

DECLARATION TABLE

Article I

The Name of the Organization shall be **Tucker Board Table**

Article II

It shall be the purpose of the Tucker Board Table to attract, recruit, maintain, and represent, in the positions they serve. The Board Table shall be designed to serve Tucker Students shall to achieve academic and personal leadership in order for the members feel and make living their a more enjoyable experience.

Article III

Section A. Membership is open to any enrolled University Student who is a resident of Tucker Students Hall regardless of race, creed, religion, or national origin.

Article IV

Section A.

Section A. A quorum will be 1/3 representation from each section.

Section B. Each member in good standing may vote.

Section C. Proxy votes are allowed. Proxy ballot must be written or filled must be sent to the Executive Vice President before the meeting, and the other must be presented at the meeting by an approved member.

Section D. Treasurer of Hall Committee, a majority vote of the Council shall be required to submit an offer to amend what is written during a General Council meeting. If majority requires, it will be to submit an offer.

Article V

Section A. The Executive Board shall have a President, Vice-President and Secretary Treasurer and 80% representatives.

Section B. All officers must be residents of Tucker Residence Hall. Student Adjunct professors who are under academic probation will not be allowed to hold an executive board position.

Section C. The term of office shall be the one academic year.

Section D. Officers of officers shall be held during the spring semester. All new term positions must be given before the election meeting. resignation shall be returned from the floor, and election done by ballot. The person receiving majority vote will be elected.

Section 5. Executive Committee

Each Section Conference will consist of a President, Vice President and a Treasurer. A minimum of one meeting from each Section/Conference must attend the Tucker Board High School Meetings. The highest ranking Section Conference Member has the representative vote for that section at General Meetings which a vote is called.

Section 6

Appointments

Any officer may be removed from membership in Tucker Board High School through vote of the Executive Board. Any member of the Executive Board may be removed in a majority vote by the Tucker Board/High School. Any officer removed may appeal to the general membership. That officer shall be considered reinstated with two-thirds approval of the members of Tucker Board High School.

Section 6.1 Any vacancy which may occur in an officer shall be filled by appointment by the remaining members of the Executive Board pending confirmation at the next programming.

Article VI

Officers of Officers

Section A. The President

1. The President shall be the chief executive of Tucker Board High School.
2. The President shall appoint all Executive Committees.
3. The President, with approval of the Executive Board, shall set the budget for Tucker Board High School.
4. Vacancies in office will be filled by appointment of the President with approval of the Executive Board.

Section B. The Vice-President

1. The Vice-President shall be the performance for the Tucker Board High School.
2. The Vice-President shall assume the duties of the President should the office be vacant or in the absence of the President.
3. The Vice-President will have control the administrative activities.
4. The Vice-President should perform other duties as assigned by the President.

Section C. Secretary

1. The Secretary shall be responsible for keeping the minutes of all meetings and for meetings of the Executive Board.
2. The Secretary will provide a copy of the minutes for each officer and for the Tucker Board High School.
3. The Secretary shall maintain a complete and accurate list of all Tucker Board High School activities.

Section 2: Treasurer

1. The Treasurer shall make a quarterly report containing a list of all receipts and disbursements and the balance of payments represented in these figures.
2. The Treasurer shall have a current record of all financial transactions of Youth United Club.
3. The Treasurer will provide a copy of the quarterly reports for each officer of the Executive Board.
4. The Treasurer shall perform other duties as directed by the President.

Section 3: BY Representative

The BY Representative shall represent the Board Table at the meetings to collect the questions of the text of the constitution of the BYU, attend the Board Table's meetings, be an active member of the Executive Board of Youth United, and be aware of the needs of their members and be consistent and development of leaders in their area.

