CONSTITUTION

Article I. Name and Purpose

Section 1. This organization shall be known as ^{VICTORY} Cornerstone Campus Ministries.

Section 2. The purpose of ^{VICTORY} Cornerstone Campus Ministries is (i) to reach the students at North Carolina State University with the message of Jesus Christ and (ii) to lead believers to Christian maturity.

Article II. Membership

Section 1. Membership and participation shall be open to all students, without regard to race, religion, national origin, handicap, age, veteran status, or sex, who are interested in the Christian message being presented through outreaches such as films, music groups, speakers, Bible studies, literature, and personal witnessing.

Section 2. Membership in the club shall be approved based on an appropriate demonstration of the basics of Christian faith by the prospective member, together with a commitment to the specific purposes of Cornerstone Campus Ministries.

Article III. Officers

Section 1. The elective officers of this organization shall be (i) the President, (ii) the Vice-President, and (iii) the Secretary-Treasurer. The officers shall be elected by the club members to serve a term of one year within the first four weeks of the fall semester. Officers, however, are not limited in the number of terms they may serve. The President will be responsible to the university for the functions of the club on campus. The Vice-President will assume the President's responsibility if he is absent. The Secretary-Treasurer will be in charge of correspondence and finances.

Article IV. Dues

Section 1. ^{VICTORY} Cornerstone Campus Ministries will collect no regular dues from its members, but will exist solely on private donations.

Article V. Amending the Constitution and Bylaws

Section 1. Amendments to the Constitution or By-laws shall be presented by members of the organization in writing and read at a regular meeting but shall not be voted upon until the next regular meeting, and then only after informing each member of the proposed amendments. A majority of 2/3 of the members present and voting shall be required.

Section 2. All amendments to this Constitution or By-laws shall be subject to the approval of the Student Government.

Section 3. Any article of this Constitution or part thereof that is in direct violation of the Student Government Constitution or By-laws shall be null and void and declared unconstitutional by the President of the Student Government. Any differences of opinion between the club and the President of the Student Government shall be brought before the Legislature, whose decision shall be final.

Article VI. Meetings

Section 1. The club shall meet as determined by the club membership each semester.

Article VII. Committees

Section 1. The President shall appoint any committees that he deems appropriate to the carrying out of the purposes of Cornerstone Campus Ministries.
