Dear Billy:

Since you are working with the Exchange Program with the Russian delegation on agriculture, I wish to call your attention to a situation that requires immediate action. At the Sixth International Sunflower Conference Executive Committee held in Bucharest, Romania, on July 22, Dr. N. Dvoryadkin informed the Executive Council that the U.S.S.R. was prepared to organize the Seventh International Sunflower Conference which would be held in Kransodar in July of 1976. The Council accepted the invitation. Academician Turbin was nominated to be chairman of the Seventh International Sunflower Conference but was unable to accept. We were to await further proposals from the U.S.S.R. with regard to the nomination of this representative.

As you know, an International Sunflower Association was formed with an Executive Committee naming A. V. Vranceanu, President; J. R. Jensma of the Netherlands, Secretary-General-Treasurer; N. Turbin, U.S.S.R.; A. Cauderon, France; N. S. Maini, France; and Dalton E. Gandy, U.S.A. These are the following questions that must be answered immediately by the ministry of Agriculture in the U.S.S.R. or the Committee must make plans to hold the Seventh International Sunflower Conference at another location:

- Who is the chairman of the Seventh International Sunflower Conference?
- Who is to be Secretary of the Seventh International Sunflower Conference?
- What are the dates for the Conference?
- An announcement of the Conference must be issued to each member country of the Council:
  - a. for the scientist to prepare papers for presentation; and
  - b. so the individual countries may place in their scientific magazines and publications a notice of this International meeting.
- Program Committee to be established, plans for screening of scientific papers to maintain quality of papers presented.
- Mail to each individual who attended the Sixth International Sunflower Conference an announcement or information bulletin not later than July 1, 1975.
   showing:
  - a, dates of conference:
  - b. registration fee, to include one copy of the conference proceedings:
  - c. room reservation blanks giving room prices, etc. with hotel categories deluxe, A, B, or C;
  - d. post conference tour;
  - e. program for ladies; and
  - f. the official languages to be used.

I have been very much concerned that there is no communication from the chairman of the Sixth International Sunflower Conference. I have over fifty letters requesting information on how to acquire a copy of the proceedings from the Sixth International Sunflower Conference, the person to place an order with and at what price per copy. For those attending or planning to attend, communications must be improved to keep those individuals and countries interested in promoting the welfare of the sunflower industry.