Section 4: Advisor

1. The Advisor shall assist the group in their execution of roles and responsibilities.
2. The Advisor shall provide feedback to the organization regarding its operation and functioning.
3. The Advisor shall work as a process for alternatives with regards to current leading or roles.
4. The Advisor should be aware of the organization's needs and all financial transactions.
5. The Advisor should be aware of any and all procedures and regulations affecting the group and also should assist in the organization's collecting in them.
6. The Advisor should provide advice upon request, and also should share knowledge, expertise, and experience with the group.
7. The Advisor(s) will be non-voting members of the Executive Board, but will attend the meetings of the organization.

Article VII

Committees

Section 1: Constitution Committee

The committee shall be appointed by the President, subject to confirmation of the organization's leading official business meeting. The committee will meet at their own time and not during a regular business meeting.

Article VIII

(Meetings)

Section 1. The times for regularly scheduled meetings shall be: Monday (if 19th), unless stated otherwise.

Section 2. At least four days notice shall be given for each regular business meeting of the organization.

Section 3. Special or emergency meetings may be called with less than ten days notice by Executive Committee.

Section 4. The meetings shall include a quorum, order of business, and disposition of business.

ARTICLE II. NAME

This organization is to be known as **Yates Business Hall, North Carolina State University.**

ARTICLE III. PURPOSE

The purpose of Yates Hall is to provide a workplace for students at N.C.S.U., create opportunities for education, recreation, and social growth, and to provide an academic environment conducive to study.

ARTICLE IV. MEMBERS AND REPRESENTATIVES

- Section I:** All residents of Yates Hall are members of this organization.
- Section II:** Each resident is responsible for conducting himself in a responsible manner and is expected to abide with the laws and regulations of the University and Yates Hall.

ARTICLE V. HOUSE COUNCIL

- Section I:** All legislative power shall be vested in the Yates House Council.
- Section II:** This legislative body shall be elected by parliamentary procedure.
- Section III:** This Council shall consist of a majority of House representatives from each Student Union's section, one House at-large; Each representative shall have one vote in all House Council matters, as well as one casting ballot.
- Section IV:** The duties of the section representative shall be to serve as at least one standing committee and inform the residents in their section of House Council matters and projects and encourage their aid and support.
- Section V:** The duty of House Council shall be the
a) to advise the student body
b) provide a friendly community environment and to promote individual growth
c) to ensure inter-union-intramural hall activities
d) to provide finances as necessary for implementation of House Council activities and programs.
- Section VI:** The Executive Council shall consist of the four House Council executive officers and the head building. It shall meet every week and provide general guidance and leadership to the House

Section VIII

Control. The President shall be chairman. Theor Hugo Council shall meet every week, not to conflict with Inter-University Council meetings. The day and time shall be announced at the beginning of each semester.

Section VIII:

Should any House Council Member be removed or resign from office, his position shall be filled after a general plebiscite conducted among his constituents. A House Council member may be voted to resign his position on the grounds of an excess from his duties for which he was elected, or if he shows more than three House Council meetings in one semester. It further may act as alternate in the absence.

Section IX:

- The standing committees shall be:
 - a) Academic--Chaired by the Athletic Director to regulate hall examinations and laboratory work
 - b) Community Work--plan and help a community work program
 - c) Dean Improvement--plan hall improvements
 - d) Fundraising--responsible to raise funds
 - e) Faculty--participate all events
 - f) Towns Operation--responsible for getting a bill and coverage for Towns events.

Section X:

quorum shall be 1/3 of the total members.

Article V: members

Section I:

All residents of North Hall are eligible to vote in Hall elections.

Officers for House Council officers shall be elected the House Election Process in the Spring. House Council Section Representatives shall act as the House of Representatives.

Section III:

- Qualifications:
 - a) All members for House Council Executive Officers must be a resident of the Hall, have served on House Council for at least one semester and be a student in good standing with the university. The minimum for President must be all qualifications.
 - b) All members for House Council Section Representatives must be residents and students in good standing with the university.

Section IV:

- Salaries:
 - a) All voting for Executive Officers shall be by secret ballot
 - b) Salary for Section Representatives shall be determined by that Section's Section

Section 10. In the event of a tie, a second election shall be conducted in the position within an week.

