next regular meeting, and then only after each reading has been followed by the proposed amendments. A majority of members of the members present and voting shall be required for approval.

**Section 2:** All amendments to the Constitution or By-Laws shall be subject to the approval of the Student Government.

**Section 3:** Any article of this Constitution or any thereof that is in direct violation of the Student Government Constitution or By-Laws shall be null and void and declared unconstitutional by the President of Student Government. Any differences of opinion between the organization and the President of the Student Government shall be brought before the legislation, where decisions shall be final.

**Article VI: Meeting**

**Section 1:** The organization shall meet as determined by its membership each semester.

**Article VII: Committee**

**Section 1:** The organization shall make provision for any standing committees created and/or for holding any special committees when needed.

SUBJECT: Amendments to TAGS Constitution

On Tuesday, November 7, at a regular meeting of the Textile Association of Graduate Students, the following amendments to our constitution were approved by the members present:

- 1) Article II, Section 1- Item b was changed from "Master of Science in Textile Management and Technology" to "Master of Science in Textile Apparel and Management." Items b and c were combined to read as "Master of Science in Textile Engineering, Chemistry, and Science." The purpose of the name change was to reflect the newly formed departments within the College of Textiles. Also all references to the " School of Textiles" were changed to "College of Textiles" to also reflect on the recent name change to the College of Textiles.
- 2) Article III, Section 5- The following description was added to the description of the GSA Representative to include new policies as prescribed by the Graduate Student Association: "The GSA representative must participate on one GSA committee per year and must attend seven of eleven monthly meetings in order to receive an annual rebate from the GSA. The GSA representative will be an elected officer other than the President of TAGS.
