## NEWS FROM COUNTIES

COLUMBUS COUNTY -- To raise mondy for the 4-H camp fund and to unite the 4-H clubs in a common goal, we decided to publish a county 4-H cookbook.

Recipes were sent to the county office by 4-H members, leaders and interested citizens. Every recipe submitted was used.

We printed 1,000 copies of the cookbook. Leaders and members helped collate and bind the books.

The books were distributed to the clubs to sell and the public response was great. The cookbooks sold quickly, and we had to print another 1,000 copies.

Awards were given to the outstanding salespersons and to the top clubs. Both goals - raising money for the camp fund and uniting the clubs - were met.

### STUDENTS INCORPORATED

Since 1969 more than 2500 youth in Dona Anna County, New Mexico, have received jobs, developed work records, and earned more than a half million dollars through a unique program called Students Incorporated. The program is unique because the youth work for Students Incorporated rather than for the person or business for whom the work is performed.

Prime Sponsor Manpower Planners with the organization that administers CETA funds, have indicated an interest in sponsoring programs like Students Incorporated cooperatively with local 4-H organizations. Agents that are interested in a program of this nature should contact the Prime Sponsor Manpower Planner in their county. The May issue of the 4-H News contained an article, "CETA FUNDING FOR 4-H," that gives the name and address of the people to contact.