Section 11. An election may be conducted by a polling of 1/3 of the members. The polling may be presented to the Head Assembly within 60 days after the election. A second election will be conducted within 14 days of the presentation of the polling.

Section 12. For each office, the order of the names appearing on the ballot shall be determined by a random drawing by the Headmaster advised staff member in charge of the election.

Section 13. In the event that 1/3 of the voting members of the House Council feel a student incapable of fulfilling the duties of an executive office, a vote on the resolution shall be obtained to remove that person from the office.

Section 14. The term of the executive offices shall begin on the first House Council meeting after the election.

ARTICLE VI: EXECUTIVES

Section 1. The President's duties shall be to:
a) Represent Student Hall on the Central Campus Executive Board
b) Preside over Executive Board meetings
c) Preside over House Council meetings
d) Not to have a vote at House Council meetings, except to break a tie vote
e) Represent Student Hall on the State Students Council

Section 2. The Vice-President's duties shall be to:
a) Act as a liaison between the Hall staff and House Council
b) Assist and oversee all committees and activities
c) Act as an alternate representative to CSC for the president, and attend all the meetings
d) Not have a vote in the House Council meetings

Section 3. The Secretary's duties shall be to:
a) Keep a record of attendance at each House Council meeting
b) Keep a record of all activities and functions sponsored by House Council
c) Keep minutes of each House Council meeting
d) Submit the minutes and activities of the week, each week

Section 4. Not have a vote in House Council meetings
The Treasurer's duties shall be to:

- 24 Keep the records of all debts and credits and report them to the Council.
 - 25 Represented Student Body in the Federal Campus Executive Board.
 - 26 Not have a vote in House Council meetings.
- Any vacancy in a Residence Hall office shall be filled by President's appointment, with the exception of the President's position, which is filled by the Vice-President. The President then appoints a new Vice-President.

Section 11

ARTICLE VII: MEMBERSHIP AND PARTICIPATION

- Section 1: Residence in this dormitory requires the participation of 1/3 of all voting members present at regular House Council meetings.
- Section 2: A new constitution must be ratified by a 2/3 vote of House Council.

ARTICLE VIII: FINANCE

- Section 1: Monthly Student Activity Funds shall cover their budget per academic year and shall submit the budget to student voters at all House Council meetings. A budget shall be kept by the Treasurer of the program in each Activity Card. New cards shall be ordered before the 1st of April for the next year. The Vice-President is responsible for the ordering of the cards.
- Section 2: Budget: The officer in the House Council shall be the head budgeter. He shall give advice and counsel to assist in the attainment of Student Residence Hall.

ARTICLE IX: FACILITIES

Any laws for Student Residence Hall shall be passed by the Council by a 2/3 vote in the Council. These laws shall be concerned with Hall policy and shall be maintained by the Secretary.

ARTICLE X: GENERAL

No provision of this constitution shall conflict with any law of the State of North Carolina, with any SECTION of the Federal Holy Constitution, or University policy.

PREAMBLE

The the students of Tullington Residence Hall, in order to promote unity of purpose and action, and provide a direct and open forum, educational, and cultural enrichment, to itself and establish this organization to govern the Tullington Hall Council of Tullington Residence Hall, so that each resident may have the opportunity to develop his character to the fullest.

ARTICLE I

Section 1

Part 1: NAME - The name of this organization shall be the Tullington Hall Council of Tullington Residence Hall. Every Tullington shall acknowledge, however often referred to as THC.

Part 2: MEMBERSHIP - All students living in Tullington Residence Hall shall be members of THC.

Section 2

Authority - THC is the governing body of Tullington Residence Hall. It consists of the executive and legislative branches.

ARTICLE II

Section 1

The executive branch of THC, composed of a President, Vice President, Secretary, and Treasurer, shall meet between the meetings of THC in a public emergency session and to plan the agenda for the following meeting.

Part 1: PRESIDENT - The power of the executive branch shall be vested in a President of THC. He shall hold his office for the duration of one year, and, together with the Vice President, preside over THC.

Part 2: VICE PRESIDENT - The secretary to the President shall be the Vice President of THC. It shall be his duty to act as the President in case the President is unable to perform his duties. The Vice President shall succeed the President should the President refuse to be re-elected. The Vice President, a voting member of THC, shall be the liaison between THC and the Inter-Tullington Council. He shall also be referred to as THC. He shall attend all THC meetings, fulfill his responsibilities to THC, and report THC information at all THC meetings. Together with the President, he shall preside over THC for the duration of one year.

Part 11. SECRETARY - The Secretary of the Board shall keep the files and minutes of all the meetings of the Board and shall conduct its business arrangements for the Board. The Secretary is a voting member.

Part 12. TREASURER - The Treasurer of the Board shall be responsible for and keep records of all financial transactions and conduct the Board. He shall also receive all the checks payable to the Board. The Treasurer is a voting member.

Part 13. THE BOARD - The Board consists of seven members by the Department of Business Life. The Board shall, through its committees and divisions, shall be divided into three parts as follows: Executive, Policy, Administrative, and Information and Public Relations. The Board shall be responsible for the budget and shall receive all reports that are received by the Board. It shall meet with the Board on a regular basis.

SECTION 12

The Legislative Board of the Board, composed of all appointed and appointed members and Executive Officers, shall receive all the reports and communicate information between the Board and the members.

Part 14. ALL REPRESENTATIVES - Each class of Trustees, Executive Officers shall have the right to participate, shall receive by the members of each class. It shall be the duty of the Board, especially to attend all the meetings and to communicate all necessary information between the Board and the Board. The Board representatives are voting members.

Part 15. COMMITTEE CHAIRMAN - The Executive Board shall appoint Executive Officers to their committees chosen by the Trustees. The committees shall be organized to improve the efficiency of the Board. The committee chairmen are voting members.

Part 16. BOARD MEMBERSHIP - All Board representatives, the Executive Officers, the Board President, Secretary, and Treasurer are regular voting members during the meeting. The members shall vote in case of a tie vote.

SECTION 13

Section 1

Officers for the Executive Committee shall be held on other than the Board, such as the Board members. A special ballot shall have provisions.

Part 17. NOMINATION - A resolution for nomination shall be a petition of some of the Board members or other Board members. The petition shall be submitted to a member of the Executive Committee prior to the election.

Part 18. ELECTIONS - All the members present at the meeting of the Board shall have one vote. In case of a tie, a member shall have a majority of the votes cast.

Section 11

Resolutions for the Fall Representative shall be held to issue from the second full meeting of the session of the Fall session of each calendar year. BY-LAWS OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

1. The by-laws of these directors shall be subject to change and amendment, repeal, and revival by a majority of the directors, in having which all directors shall concur.

ARTICLE I

Section 1. There shall be a board of directors whose duties shall be to manage the business and financial affairs of the company and to see that the by-laws are carried out.

- Section 2. The board of directors shall consist of:
 - a. Ten directors representing each of the five states.
 - b. The representatives as of 1912 of the following counties:
 - 1. Adams County, Pa.
 - 2. Allegheny County, Pa.
 - 3. The five members to be elected for one year.

ARTICLE II

Section 1. It shall be the duty of these directors to:

- a. Prepare and submit to the stockholders a statement of the business and financial condition of the company.
- b. See that the by-laws are carried out.

Section 2. These directors shall have the power to:

- a. Borrow money on the credit of the company.
- b. Sell or lease any part of the property of the company.
- c. Make any contract or agreement that may be necessary for the carrying on of the business of the company.

Section 3. Right to remove
 It shall be the duty of the directors to see that the by-laws are carried out and that the company is managed in accordance with the by-laws.

ARTICLE III

Section 1. All resolutions passed by the directors shall be subject to the approval of the stockholders.
